fined not less than \$500.00 nor more than \$1,000.00 for the first offense, and for each subsequent conviction shall be confined in jail for not less than six months.

§ 6. WHAT CONSTITUTES VIOLATION.] The doing of anything prohibited by this act shall be evidence of the violation of the provisions of this act relating to the things so prohibited, and the omission to do anything directed to be done shall be evidence of a violation of the provisions of this act relative to the things so directed to be done.

§ 7. REPEAL.] All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

§ 8. EMEBGENCY.] This Act being a health measure for the better protection of the health and the physical and moral welfare of all our people, shall take effect from and after its passage and approval, but in order that the people may come to understand the requirements of this measure, no prosecutions shall be begun under the provisions of this statute until September, 1st, 1911.

CHAPTER 278.

[H. B. No. 380-Hill]

BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF SOLDIERS' HOME.

AN ACT to Amend Section 1213 of the Revised Codes of 1905, of the State of North Dakota, Relating to the Board of Trustees of the Soldiers' Home.

Be It Enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of North Dakota:

§ 1. AMENDMENT.] That section 1213 of the Revised Codes of 1905. of the state of North Dakota, be amended to read as follows:

§ 1213. BOARD OF TRUSTEES.] The general supervision and government of the home shall be vested in a board of five trusties, to be styled "The Board of Trustees of the Soldiers' Home," each member of which shall have served in the army or navy of the United States, or members of the National Guard of North Dakota, and four of whom shall be appointed by the governor, by and with the advice and consent of the senate, two of whom shall be from the county wherein the institution is located. The

members of the board shall hold their office for the term of three, four and five years respectively. The time for which each member shall hold his office shall be designated in his certificate of appointment. The commander or chief officer of the organization known as the Grand Army of the Republic shall be ex-officio a member of said board, with the same powers, duties and privileges as the other members thereof. The compensation of the trustees shall be three dollars per day each, for not exceeding twenty-four days in any one year and their necessary expenses while performing the duties of their office.

EMERGENCY.] Whereas, an emergency exists in this that the present law is inadequate to secure proper representation on the board of trustees; therefore, this act shall be in force from and after its passage and approval.

CHAPTER 279.

PUBLIC SERVICE OF STALLIONS.

AN ACT To Amend Sections 1, 3, 5, 8 and 13 of Chapter 161 of the Session Laws of 1909, Entited "An Act to Regulate the Public Service of Stallions in North Dakota, and Providing a Penalty for Violation Thereof."

Be It Enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of North Dakota:

§ 1. AMENDMENT.] Section 1 of Chapter 161, Session Laws of 1909 is amended and re-enacted to read as follows:

§ 1. LICENSES. RECORDING OF LICENSES. DEFINITION.] Every person, firm or company standing or using any stallion or jack for public service in this state shall cause the name, description and pedigree of such stallion or jack to be enrolled by a stallion registration board, hereinafter provided for, and shall secure a license from said board as provided for in section 3 of this act. All license certificates for stallions issued under this act shall be presented to and recorded by the register of deeds of the counties in which said stallion is used for public service.

The word stallion wherever used in this act shall be construed to include the term "Jack" as well.

§ 2. AMENDMENT.] Section 3 of chapter 161 Session Laws of 1909 is amended and re-enacted to read as follows:
