REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE WALD

Last Thursday we witnessed an attack by the Bismarck Tribune against the House Republican Caucus that was insulting and unnecessary. Using such inflammatory words as knife wielding, frightening, spear carriers, dynasty, and ringmaster to describe the deletion of \$250,000 from the Indian Affairs appropriations served no useful or constructive purpose.

To further suggest that House Majority Leader Dorso is orchestrating a campaign of bigotry is ludicrous.
