1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 4-18.1-04, 4-23-07, 15-19-06, 20.1-02-02,  
2 25-01.1-20, 26.1-21-01, 26.1-21-02, 26.1-21-03, 26.1-21-04, 26.1-21-06, 26.1-21-07,  
3 26.1-21-08, 26.1-21-09, 26.1-21-10, 26.1-21-11, 26.1-21-12, 26.1-21-14, 26.1-21-15,  
4 26.1-21-16, 26.1-21-17, 26.1-21-18, 26.1-21-19, and 26.1-21-23, subsection 3 of section  
5 27-05.2-02, and section 54-09-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the state  
6 bonding fund; and to repeal section 4-27-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to  
7 bonding of the dairy promotion commission.

8 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

9 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 4-18.1-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
10 amended and reenacted as follows:

11 **4-18.1-04. Milk marketing board.**

12 1. There is hereby created a milk marketing board to consist of five members  
13 appointed by the governor. The board consists of one person who is a dairy  
14 farmer selling to a processor, who must be selected by the governor from two  
15 names submitted to the governor by the North Dakota milk producers association;  
16 one person who is a processor, who must be selected by the governor from two  
17 names submitted to the governor by the North Dakota dairy industries association;  
18 one person who is a retailer, who must be selected by the governor from two  
19 names submitted to the governor by the North Dakota association of food retailers;  
20 and two persons must be selected by the governor who are consumers, and who  
21 are not otherwise engaged in the milk business. An appointee may not have held  
22 elective or appointive public office during the period of two years immediately  
23 preceding appointment and may not hold any other public office, either elective or  
24 appointive, during the term of office as a member of the board. Not more than

- 1           three members of the board may, at the time of the appointment or thereafter  
2           during their respective terms of office, reside on the same side of a continuous line  
3           following the eastern boundaries of Bottineau, McHenry, Wells, Kidder, Logan, and  
4           McIntosh Counties.
- 5           2. The members of the board must be appointed within thirty days after passage and  
6           approval of this chapter. The term of office of one member expires on July 1,  
7           1968; the term of office of one member expires on July 1, 1969; the term of office  
8           of one member expires on July 1, 1970; the term of office of one member expires  
9           on July 1, 1971; the term of office of one member expires on July 1, 1972; and  
10          each succeeding member holds office for a term of five years and until a successor  
11          has been appointed and qualified. Any vacancy must be filled by appointment by  
12          the governor.
- 13          3. Three members of the board constitute a quorum for the regular transaction of  
14          business. The board shall choose one of its members as the chairman, who shall  
15          hold office as a chairman for one year; provided, election as chairman does not  
16          interfere with the member's right to vote on all matters before the board.
- 17          4. The board shall determine the amount of compensation payable to each member  
18          of the board. The amount payable may not exceed seventy-five dollars per day  
19          plus reimbursement for expenses as provided by law for state officers, while  
20          attending meetings or performing duties directed by the board. A member's per  
21          diem payments may not exceed fifteen hundred dollars in any one year.
- 22          5. Each member of the board shall give bond conditioned for the faithful performance  
23          of the member's duties ~~in the manner required by law in the sum of five thousand~~  
24          dollars.
- 25          6. The board shall employ a director who serves under the direction and at the  
26          pleasure of the board and whose qualifications, duties, and compensation must be  
27          determined by the board. The director shall serve as financial officer of the board  
28          and is authorized to accept money paid to the board in accordance with this  
29          chapter. ~~Before beginning employment, the director shall execute and file a bond~~  
30          ~~in an amount as may be fixed by the board or as may be provided by law for public~~  
31          officers.

1       ~~7.~~ 6. The board shall employ, in addition to the director, such assistants and employees,  
2 permanent and temporary, as may be necessary to carry out the duties and  
3 responsibilities of the board under this chapter. The board shall determine the  
4 qualifications, duties, and compensation of such employees. The board may  
5 employ a licensed attorney of the state of North Dakota as its legal counsel, who  
6 shall serve on a full-time or a part-time basis, and the board may obtain the  
7 services of such additional attorneys as it deems necessary. The board may also  
8 contract for auditing, economic research, and other technical services, whenever it  
9 determines that such services are needed.

10       ~~8.~~ 7. All expenditures under this chapter must be paid from the receipts hereunder.  
11 Meetings of the board must be held at least every sixty days at the call of the  
12 chairman or a majority of the board.

