## SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.

- There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury,
   not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$1,706,192, or so much of the sum as may
   be necessary, to the superintendent of public instruction for the purpose of
   assisting eligible school districts with high fuel costs incurred during the 2005-06
   school year, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2009.
- 9 2. The superintendent of public instruction shall distribute the funds appropriated
  10 under subsection 1 as follows:
- 11a.A school district is eligible to receive an amount equal to five percent of any12state transportation aid payments received by the district during the first year13of the 2005-07 biennium if the school district's unobligated general fund14balance on June 30, 2005, was greater than thirty percent of its actual15expenditures during the 2004-05 school year but not greater than forty16percent of its actual expenditures during the 2004-05 school year.
- b. A school district is eligible to receive an amount equal to ten percent of any
  state transportation aid payments received by the district during the first year
  of the 2005-07 biennium if the school district's unobligated general fund
  balance on June 30, 2005, was greater than twenty percent of its actual
  expenditures during the 2004-05 school year but not greater than thirty
  percent of its actual expenditures during the 2004-05 school year.
- c. A school district is eligible to receive an amount equal to fifteen percent of any
   state transportation aid payments received by the district during the first year
