- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 43-55 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating
- 2 to creation of the allied counsel professionals board; to amend and reenact subsection 4 of
- 3 section 25-03.3-01, subsection 8 of section 26.1-26.4-04, paragraphs 2 and 3 of subdivision f of

- 6 North Dakota Century Code, relating to consolidation of the North Dakota state board of
- 7 psychologist examiners, North Dakota board of social work examiners, board of addiction
- 8 counseling examiners, board of counselor examiners, and North Dakota marriage and family
- 9 therapy licensure board into the allied counsel professionals board; to repeal sections 43-32-02,
- 10 43-32-03, 43-32-04, 43-32-05, 43-32-06.1, 43-32-07, 43-41-08, 43-45-02, 43-45-03, 43-45-05,

#### 13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 4 of section 25-03.3-01 of the North Dakota

  Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 4. "Qualified expert" means an individual who has an expertise in sexual offender
  evaluations and who is a psychiatrist or psychologist trained in a clinical program
  and licensed pursuant to this state's law or a psychologist approved for exemption
  by the North Dakota allied counsel professionals board of psychologist examiners
  under chapter 43-32. For purposes of evaluating an individual with mental
  retardation, the qualified expert must have specialized knowledge in sexual
  offender evaluations of individuals with mental retardation.
- SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 8 of section 26.1-26.4-04 of the North Dakota
  Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- eliminating symptomatic, maladaptive, or undesired behavior and enhancing interpersonal relationships, work and life adjustment, personal effectiveness, behavioral health, and mental health. The term includes psychological testing and the evaluation or assessment of personal characteristics, such as intelligence, personality, abilities, interests, aptitudes, and neuropsychological functioning; counseling, psychotherapy, and other therapeutic techniques based on psychological principles; diagnosis and treatment of mental and emotional disorder or disability, compulsive disorders, disorders of habit or conduct as well as of the psychological aspects of physical illness, accident, injury, or disability; and psychoeducational evaluation, therapy, remediation, and consultation. The term includes providing psychological services to individuals, families, groups, and the public regardless of whether payment is received for services rendered.
- 6. "Psychologist" means an individual who is licensed under this chapter in the practice of psychology.
- 7. "Psychology resident" means an individual who has received from a school or college a doctorate degree in a program of study substantially psychological in nature, and who is involved in supervised psychological employment.
- 8. "School or college" means any university or other institution of higher learning which is accredited by a regional accrediting association, offering a full-time graduate course of study in industrial-organizational psychology or psychology.
- **SECTION 5. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-16 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

The board shall administer and 21 enforce the provisions of this chapter, evaluate the qualifications of applicants, and issue 22 licenses under this chapter. - "Counselor" means a person who has been granted either a professional counselor
   or associate professional counselor license by the board.
  - 4. "Licensed associate professional counselor" means a person who has been granted an associate professional license by the board to offer and conduct counseling under the supervision of a licensed professional counselor or such other person meeting the requirements of supervising professional set by the board.
  - "Licensed professional counselor" means a person who is trained in counseling or a related human service field and has been granted a professional counselor license by the board.
  - **SECTION 12. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-53-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- **43-53-01. Definitions.** As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:
  - "Advertise" includes the issuing or causing to be distributed any card, sign, or device to any person; the causing, permitting, or allowing any sign or marking in or on any building, radio, or television; or advertising by any other means designed to secure public attention.
  - 2. "Board" means the North Dakota marriage and family therapy licensure allied counsel professionals board under chapter 43-55. As used in this chapter, the term is limited to the activities of the board under this chapter.
  - 3. "Licensed marriage and family therapist" means an individual who holds a valid license issued under this chapter.
  - 4. "Marriage and family therapy" means the diagnosis and treatment of mental and emotional disorders, whether cognitive, affective, or behavioral, within the context of marriage and family systems. Marriage and family therapy involves the professional application of psychotherapeutic and family systems theories and techniques in the delivery of services to individuals, couples, and families for the purpose of treating such diagnosed nervous and mental disorders.
  - 5. "Practice of marriage and family therapy" means the rendering of marriage and family therapy services to individuals, couples, and families, singly or in groups,

