SB 2128: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 39-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a staggered registration system for certain vehicles; and to amend and reenact section 39-04-06 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to checks for registration fees returned to the department of transportation. Was read the first time and referred to the Transportation Committee.

FIRST READING OF SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

SCR 4017: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the coroner system in the state, the issuance of death certificates, and whether certain information in death certificates should be exempt from open records requirements.