13           **SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Section 4-23-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
14 amended and reenacted as follows:

15           **4-23-07. State agency to keep accounts - Accounts to be credited ~~–Employees to~~**  
16 **~~be bonded.~~** The state agency shall provide for the keeping of full and accurate accounts  
17 showing all receipts and expenditures of moneys, securities, or other property received, held, or  
18 expended under the provisions of this chapter and shall provide for the auditing of ~~all such~~  
19 ~~these~~ accounts and for the execution of ~~surety bonds for all employees entrusted with moneys~~  
20 ~~or securities under the provisions of this chapter.~~

21           **SECTION 3. AMENDMENT.** Section 15-19-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
22 amended and reenacted as follows:

23           **15-19-06. Special funds - Deposit of collections - Transfers from general fund**  
24 **appropriations.**

25           1. A special operating fund for the division of independent study must be maintained  
26 within the state treasury and all income and fees collected by the division of  
27 independent study from any source must be remitted monthly by the director to the  
28 state treasurer and credited to the special operating fund. All expenditures from  
29 the fund must be within the limits of legislative appropriations and must be made  
30 upon vouchers, signed and approved by the technology director appointed by the  
31 educational technology council. Upon approval of the vouchers by the office of the

- 1 budget, warrant-checks must be prepared by the office of management and  
2 budget. The state treasurer shall make periodic transfers upon order of the  
3 director of the office of management and budget from the division of independent  
4 study general fund appropriation to the special operating fund whenever its  
5 balance falls so low as to require supplementation.
- 6 2. The educational technology council may establish an administrative operational  
7 fund, of not to exceed ten thousand dollars, out of the special operating fund for the  
8 division of independent study. The administrative operational fund must be  
9 deposited in the Bank of North Dakota and may be drawn upon by the state  
10 director of the division of independent study for the payment of necessary  
11 expenses in the administration and operation of the division of independent study  
12 within the limits and rules prescribed by the educational technology council. The  
13 director shall submit a full, minute, and itemized statement of every expenditure  
14 made during the month to the council in accordance with the rules adopted by the  
15 council, and thereafter the council may periodically authorize additional transfers to  
16 the administrative operational fund, but the balance in the fund may never exceed  
17 ten thousand dollars, and any unencumbered balance at the end of any biennium  
18 must revert to the state treasury. The administrative operational fund may not be  
19 used to pay salaries or expenses of the director. ~~The council shall determine the~~  
20 ~~amount of the bond to be posted by the director.~~
- 21 3. The educational technology council may establish a scholarship fund to provide  
22 financial grants to students enrolled in courses offered through the division of  
23 independent study. The scholarship fund may consist only of those funds  
24 specifically appropriated by the legislative assembly and property received by the  
25 council or the division of independent study as a gift, devise, or bequest. Any gift,  
26 devise, or bequest of property received by the council or division of independent  
27 study which is designated by the council and donor for the scholarship fund must  
28 be deposited in the scholarship fund at the Bank of North Dakota. The state  
29 director of the division of independent study may draw only on the interest earned  
30 by the scholarship fund for the award of scholarships within the limits and rules

1           adopted by the educational technology council. The interest earned by the  
2           scholarship fund is appropriated to the division of independent study.

3           **SECTION 4. AMENDMENT.** Section 20.1-02-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
4           amended and reenacted as follows:

5           **20.1-02-02. ~~Bond and oath~~ Oath of director.** Before entering upon that person's  
6           duties and within ten days after the date of appointment, the director shall take and file the oath  
7           prescribed for civil officers ~~and must be bonded in the penal sum of ten thousand dollars.~~

8           **SECTION 5. AMENDMENT.** Section 25-01.1-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
9           amended and reenacted as follows:

10          **25-01.1-20. Care and custody of funds belonging to patients of state institutions.**

11          The superintendent of any state institution under the management and control of the  
12          supervising department, when the care and custody of any funds belonging to patients ~~thereof~~  
13          of a state institution are by law devolved upon the superintendent, shall keep accurate accounts  
14          of ~~such~~ these funds in books provided for that purpose and shall pay out ~~such~~ these funds  
15          under ~~such~~ rules ~~and regulations~~ as may be prescribed by law or by the supervising  
16          department, taking proper vouchers ~~therefor~~ of the funds in all cases from the patient or  
17          responsible representative of ~~such~~ the patient. Each superintendent shall give a bond ~~in such~~  
18          ~~sum as may be required by law, or as may be prescribed by the supervising department,~~  
19          conditioned for the faithful performance of duties ~~and a due accounting for the funds entrusted~~  
20          ~~to the superintendent's care.~~