- whether the services are offered directly to the general public or through organizations, either public or private, for a fee, monetary or otherwise.
  - 6. "Qualified supervision" means the supervision of clinical services, in accordance with standards established by the board, by an individual who has been recognized by the board as an approved supervisor.
  - 7. "Recognized educational institution" means any educational institution that grants a baccalaureate or higher degree that is recognized by the board and by a regional accrediting body, or a postgraduate training institute accredited by the commission on accreditation for marriage and family therapy education.
  - 8. "Use a title or description of" means to hold oneself out to the public as having a particular status by means of stating on signs, mailboxes, address plates, stationery, announcements, calling cards, or other instruments of professional identification.
  - **SECTION 13. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-53-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

# **43-53-05. Board powers and duties.**

- 1. The board shall administer and enforce this chapter. The board shall adopt rules as the board determines necessary.
- 2. The board shall examine and pass on the qualifications of all applicants and shall issue a license to each successful applicant. The board shall adopt a seal which must be affixed affix its seal to all licenses issued by the board.
- 3. The board may authorize expenditures determined necessary to carry out this chapter.
- 4. Four of the members of the board constitute a quorum. The board may employ attorneys, experts, and other employees as necessary for the proper performance of the board's duties.
- 5. The board shall adopt a nationally recognized code of ethics for the practice of marriage and family therapy.

**SECTION 14. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-53-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

## 43-53-10. Disciplinary proceedings.

- The board may deny, revoke, or suspend a license granted under this chapter on the following grounds:
  - Conviction by a court of competent jurisdiction of an offense that the board determines to be of such a nature as to render the licensee unfit to practice marriage and family therapy. The board shall compile, maintain, and publish a list of such offenses.
  - Violation of ethical standards of such a nature as to render the licensee unfit b. to practice marriage and family therapy. The board shall publish such ethical standards.
  - Fraud or misrepresentation in obtaining a license. C.
  - d. Any just and sufficient cause that renders a licensee unfit to practice marriage and family therapy.
- 2. A license may be denied, suspended, or revoked for the reasons set forth in subsection 1. A license may not be denied, suspended, or revoked under this section except by majority vote of the full board, notwithstanding any other provision of this chapter.
- 3. Any person may file a complaint with the board seeking denial, suspension, or revocation of a license issued or to be issued by the board. The complaint must be in a form prescribed by the board and must be verified under oath by the complainant or a duly authorized officer of a complainant. If the board determines that a complaint alleges facts that, if true, would require denial, revocation, or suspension of a license, the board promptly shall institute a hearing. If the board determines a complaint does not state facts warranting a hearing, the complaint may be dismissed. The board may institute a hearing for denial, suspension, or revocation of a license on its own motion.
- Any person may be permitted to intervene and participate in board hearings on 4. denial, suspension, or revocation of licenses upon a showing of an interest in such proceeding.

- 5. Any individual whose license has been suspended or revoked may apply to the board for vacation of the suspension or reinstatement of the license.
  - **SECTION 15.** Chapter 43-55 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- **43-55-01. Definitions.** In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:
  - "Allied counsel professions" means the licensed professions of the practice of psychology, under chapter 43-32; social work practice, under chapter 43-41; addiction counseling, under chapter 43-45; counseling, under chapter 43-47; and the practice of marriage and family therapy, under chapter 43-53.
  - 2. "Board" means the allied counsel professionals board.
  - 3. "Licensee" means an allied counsel professional licensed by the board.

# 43-55-02. Allied counsel professionals board.

- 1. The allied counsel professionals board consists of thirty members appointed by the governor. Except for the initial board, the term of office of each member of the board is three years, beginning on July first and ending on June thirtieth. Upon the expiration of a member's regular term, the board member shall continue to serve until a successor is appointed. The governor shall fill all vacancies by appointment within thirty days of the end of the regular term or within thirty days after receiving notification of the unscheduled vacancy. In the case of a vacancy before the expiration of a term, the appointment must be for the remainder of the term. A member may serve no more than two consecutive regular terms. The appointment of a member automatically terminates when the member ceases to meet the qualifications of appointment. An individual appointed to board membership qualifies by taking the oath required of civil officers.
- 2. The governor may remove a board member for good cause after giving that member a written statement of the reasons for removal and after that member has had an opportunity for a hearing.
- 3. A board member may not participate in any matter before the board in which that member has a pecuniary interest, personal bias, or other similar conflict of interest.
- 4. A majority of the members of the board constitutes a quorum.

