The industrial commission is authorized, during the period beginning January 1, 1995, and ending June 30, 1995, to transfer \$2,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, of accumulated and undivided profits of the Bank of North Dakota to the partnership in assisting community expansion fund which is hereby appropriated for the purpose of funding project applications under the program for the period beginning January 1, 1995, and ending June 30, 1995.
- SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 14 of chapter 38 of the 1993 Session Laws is amended and reenacted as follows:
- SECTION 14. BANK OF NORTH DAKOTA PROFITS TRANSFERS. The industrial commission is authorized during the biennium ending June 30, 1995, to transfer to the state general fund $\$20,000,000 \$ \$18,000,000 of accumulated and undivided profits, plus all earnings occurring during the biennium not to exceed \$28,000,000. No transfers may be made which would reduce the Bank's capital structure below \$100,000,000.00."

Funding of \$139,000 from the general fund was included in the Attorney General's 1993-95 appropriation but should have been appropriated to the Office of Administrative Hearings. The Office of Administrative Hearings received approval from the Emergency Commission for state contingency funds of \$80,000 in June 1994 and this bill includes a general fund deficiency appropriation of \$59,000 for the Office of Administrative Hearings.

DEPARTMENT 601 - ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND FINANCE/471 - BANK OF NORTH DAKOTA

SENATE - This amendment removes the deficiency appropriation of \$2 million from the general fund for the PACE program and provides, in a separate section, that the Bank of North Dakota transfer \$2 million from its profits to the PACE program. In addition, 1993 Session Laws Chapter 38, which provides for a \$48 million transfer of Bank of North Dakota profits to the general fund during the 1993-95 biennium, is amended to reduce the transfer by \$2 million, from \$48 million to \$46 million.

DEPARTMENT 512 - EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

SENATE - This amendment reduces the deficiency appropriation of \$1,500,000 from the general fund for repaying the Bank of North Dakota loan used to match 1993 federal disaster relief funding by \$1,100,000, to \$400,000, to provide funding for the estimated repayments that need to be made on the Bank of North Dakota loan during the 1993-95 biennium. Section 2 of the bill allowing Emergency Management to continue any unused appropriation authority relating to this appropriation into the 1995-97 biennium is removed.
