NOTICE OF INTENT TO AMEND ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

TAKE NOTICE that the North Dakota Department of Health will hold a public hearing to address proposed amendments to the reportable conditions to N.D. Administrative Code chapter 33-06-01 — Conditions Designated as Reportable at 10:00 a.m. on July 9, 2019, in Conference Room 212, Judicial Wing, 600 East Boulevard Avenue, Bismarck, ND. The purpose of the proposed amendment is to add/remove conditions of public health importance to the reportable conditions listed in order to maintain health and wellness among North Dakota residents. The proposed amendments are not expected to have an impact on the regulated community in excess of \$50,000.
