WATER COURSE DEFINED.

AN ACT Defining a Water Course.

Be It Enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of North Dakota:

§ 1. DEFINED.] A water course entitled to the protection of the law is constituted, if there is a sufficient natural and accustomed flow of water to form and maintain a distinct and a defined channel. It is not essential that the supply of water should be continuous or from a perennial living source. It is enough if the flow arises periodically from natural causes and reaches a plainly defined channel of a permanent character.

§ 2. REPEAL.] All acts or parts of acts in conflict with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

§ 3. EMERGENCY.] Whereas, an emergency exists in the fact that there is no law on our statute book defining a water course, therefore this act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.

STATE WEATHER BUREAU ABOLISHED.

AN ACT to Repeal Sections 395, 396, 397, 398 and 399 of the Revised Codes of 1905, Relating to State Weather Bureau.

Be It Enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of North Dakota:

§ 1. REPEAL.] Sections numbered 395, 396, 397, 398 and 399 of the revised codes of 1905 be, and the same are, hereby repealed.
