A MEMORIAL TO THE HON. ALEXANDER RANDALL, POST MASTER GENERAL, U. S, PRAYING THAT THE MAIL SERVICE ON ROUTE NO. 13801 FROM SIOUX CITY, IOWA, TO FORTR ANDALL, DAKOTA TERRITORY, BE INCREASED.
