DUTIES OF ADJUTANT GENERAL.

AN ACT to Amend Section 1737 of the Revised Codes of North Dakota of 1905, Relating to the Duties of Adjutant General.

Be It Enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of North Dakota:

That section 1737 be amended so as to read as follows:

§ 1. § 1737. ADDITIONAL DUTIES OF ADJUTANT GENERAL.} The adjutant general shall, in addition to his other duties, organize and conduct a bureau of pensions, for the purpose of assisting ex-soldiers or sailors, residents of the state, who may apply for pensions on account of wounds or disability incurred in the service of the United States, in establishing their claims without fee or commissions. The salary of the adjutant general shall be eighteen hundred dollars per annum, which, with the necessary expenses incurred in conducting the bureau of pensions, office and clerk hire, furniture, light, fuel, postage, and other office expenses, shall be paid from the general fund by warrants drawn by the state auditor on the state treasurer, on the order of the governor.
