Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Dakota:

Commencing at Como Station, on the Union Pacific Railroad, thence due north to the forty fifth parallel of north latitude, thence west along said parallel to the one hundred and seventh degree and thirty minutes west longitude, thence south along the eastern boundary of Carter County to the fortysecond parallel of north latitude, thence east along said parals lel to a point due south of Como Station, and thence due north to the place of beginning; and the following officers are hereby appointed for said county, to act until the next ensuing general election, and until their successors are duly elected. and qualified:
