STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

DEPARTMENT 413 - BANKING AND FINANCIAL INSTITUTIONS

CONFERENCE COMMITTEE - Under provisions of this amendment, the department continues to receive its funding from special funds.

The salaries and wages line item is reduced by \$52,141 of special funds. Of this reduction, \$9,216 relates to reduced employee health insurance costs and \$42,925 is to reflect the state employee salary increase provisions of House Bill No. 1018.

The information services line item is reduced by \$439 of special funds in accordance with provisions of House Bill No. 1018.

The operating expenses line item is increased by \$103,873 of special funds and the interagency legal fees line item is removed to reflect Governor Schafer's recommendation regarding legal fees charged by the Attorney General.

In total, this amendment reduces funding for the Department of Banking and Financial Institutions by \$52,580 of special funds.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

DEPARTMENT 226 - LAND DEPARTMENT

CONFERENCE COMMITTEE - This amendment makes the following changes:

- -- The salaries and wages line item is decreased by \$24,628 from other funds to reflect the \$60 per month salary increase plan in accordance with the provisions of House Bill No. 1018.
- -- The information services line item is decreased by \$1,387 from other funds in accordance with the provisions of House Bill No. 1018.
- -- This amendment also provides \$266,000 from the lands and minerals trust fund to the Land Department for refunding bonus and rental moneys received on oil and gas leases covering the Little Missouri riverbed. The payments are needed to comply with a court ruling that stated that the state of North Dakota does not own the Little Missouri River and therefore should not have collected the moneys. The moneys were deposited into the lands and minerals trust fund when collected and therefore the refunds are coming out of that fund.

In total, this amendment increases the appropriation to the Land Department by \$239,985 from other funds.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

DEPARTMENT 160 - LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

CONFERENCE COMMITTEE - This amendment reduces the funding provided for hiring a consultant to assist with a Legislative Council children's services' interim study by \$5,000, from \$125,000 to \$120,000. General fund support is reduced by \$20,000, and other funds are increased by \$15,000.

A section is added providing that the Legislative Council may transfer any unspent funds remaining after the study is complete to the Children's Services Coordinating Committee, subject to Budget Section approval.

DEPARTMENT 324 - CHILDREN'S SERVICES COORDINATING COMMITTEE

CONFERENCE COMMITTEE - The salaries and wages line item is reduced by \$1,538 from the general fund to reflect the state employee salary increase provisions of House Bill No. 1018.

The information services line item is reduced by \$33 from the general fund in accordance with provisions of House Bill No. 1018.

Engrossed SB 2016 was placed on the Seventh order of business on the calendar.
