The amendment also decreases the equipment line by \$100,000 of other funds.

The amendment also decreases the general fund moneys for the Work Force 2000 program by 1,945,000, from 2,500,000 to 555,000. The two FTEs associated with the program are also removed. The authorized FTE level is decreased from 422.5 to 420.5.

The amendment also adds a section relating to a minimum balance in the job insurance trust fund. The minimum balance is set at \$46 million.

The amendment also adds a section directing Job Service North Dakota and the Workers Compensation Bureau to develop a uniform electronic reporting system for employers.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 54-06-04 of the 1993 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

54-06-04. Form and number of reports to be submitted.

- The following executive and administrative officers and departments shall submit to the governor and the office of management and budget reports covering their operations for the two preceding fiscal years, except as otherwise provided by law, not later than the first day of December each year after the regular session of the legislative assembly:
 - a. Secretary of state.
 - b. State auditor.
 - c. Commissioner of insurance.
 - d. Attorney general.
 - e. Commissioner of agriculture.
 - f. Superintendent of public instruction.
 - g. State tax commissioner.
 - h. Public service commission.
 - i. State board of higher education.
 - Department of corrections and rehabilitation.
 - k. Department of transportation.
 - State department of health and consolidated laboratories.
 - m. Department of human services.
 - n. Workers compensation bureau.

- o. Director of the office of management and budget.
- p. State treasurer.
- g. Commissioner of labor.
- 2. A committee composed of the superintendent of the state historical board, the state librarian, and the director of the office of management and budget secretary of state, on such other persons as may be designated by such persons to represent them, shall meet at the call of the director of the office of management and budget to set the requirements which that must be prescribed by the office of management and budget for form, style, materials, and content of biennial reports required by law.
- The director of the budget and the legislative council shall make biennial reports as prescribed by law, which may, at their discretion, be included in the governmental biennial reports.
- 4. This section does not prohibit the executive and administrative officers and departments enumerated in subsection 1 from receiving such additional copies of their reports as may be available and printed in pamphlet form by the office of management and budget for the purpose of distribution as the administrative officers and departments shall deem necessary.
- 5. All officers, departments, boards, commissions, and state institutions required to submit reports covering their operations for the two preceding fiscal years to the governor and the office of management and budget shall submit copies of their reports in the form and style, using the materials, and having the content prescribed under the provisions of subsection 2 on or before the first day of December in each year after the regular session of the legislative assembly. One copy of each report must be submitted to the governor and two copies to the office of management and budget. The office of management and budget shall cause to be prepared twenty five twenty copies of each report submitted under the provisions of this subsection which must be distributed to the following agencies:
 - a. Governor's office.
 - b. Attorney general's office.
 - e. Legislative council.
 - d. c. State law library.
 - e- d. The <u>libraries of each</u> state institutions <u>institution</u> of higher education.
 - f. e. State library.
 - g. f. Two copies of each report must be placed in the office of to the secretary of state archivist for official and public use.

The reports included in this subsection may not be further printed or reproduced except as provided for in this subsection and section 54-06-05.

- All executive and administrative officers and departments responsible for submitting reports under the provisions of this section shall bear the costs of the preparation and any printing of the reports.
- Any executive and administrative officers and departments not required to submit a report by law, but electing to do so, shall submit such the report under the provisions of subsection 5."
