## FENCES.

## CHAPTER 7.

## AN ACT STUPPLEMENTARY ANB AMENDATORY TO CHAPTER FIFTEEN, LAWS 186:-6, ENTITLED "AN AC'T T0 ESTABLISH A FENCE LAN."

## Be it enacted iby the Legizlative Assembly of the Territory of Dalota:

Section 1. That a fence constructed by placing the end of mind of tonce posts firmly in the ground, not to exceed twelve feet apart, and by firmly securing thereto one board, rail or pole at the top and three strands of commen fence wire below, or by plav cing the end of posts firmily in the ground not to exceed thirtytwo feet apart, and by firmly securing thereto four strands of common fence wire, with a swing post every eight feet between the stationary posts. The wires to be not more than twelve inches apart on the posts, and the lower wire to be not more than twenty inches above the average surface of the ground, along each joint or length of ferice. The top of said fence shall not be less than fuur and a half feet above the average surface of the ground.

Sec. 2. That a fence made as described in section 1 (one), samo shall be deemed a lawful funce when in good repair.

Scc. 3. That section eleven (11), chapter fifteen (15), laws sec. 11, chapter
 after the word "apply," and insert in lieu thereof the words "to all the counties of this Territory."
Sec. 4. This act shall take effect and be in foree from and act to the after its passage and approval.
