# FIRST READING OF HOUSE BILL

HB 1520: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 57-39.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a sales tax exemption for materials used to construct an agricultural commodity processing facility; to amend and reenact sections 40-57.1-03, 40-57.1-06, 57-15-31, and subsection 4 of section 57-39.2-04.3 of the North Dakota Century Code and subsection 5 of section 57-39.2-04.3 of the North Dakota Century Code as amended by section 1 of chapter 565 of the 1993 Session Laws, relating to a property tax exemption or payments in lieu of taxes which may be granted for new industries and sales tax exemptions for manufacturing machinery and construction materials for agricultural commodity processing facilities; to repeal section 40-57.1-08 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to limitations on industrial projects that may qualify for tax exemptions for new industries; to provide an effective date; and to provide an expiration date.

Was read the first time and referred to the Senate Committee of the Whole.
