¹ The amount provided for a market equity salary increase for the Superintendent of Public Instruction is reduced from \$14,528 to \$10,979. The amount included in the bill will provide for a monthly increase of \$522 per month for the last 18 months of the biennium.

⁹ Funding for salaries and wages is reduced by \$100,000 from the general fund to reflect the reduction of 1 FTE position to be determined by the department.

This amendment also:

- Adds a new Section 6, which provides that the department may not transfer any FTE positions between the Division of Independent Study and the other divisions of the department without first obtaining approval of the Budget Section.
- Adds a new Section 7, which provides legislative intent that the department's 2003-05 biennium budget request contain no more than 129.95 FTE positions, 1 FTE less than the number authorized in the House version for the 2001-03 biennium. Although the agency is provided the authority to determine the specific position eliminated, the reduction is to reflect potential savings resulting from Information Technology Department statewide initiatives, which may result in a reduction in data collection responsibilities for the Department of Public Instruction.

[•] Adds a new Section 5, which allows the Education Standards and Practices Board to use up to \$7,000 of the amount appropriated by the Fifty-sixth Legislative Assembly for the national board certification program to pay stipends to teachers receiving national board certification during the 1999-2001 biennium. An emergency clause is added to make this section effective upon passage of the bill.

• Adds new Sections 15 and 17 to provide statutory changes relating to the supplemental payment program currently authorized by North Dakota Century Code Section 15-40.1-07.8. The statutory formula limits the payment to each qualifying district and for the 1999-2001 biennium will result in the Department of Public Instruction being unable to distribute the entire legislative appropriation. This amendment allows the department to adjust the formula to allow the distribution of all appropriated funds. An emergency clause is added for this section to allow the 1999-2001 biennium appropriation for these payments to be distributed.

¹ The House version of House Bill No. 1013 included a general fund appropriation of \$1,289,643 for developing and administering standards-based assessments, as required for the state to be eligible to continue receiving federal Title I funding. The Department of Public Instruction has received a proposal to develop and administer the required tests at a cost of \$1,212,928 for the 2001-03 biennium. In addition, the department has indicated that the cost of reporting the results, as required by House Bill No. 1293, will be

an additional \$5,000. The Senate version of House Bill No. 1013 provides \$1,217,928 to fully fund the federal Title I testing and the requirements of House Bill No. 1293.

 2 The Senate amendment increases the appropriation for limited English proficiency payments from \$450,000 to \$650,000 to fund the payment levels specified in House Bill No. 1321, as passed by the Senate.

³ North Dakota Century Code (NDCC) Section 15-40.1-07.8 provides a formula for the distribution of supplemental payments to school districts. The formula limits the amount each district qualifies for and does not provide a mechanism to allow the distribution of any remaining funds. For the 1999-2001 biennium, the department estimates that \$420,838 will remain unspent and will be general fund turnback. For the 2001-03 biennium, the department estimates that the statutory formula will only allow the distribution of approximately \$2.2 million. The House amended NDCC Section 15-40.1-07.8 to allow the department to adjust the formula to distribute all supplemental payment funds appropriated for the 1999-2001 biennium and future bienniums. The Senate amendment removes this statutory change and reduces the appropriation accordingly.

⁴ The Senate amendment removes \$50,000 added by the House for geographic education, reducing the line item to \$50,000, as included in the Schafer and Hoeven budget recommendations.

 5 The Schafer and Hoeven budget recommendations included \$33,000 for the teacher certification program. The House reduced the funding to \$20,000, which is the same as the amount appropriated for the 1999-2001 biennium. House Bill No. 1344, as amended by the Senate, includes \$83,000 for this program. Consequently, this amendment removes the funding from this bill.

⁶ The funding and FTE authority relating to the Division of Independent Study is removed from the Department of Public Instruction and is reflected in a separate subdivision of the bill.

⁷ The teacher compensation payments line item is removed and the foundation aid line item is increased to reflect per student payments of \$2,349 the first year of the biennium and \$2,411 the second year, as provided in House Bill No. 1344 with Senate amendments. In addition, House Bill No. 1344 with Senate amendments includes a general fund appropriation of \$20.8 million for teacher bonus payments.

⁸ House Bill No. 1344 with Senate amendments appropriates \$200,000 to the Department of Public Instruction for developing a school district employee compensation report. The appropriation provides salaries and related expenses for a new FTE position at the department.

This amendment changes Section 7 of the engrossed bill, which limits the number of FTE positions to be included in the department's 2003-05 biennium base budget request, to reflect the removal to the FTE positions relating to the Division of Independent Study. The base budget request for the 2003-05 biennium will be limited to 94.25 FTE, one less than the Senate version for the 2001-03 biennium.

This amendment also adds new sections, as follows:

- Section 4 directs the Department of Public Instruction to use \$20,000 of the amount appropriated for operating expenses to fund the Red River Valley writing project. The Schafer and Hoeven executive recommendations and the House version included \$10,000 for this project. The Senate amendment directs the department to spend an additional \$10,000 for this project, but does not provide additional funding.
- Section 5 directs the department to spend \$1,217,928 of the amount appropriated for operating expenses to develop and administer student tests aligned with the state content standards and to report the results of the tests.
- Section 6 provides that, in addition to other salary increases appropriated by the Legislative Assembly, teachers at the Division of Independent Study, the School for the Blind, and the School for the Deaf will be provided salary increases of \$1,750 for the first year of the biennium and an additional \$1,750 for the second year of the biennium (total of \$5,250 per teacher for the biennium). The amounts included in the salaries and wages line items for the respective agencies are:
 - Division of Independent Study \$95,550

- School for the Deaf \$97,125
- School for the Blind \$73,763
- Sections 15 and 17 increase the reimbursement rate from 25 cents to 35 cents per mile for in-city busing for schoolbuses with a capacity of 10 or more students.

This amendment changes Section 7 of the engrossed bill, which limits the number of FTE positions to be included in the department's 2003-05 biennium base budget request, to reflect the removal of the FTE positions relating to the Division of Independent Study and other FTE changes. The base budget request for the 2003-05 biennium will be limited to 94.25 FTE, one less than the Conference Committee version for the 2001-03 biennium.

This amendment also adds new sections as follows:

- Section 4 directs the Department of Public Instruction to use \$20,000 of the amount appropriated for operating expenses to fund the Red River Valley writing project. The Schafer and Hoeven executive recommendations and the House version included \$10,000 for this project. The Senate amendment directs the department to spend an additional \$10,000 for this project but does not provide additional funding.
- Section 5 directs the department to spend \$1,217,928 of the amount appropriated for operating expenses to develop and administer student tests aligned with the state content standards and to report the results of the tests.
- Section 6 provides that, in addition to other salary increases appropriated by the Legislative Assembly, teachers at the Division of Independent Study, the School for the Blind, and the School for the Deaf will be provided salary increases of \$1,000 for the first year of the biennium and an additional \$2,000 for the second year of the biennium (total of \$4,000 per teacher for the biennium). The Senate version provided a total of \$5,250 per teacher for the biennium. The amounts included in the salaries and wages line items for the respective agencies are:

Division of Independent Study - \$72,800 School for the Deaf - \$74,000 School for the Blind - \$56,200

- Sections 15 and 17 increase the reimbursement rate from 25 cents to 35 cents per mile for in-city busing for schoolbuses with a capacity of 10 or more students.
- Section 18, which appropriates \$13,000 from the general fund to the State Board for Vocational and Technical Education for grants.
