POINT OF PERSONAL PRIVILEGE

REP. BELTER: Mr. Speaker: I rise on a point of personal privilege.

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE BELTER

The nation cannot continue to proceed with spending beyond revenue that is generated by a tax system that already takes too much from the citizens who work hard to meet their family and local obligations.

Senator Dorgan and Senator Conrad, I ask that you do what the people have rightfully required the Legislators of the State of North Dakota to do--and that is to balance the budget.

Last night KXMB TV, Bismarck, released a poll indicating that 76% of North Dakotans polled wanted a balanced budget amendment. Today the United States Senate and Senators Kent Conrad and Byron Dorgan will vote on a balanced budget amendment, an amendment that says we will address the five trillion dollars national debt which darkens the future for us and our children.

This is not the time to place politics before statesmanship. This is not the time to use scare tactics to divert the attention of the American people from the reality that we must get our financial house in order.

We are on the threshold of a new direction to reduce governmental mandates on the affairs of state and local government and the lives of private citizens.

Senator Conrad and Senator Dorgan, I request you to give the people of North Dakota an opportunity to vote for ratification of this constitutional amendment.

This issue is clearly in your hands, and you must take the lead to balance the budget, by voting "yes" today on the balanced budget amendment!