21          **SECTION 6. AMENDMENT.** Section 26.1-21-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
22          amended and reenacted as follows:

23          **26.1-21-01. Definitions.** In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:

- 24           1. "Blanket bond" means a bond that covers collectively all public employees and  
25           public officials without the necessity of scheduling names or positions as a part of  
26           the bond, and a bond whereby new public employees and new public officials  
27           entering employment or office during the period of the bond are automatically  
28           included without notice to the fund.
- 29           2. "Fund" means the state bonding fund.
- 30           3. "International peace garden" means an entity located upon the international  
31           boundary line between the United States of America and Canada used and

1 maintained as a memorial to commemorate the long-existing relationship of peace  
2 and good will between the people and the governments of the United States of  
3 America and Canada and to further international peace among the nations of the  
4 world.

5 4. "Political subdivision" means ~~all counties~~ a county, ~~townships~~ township, park  
6 ~~districts~~ district, school ~~districts~~ district, ~~cities~~ city, and any other ~~units~~ unit of local  
7 government which ~~are~~ is created either by statute or by the Constitution of North  
8 Dakota for local government or other public purposes.

9 5. "Public employee" means ~~any person~~ an individual employed by ~~the~~ a state  
10 agency or any ~~of its~~ political ~~subdivisions~~ subdivision, an officer or employee  
11 eligible under section 57-15-56, an employee under section 61-16.1-05, and an  
12 officer or employee of an international peace garden. "Public employee" does not  
13 include ~~a person~~ an individual employed by an occupational and professional  
14 board or commission under title 43 or by the state bar association.

15 6. "Public official" means ~~any~~ an elected or appointed officer or deputy, ~~either elected~~  
16 ~~or appointed~~, of ~~the~~ a state agency or ~~any of its~~ a political ~~subdivisions~~ subdivision ~~who is~~  
17 ~~required to be bonded by any law of this state~~ subdivision, except for an officer of  
18 an occupational and professional board or commission under title 43 or of the state  
19 bar association.

20 7. "State agency" means a state ~~departments~~ board, bureau, commission,  
21 department, ~~agencies~~ agency, ~~industries~~ industry, and ~~institutions~~ institution and  
22 ~~an~~ the international peace garden.

23 **SECTION 7. AMENDMENT.** Section 26.1-21-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
24 amended and reenacted as follows:

25 **26.1-21-02. State bonding fund ~~under management of~~ - Management by**  
26 **commissioner.** ~~The commissioner shall manage the fund. The~~ A fund must be maintained as  
27 a fund for the bonding of public employees and public officials. ~~All moneys~~ Money collected  
28 under this chapter must be paid into ~~such~~ the fund. The commissioner shall manage the fund.

29 **SECTION 8. AMENDMENT.** Section 26.1-21-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
30 amended and reenacted as follows:

1           **26.1-21-03. Commissioner may employ assistants.** The commissioner may employ  
2 ~~such clerical and other~~ assistants as may be necessary to operate the fund. The salaries of all  
3 employees together with all other expenditures for the operation of the fund must remain within  
4 the appropriations made ~~from time to time~~ by the legislative assembly for ~~such~~ these purposes  
5 and must be paid by warrant-check drawn on the state treasury prepared by the office of  
6 management and budget after the approval of expense vouchers by the office of the budget.

7           **SECTION 9. AMENDMENT.** Section 26.1-21-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
8 amended and reenacted as follows:

9           **26.1-21-04. Attorney general is attorney for fund.** The attorney general shall act as  
10 attorney for the commissioner in any ~~and all actions and proceedings~~ proceeding to which the  
11 commissioner is a party on behalf of the fund.

12           **SECTION 10. AMENDMENT.** Section 26.1-21-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
13 amended and reenacted as follows:

14           **26.1-21-06. Condition of bond created by chapter - Limitation.** ~~The condition of~~  
15 Unless otherwise provided, the bond provided under this chapter is a blanket bond arising  
16 under the provisions of this chapter shall be limited to that of. The blanket bond is a fidelity  
17 bond ~~and must provide that.~~ The blanket bond is conditioned on the public employee or public  
18 official, as principal, shall render rendering a true account of all moneys and property of every  
19 kind that come into the person's hands as such possessed as a public employee or public  
20 official, and shall pay over and deliver the same according to delivering the money or the  
21 property as required by law. The provisions of this chapter and of any statute requiring a bond  
22 constitute the bond of each public official and public employee for the purposes of any law of  
23 this state requiring the bond and constitute the entire contract between the fund and a state  
24 agency or a political subdivision as the obligee for the bond.

