Effective August 1, 1993, the court shall order the defendant to pay fifty dollars to the department of corrections and rehabilitation at the time a presentence investigation is initiated to partially defray the costs incurred by the department for the preparation of the presentence report. The court may further order that any additional costs incurred by the department relating to the presentence investigation and report be paid by the defendant at a rate of payment up to the full cost of conducting the investigation and preparing the report as established by the department.

Effective July 1, 1994, before sentencing a defendant on a felony charge under chapters 12.1-16, 12.1-17, 12.1-18, 12.1-20, 12.1-21, 12.1-22, 12.1-27.2, or a felony charge under chapter 12.1-23 or 12.1-24 that involves a victim who has suffered a loss of property or services that exceeds five hundred dollars, the court shall order the department of corrections and rehabilitation to conduct a presentence investigation and to prepare a presentence report."

Page 5, after line 4, insert:

"SECTION 3. A new subsection to section 54-23.3-04 of the 1991 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

To collect the costs of any presentence investigation and report incurred under section 1 of this Act, giving due

<u>consideration</u> to the financial obligations and resources of the defendant."
