# STATEMENT OF REPRESENTATIVE RUTH E. HOLM

Mr. Speaker and members of the Assembly. I rise on a point of personal privilege and ask that my remarks be printed in the journal.

As a teacher in the school Jeanna North attended in Fargo, I rise to express my shock and indignation at the fact that this child was abducted and murdered by a convicted sex offender who lived across the street from her.

I am sure I speak for all the members of the Assembly when I say we need to do more to protect our children from those few individuals in our communities who prey upon them. We have to find ways to allow parents to protect their children from molesters. We cannot allow our neighborhoods to become forbidden territories for our children. We have to allow our children to be kids--to run and play, to go to and from school, to play with their friends, to frolic in the grass, or whatever--without fear.

I want to assure the family of Jeanna North and the families of all of our children that we, as the lawmaking body of this state, are going to do all we can to explore possible ways to protect our children and prevent the horror that Jeanna North's family has experienced.