25           **SECTION 11. AMENDMENT.** Section 26.1-21-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
26 amended and reenacted as follows:

27           **26.1-21-07. Coverage.** The amount of coverage afforded to each state agency;  
28 ~~department, industry, and institution~~ or political subdivision must be determined by the  
29 commissioner based upon the amount of money or property handled and the opportunity for  
30 defalcation. The coverage may be greater than but not less than the amount required by law or  
31 determined under law for such positions a position.

1           **SECTION 12. AMENDMENT.** Section 26.1-21-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
2 amended and reenacted as follows:

3           **26.1-21-08. Review of ~~public official and employee bond coverage by auditor.~~**  
4 ~~Each state agency, department, industry, and institution shall annually review the amount of~~  
5 ~~blanket bond coverage of its officers and employees.~~ When conducting an audit examination of  
6 ~~such a state agencies, departments, industries, and institutions~~ agency or political subdivision,  
7 the ~~state~~ auditor shall evaluate the blanket bond coverage and, if ~~deemed~~ necessary; the  
8 auditor shall include recommendations for changes in the amount of that coverage in the  
9 auditor's report.

10           **SECTION 13. AMENDMENT.** Section 26.1-21-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
11 amended and reenacted as follows:

12           **26.1-21-09. Premiums - Amount to whom paid - Minimum.** The premium for a  
13 blanket bond must be determined by the commissioner. ~~Premiums must be paid~~ Each state  
14 agency and political subdivision shall pay the premium in advance by the proper authority of the  
15 ~~state, or of the political subdivision of the state, from its treasury,~~ to the state treasurer who  
16 shall keep the ~~same~~ premiums collected in the fund. The state treasurer shall issue receipts in  
17 triplicate. The treasurer shall file one of ~~such~~ these receipts in the treasurer's office, ~~and~~ shall  
18 mail one to the official making ~~such~~ the payment, and shall mail one to the commissioner. The  
19 minimum premium for each bond must be two dollars and fifty cents per year. Payments must  
20 be made for one year or for ~~such a longer terms~~ term as prescribed by the commissioner ~~may~~  
21 ~~prescribe.~~ ~~From and after July 1, 1953, the.~~ The premiums referred to in this section must be  
22 waived until the reserve fund of the state bonding fund has been depleted below the sum of two  
23 million dollars. The collection of premiums must be resumed on the bonds, at the rates  
24 provided under this section, whenever the reserve fund is depleted below the sum of two million  
25 dollars. The premiums must continue to be collected until the reserve fund reaches a total of  
26 three million dollars, at which time all premiums must again be waived until the reserve fund  
27 has been depleted below the sum of two million dollars.

28           **SECTION 14. AMENDMENT.** Section 26.1-21-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
29 amended and reenacted as follows:

30           **26.1-21-10. Automatic insurance of state and political subdivisions.** ~~The public~~  
31 ~~employees and public officials of the~~



- 1           1. ~~Each state agency and each political subdivision thereof, as the case may be,~~  
2           ~~must shall apply to be insured bonded~~ in the fund ~~according to the provisions of~~  
3           ~~this chapter upon application to the state bonding fund and upon approval by the~~  
4           ~~commissioner~~ on a biennial basis or if a change in coverage is requested. Unless  
5           an application is denied within sixty days from the date it is received by the ~~state~~  
6           ~~bonding fund commissioner~~, the application will be deemed approved and bond  
7           coverage in force. ~~The provisions of this chapter and of any statute requiring a~~  
8           ~~bond constitute the bond of each and every public official for the purpose of any~~  
9           ~~law of this state requiring such bond and constitute the entire contract between the~~  
10           ~~fund and the state or its political subdivisions, respectively, as the obligee in any~~  
11           ~~such bond.~~ The application must include a list of conditions covered under the  
12           bond beyond the basic blanket bond conditions provided in this chapter. If a bond  
13           is in the discretion of the state agency or political subdivision and a bond is not  
14           requested, the state agency or political subdivision is exempt from this section.
- 15           2. The application must include a requested amount of bond coverage based on the  
16           amount of money and property handled and the opportunity for defalcation and any  
17           other condition imposed by law and list twenty-five percent of the money in control  
18           of the public officials or employees for which the bond is requested for the  
19           preceding year based on the total monthly balances. In addition, the application  
20           must include any information requested by the commissioner to determine the  
21           amount of money and property handled and the opportunity for defalcation,  
22           including the procedure used to determine the amount of bond requested,  
23           revenues for the last budget period by type, expenditures for the last budget period  
24           by type, the number of people that handle money, any portion of the last audit, and  
25           any financial procedures.