### **43-55-03. Board membership.**

- 1. The initial board is made up of the individuals who until the effective date of this Act were serving as members of the former North Dakota state board of psychologist examiners, North Dakota board of social work examiners, board of addiction counseling examiners, board of counselor examiners, and North Dakota marriage and family therapy licensure board. Upon the termination of these five boards, the members of these five former boards automatically transition into serving on the allied counsel professionals board. Before January 1, 2008, the governor shall modify the ending date of the initial board members' terms as necessary to provide for continuity and even distribution of vacancies. Term modifications made under this subsection must be done in a manner that minimizes the lengthening or shortening of the terms of board members.
  - <u>2.</u> Each member of the board must be a resident of this state.
  - 3. The board shall represent the allied counsel professionals as follows:
    - a. Five members representing the practice of psychology, at least one of whom must be engaged primarily in providing service in psychology and at least one of whom must be engaged primarily in teaching, training, or research in psychology. Each of these five members must be a licensed psychologist; have received a doctorate degree in psychology from a school or college at least five years before appointment on the board; and have actively engaged in the practice of teaching or research of psychology for at least five years.
    - b. Four members representing social workers, two of whom must be licensed social workers, one of whom must be a licensed certified social worker, and one of whom must be a licensed independent clinical social worker.
    - c. Seven members representing addiction counselors, six of whom are licensed addiction counselors actively engaged in the practice of addiction counseling and one of whom is a licensed addiction counselor in private practice.
    - d. Three members representing counselors, two of whom are practicing
       counselors and one of whom is a counselor educator.
    - e. Three members representing marriage and family therapists, all of whom must be licensed practicing marriage and family therapists. During the two years preceding appointment on the board, each of these three members

1		must have been a resident of this state. For at least five years preceding		
2		appointment, each of these three members must have been actively engaged		
3		as marriage and family therapists in rendering professional services in		
4		marriage and family therapy; in the education and training of master's,		
5		doctoral, or postdoctoral students of marriage and family therapy; or in		
6		marriage and family therapy research.		
7		f. Eight representatives of the general public who may not have any direct		
8		affiliation with the practice of any of the allied health professions.

1 **43-55-06.** Board member compensation. Each member of the board serves without 2 compensation but is entitled to receive expenses as provided in section 54-06-09 and is entitled 3 to receive a per diem if the board fixes a per diem rate. 4 **43-55-07.** Board to keep records. Except as otherwise provided by law, the records 5 of the board are public records and evidence of the proceedings of the board. A transcript of 6 board proceedings, duly certified by the secretary of the board and bearing the seal of the 7 board, is admissible in evidence with the same effect as if the original were produced. 8 **43-55-08. Penalty.** Any person who violates this chapter is guilty of a class B 9 misdemeanor. 10 SECTION 16. AMENDMENT. Section 65-02-21.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 11 amended and reenacted as follows: 12 65-02-21.1. Licensure required for psychologists and physicians performing 13 utilization review. Psychologists making utilization review determinations under sections 14 65-02-20 and 65-02-21 shall have current licenses from the state allied counsel professionals board of psychologist examiners under chapter 43-32. Physicians making utilization review 15 16 determinations under sections 65-02-20 and 65-02-21 shall have current licenses from the state 17 board of medical examiners. This requirement does not apply to psychologists or physicians 18 conducting independent medical examinations under section 65-05-28. 19 **SECTION 17. REPEAL.** Sections 43-32-02, 43-32-03, 43-32-04, 43-32-05, 43-32-06.1, 20 43-32-07, 43-41-08, 43-45-02, 43-45-03, 43-45-05, 43-47-02, 43-47-03.1, and 43-53-04 of the 21 North Dakota Century Code are repealed.
