MESSAGES FROM THE GOVERNOR.

DAKOTA TERRITORY, EXECUTIVE OFFICE, Yankton, January 9, 1863.

To the Honorable the House of Representatives :

GENTLEMEN: At the time when I defined the council and representative districts of this territory, and cyportioned the representation therete, I was in doubt as to the right of the white persons residing upon the uncoded Indian lands on the Red River, in this territory, to be included within a council or representative district; bat as I did not full clear upon this point, I concluded to give them the benefic of the doubt. And when I approved the ast of the last lepidative accordity, defining the Red Aiver Clatrict and fining the representation thereof, I did to under a filled apprichmatical of the entent of the white population of said district. I have shown hard, and now know by in Fight the evidence, that if ended to a representation at all, the white pepulation of said dissist would not, under the ratio of lause fle No. 22, calles and district to a larger représentation than ene main er el che bratse of reprecontatives. And were it not for the embrance of soil act of the last highling exceeding, enriched then a the apportion the representation to the Roll River district," Low all not at this time approve of any act giving to said district (if any) a larger representation then one member of the house of representatives. Dut, as I am convinced that a larger majority of the voters of the territory desire an increased representation and a re-apportionment, I have approved and signed house file No.

22, entitled "an act dividing the territory of Dakota into council and representative districts, and apportioning the councilmen and representatives therein," and I herewith return the same.