26           **SECTION 15. AMENDMENT.** Section 26.1-21-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
27 amended and reenacted as follows:

28           **26.1-21-11. Default of public employees or public officials - ~~Duty of public~~**  
29 **~~officer~~– Limitation on filing of claims against fund.** ~~Immediately upon, and in no event later~~  
30 ~~than~~ Within sixty days after, the discovery of any default or wrongful act on the part of any  
31 public employee or public official; for which the fund is or may become liable, the state auditor,

1 county auditor, city auditor, township clerk, or business manager of the school district, ~~or~~; the  
2 treasurer of the state or state agency or political subdivision ~~thereof~~, if the defaulting officer is  
3 the auditor or clerk of the state or state agency or political subdivision; and any other officer  
4 having supervision of a defaulting public employee or public official; shall file a claim with the  
5 commissioner against the fund. Any person injured by ~~such a~~ default or wrongful act, ~~if that~~  
6 ~~person intends to hold the fund liable therefor, shall~~ may present the claim to the commissioner  
7 within sixty days after the discovery of such default or wrongful act. If a claim is not filed within  
8 the time limited by this section, ~~such~~ the claim is waived. A claim filed under ~~the provisions of~~  
9 this section must contain an abstract of the facts upon which ~~it~~ the claim is based and must be  
10 verified by the claimant or by someone in the claimant's behalf, ~~and, together with~~. The claim  
11 and all papers relating thereto, to the claim must remain on file with the commissioner.

12 **SECTION 16. AMENDMENT.** Section 26.1-21-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
13 amended and reenacted as follows:

14 **26.1-21-12. Commissioner to notify state auditor of default of public employee or**  
15 **public official - Duty of state auditor.** If any public employee or public official defaults or  
16 creates a liability against the fund, the commissioner shall notify the state auditor, ~~who~~. The  
17 state auditor immediately shall ~~check~~ investigate the accounts of ~~such~~ the public employee or  
18 public official and file a report with the commissioner stating ~~the~~ any amount, ~~if any~~, due from  
19 the fund because of ~~such~~ the default or wrongful act. For ~~such service~~ these services, the  
20 auditor must be paid out of the fund the same fees as the auditor is paid for auditing the  
21 accounts of county officers.

22 **SECTION 17. AMENDMENT.** Section 26.1-21-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
23 amended and reenacted as follows:

24 **26.1-21-14. Filing claim is condition precedent to bringing action - Failure to act**  
25 **is refusal disallowance.** ~~No~~ An action may not be maintained against the fund upon ~~any~~ a  
26 claim ~~whatsoever~~ until the claim ~~first~~ has been presented for allowance as provided in this  
27 chapter and the ~~allowance of such~~ commissioner has refused to allow the claim has been  
28 ~~refused.~~ Any. A claim which that has not been acted upon and allowed or disallowed within  
29 sixty days after its presentation for allowance ~~must be deemed to be refused~~ is disallowed. The  
30 filing and disallowance of the claim must be alleged in the complaint in any action brought  
31 ~~thereon~~ against the fund.

1           **SECTION 18. AMENDMENT.** Section 26.1-21-15 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
2 amended and reenacted as follows:

3           **26.1-21-15. Limitation of time for bringing action against the fund - Interest -**  
4 **Limitation on time for fund liability.** ~~No~~ An action may not be maintained against the fund  
5 upon any claim ~~whatsoever~~ unless ~~such~~ the action is commenced within one year after filing of  
6 the claim with the commissioner. Interest on the claim runs from the date of filing of the claim  
7 with the commissioner. The liability of the fund is limited to a breach of a condition of the bond  
8 which occurred within two years before the date of filing of the claim with the commissioner.

