REMARKS OF TWEED ROOSEVELT

Thank you very much. I am glad the two senators were not in military uniform. I might have felt as if I were being taken to a firing squad, but there are a lot more friendly faces here. It is my honor and pleasure to be here today, and you perhaps made a mistake voting to allow me to talk, but I promise I will not go more than an hour and a half or two. I know you have nothing to do.

It really is a great honor for me to be here today and to report to you the gratitude that my family has for the state of North Dakota and what it has done for our family. Theodore Roosevelt was, of course, not only President, but also, I think, certainly our first conservation President and perhaps the only conservation-oriented President we have ever had. Perhaps these were the two pinnacle achievements of his life, being President and the various

things he was able to do for conservation. Now as you all know, Theodore Roosevelt lived in North Dakota for several years out in the Badlands, and it is perfectly clear to me that he would neither have been President nor have been nearly as conservation oriented if he had not had the training and the opportunity to live here and to meet North Dakotans. Our family would not probably be even remotely prominent had it not been for what you had all done, and your ancestors had done, for my great-grandfather.

I think he would be proud of what you all have done in the various conservation efforts that you have taken in this state. Some of you may know that Theodore Roosevelt was a man who, although he loved all kinds of naturalist things and was a hunter as well, perhaps chose birds as his favorite. He was clearly a world-class bird enthusiast with knowledge that might almost have been considered professional. I note that North Dakota is a very important state as far as birds are concerned for much of the rest of the country and that you have taken that responsibility seriously and done significant things that have helped bird populations, as an example, and helped many Americans to be able to enjoy birds by some of the sacrifices you have made. I think you deserve to be recognized for that and thanked by the rest of us for what you have done. I also understand that you are a showplace for showing the rest of us in this country how to deal with cleaning up after the messes we have made, in mining, for example. Your mine reclamation approach is clearly a model and something to be proud of and something for the rest of us to learn from.

The Theodore Roosevelt Medora Foundation and the efforts of Harold Schafer down in the Badlands is, of course, a great source of pleasure and pride for the Roosevelt family, but is an absolutely magnificent thing for North Dakota. In a way, it is one of several ways that Theodore Roosevelt's legacy can pay you back for what you gave to him and to the family. I am here because I am on the Foundation Board, and we have a lot of exciting projects and efforts that we are working on to continue to make it a major attraction for tourism in the state.

One of the things that occurs to me is that I am astonished at the number of lawyers among you, who were in Boston during the ABA convention in February, who came to me in the last couple of days to tell me that Boston is clearly colder than North Dakota. I cannot wait to go back to tell my boss Tony and friends who seem to think North Dakota is in an iron grip from sometime in September until sometime in June.

In any case, I do not want to be very specific about this but I want to alert you to something that the Theodore Roosevelt Medora Foundation and I are working on, probably in 1994. What we propose to do is a retracing of one of Theodore Roosevelt's longer hunting trips. It is not clear yet which one we will do, but this will be a major event. One of the main purposes for doing this, aside from the fact that I would love to take my eleven-year-old boy on a two-week riding trip, is to garner a significant amount of national media attention for the Medora Foundation, for North Dakota, and for some of the surrounding states. I think we will be able to do that, and I think we will be able to give a significant boost to tourism in this state. And so I would ask as we go forward that you as a group in the state consider helping out in this effort because I think it will be a really quite exciting one.

I thank you very much for allowing me to talk to you. You seem to be a fine group of ladies and gentlemen. I hear you meet for eighty days, so it is nice of you to put up with me for these few minutes. Good luck in your efforts. Thank you.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

DEPARTMENT 617 - BOARD OF ANIMAL HEALTH

SENATE - This amendment makes the following changes:

Due to the defeat of House Bill No. 1198, funding of \$54,922 of special funds which would have been collected by the Board of Animal Health from charging for health books and tags is removed and funding of \$54,922 is provided from the general fund.

The salaries and wages line item is increased by \$10,881 from the general fund to reflect Governor Sinner's salary increase recommendation for state employees.

Funding of \$17,270 from the general fund is added for pay equity increases for the two veterinarians (director and deputy) on staff. This change provides a total of \$46.577 from the general fund, for pay equity increases.

In total, this amendment increases funding for the Board of Animal Health by \$83,073 from the general fund and other funds of \$54,922 are removed.

This amendment does not include funding for the third veterinarian, but \$25,000 from the general fund remains in the bill for contract veterinarian services which was added by the House.

Compared to the 1991-93 legislative general fund appropriation of \$647,044, funding from the general fund for the Board of Animal Health provided under provisions of this amendment of \$514,420 is 80 percent of the 1991-93 funding level.

COMMUNICATION FROM GOVERNOR EDWARD T. SCHAFER

March 23, 1993

I am returning SB 2446, which I hereby veto.

The bill seeks to amend Chapter 2-06, the Airport Authorities Act, which has been in place for over three decades, and which establishes the compensation of the Airport Authority Commissioners, who during that period, have graciously served the State of North Dakota and their local authority without compensation, except for necessary expenses, including travel expenses. The bill authorizes a per diem expenditure not to exceed \$50 per day, and not to exceed \$1,000 annually. Given the number of boards and commissions, I believe the bill is a step in the wrong direction for right-sizing government.

I have therefore vetoed the bill and respectfully return the same to the Senate Chambers.

The section allowing funds appropriated for grants to be spent for both the 1993-95 and 1995-97 biennium is removed.
