SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 57-39.2-02.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- Except as otherwise expressly provided in subsection 2 for sales of mobile homes used for residential or business purposes and for sales of farm machinery, farm machinery repair parts, and irrigation equipment used exclusively for agricultural purposes and except as otherwise expressly provided in this chapter, there is imposed a tax of five percent upon the gross receipts of retailers from all sales at retail including the leasing or renting of tangible personal property as provided in this section, within the state of North Dakota of the following to consumers or users:
 - a. Tangible personal property, consisting of goods, wares, or merchandise, except mobile homes used for residential or business purposes and farm machinery, farm machinery repair parts, and irrigation equipment used exclusively for agricultural purposes.
 - b. The furnishing or service of communication services or steam other than steam used for processing agricultural products.
 - c. Tickets or admissions to places of amusement or entertainment or athletic events, including amounts charged for participation in an amusement, entertainment, or athletic activity, and including the furnishing of bingo cards and the playing of any machine for amusement or entertainment in response to the use of a coin. The tax imposed by this section applies only to eighty

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percent of the gross receipts collected from coin-operated amusement devices.

- d. Magazines and other periodicals.
- e. The leasing or renting of a hotel or motel room or tourist court accommodations.
- f. The leasing or renting of tangible personal property the transfer of title to which has not been subjected to a retail sales tax under this chapter or a use tax under chapter 57-40.2.
- <u>g. Charges for premium channel and pay-per-view cable television services.</u>

SECTION 2. A new subsection to section 57-40.2-02.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

An excise tax is imposed on charges for premium channel and pay-per-view cable television services."

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 39-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Special license plates. Upon the payment of an additional fee of twenty-five dollars per registration period, the director may provide for the issuance of distinctive license plates to any organization that has three hundred or more members that have committed to the purchase of the distinctive license plates. As used in this section, "organization" includes a college, a university, an alumni organization, a veterans' organization, and a fraternal organization. The director shall provide for the issuance and display of the generally recognized logo or emblem of the organization on the license plate. The license plates authorized in this section must be similar in color and design to other license plates issued by the department pursuant to subsection 1 of section 39-04-12. Except as otherwise provided in this section, fees from the issuance of these license plates must be credited to the highway tax distribution fund. If the department authorizes under this section the issuance of distinctive license plates bearing the logo or emblem of any college or university located in this state, the director shall refund fifteen dollars of the fee authorized by this section to that college's or university's alumni organization or development office. If the department authorizes under logo or emblem of any veterans' organization, the director shall refund fifteen dollars of the fee authorized by this section and transfer that refund to the state treasurer who shall credit the refund to the veterans cemetery maintenance fund.

SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act becomes effective on July 1, 1996."