9           **SECTION 19. AMENDMENT.** Section 26.1-21-16 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
10 amended and reenacted as follows:

11           **26.1-21-16. Suit by party injured by default of public employee or public official -**  
12 **Subrogation - Right of appeal.** ~~Any~~ A person, ~~limited liability company, or corporation~~ injured  
13 by the default or wrongful act of any public employee or public official may sue the public  
14 employee or public official ~~and to~~. To effect recovery from the fund ~~shall, that person must~~ join  
15 the fund as codefendant. A judgment must be obtained against the public employee or public  
16 official to create liability upon the bond. If the judgment is obtained against the public employee  
17 or public official, ~~it~~ the judgment must specify that to the extent to which the fund is liable upon  
18 the bond of the public employee or public official, the judgment must be paid out of any money  
19 in the fund or that which may accrue to the fund. If the judgment is paid out of the fund, the  
20 fund has a right to recover and is subrogated to the right of the judgment creditor to recover  
21 against ~~such~~ the public employee or public official. ~~In~~ The commissioner may act for the fund  
22 in all proceedings to enforce such the right of subrogation, the commissioner shall act for and in  
23 ~~behalf of the fund, and in any action or proceeding the commissioner may appeal from any~~  
24 ~~appealable an~~ order or ~~from any~~ judgment against the fund the same as other parties to civil  
25 actions ~~may appeal~~.

26           **SECTION 20. AMENDMENT.** Section 26.1-21-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
27 amended and reenacted as follows:

28           **26.1-21-17. Allowed liability claims payable from fund - Administrative expenses -**  
29 **Methods of payment.** ~~All liability claims which are~~ A claim allowed against the fund must be  
30 paid upon warrants drawn upon the state treasurer against the fund. ~~Such warrants~~ The  
31 warrant must be prepared by the office of management and budget pursuant to the directions of

1 the commissioner. Payments for administrative expenses of the state bonding fund must be  
2 made within the limitations of legislative appropriations upon warrant-checks prepared by the  
3 office of management and budget after the approval of vouchers by the commissioner.

4 **SECTION 21. AMENDMENT.** Section 26.1-21-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 **26.1-21-18. Commissioner may make examinations - Request for accounting -**  
7 **Reporting defaulting official to governor.** If the commissioner ~~is of the opinion at any time~~  
8 determines that the interests of the fund are jeopardized by the misconduct or inefficiency of  
9 any public official, the commissioner shall ~~make, or~~ request the state auditor to make; an  
10 examination, and, if necessary, shall cause an action for an accounting to be instituted against  
11 ~~such~~ the public official for the purpose of requiring a complete disclosure of the business of the  
12 office of which ~~such~~ the public official is an incumbent. ~~Such~~ The action must be brought in the

6 ~~bond or bonds~~ out of any public funds. Evidence of a bond purchased under this section must  
7 be filed with the commissioner.

8           **SECTION 24. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 3 of section 27-05.2-02 of the North Dakota  
9 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

10           3. In a county in which the supreme court determines that at least five full-time  
11 employees are necessary to provide adequate clerk of district court services, the  
12 elected clerk of district court and clerk of court staff designated by the supreme  
13 court shall become employees of the state judicial system if the board of county  
14 commissioners consents to the transition after consultation with the elected clerk.  
15 This subsection applies upon receipt by the supreme court of a resolution adopted  
16 by the board of county commissioners indicating its consent. Any equipment,  
17 including technology-related equipment, and furnishings in the control and custody  
18 of the clerk of district court on the date the clerk becomes a state employee must  
19 remain in the control and custody of the clerk until the state court administrator  
20 determines the items are no longer needed. The clerk, upon becoming a state  
21 employee, shall receive a salary in an amount not less than the salary received as  
22 a county employee and shall remain an employee of the state judicial system until  
23 the clerk retires, resigns, or the term for which the clerk was initially elected  
24 expires, whichever occurs earlier. Thereafter, the clerk of district court must be  
25 appointed in the manner provided by supreme court rule. ~~The bond for the clerk of~~  
26 ~~district court must be set by the supreme court.~~ If the board of county  
27 commissioners does not consent to the clerk and designated staff becoming  
28 employees of the state judicial system, the county must provide clerk of district  
29 court services at its own expense in accordance with subsection 2.

30           **SECTION 25. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-09-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is  
31 amended and reenacted as follows:

15          county auditor of each county to do the same as provided by law.

18          secretary of state's office.

20          or kind earned, collected, or charged by the secretary of state, with the date, name
