## Major Related Legislation

Senate Bill No. 2058 increases the state mileage reimbursement rate from 31 to 37.5 cents per mile as recommended by the Legislative Compensation Commission.
Senate Bill No. 2059 increases the maximum reimbursement legislators may receive for lodging during legislative sessions from $\$ 650$ to $\$ 900$ per month for legislators staying in motels and to $\$ 750$ per month for legislators staying in private residences as recommended by the Legislative Compensation Commission.
Senate Bill No. 2195 increases the state lodging reimbursement rate from $\$ 45$ to $\$ 50$ per night plus tax and increases the state meal reimbursement rate from a total of $\$ 20$ per day to a total of $\$ 25$ per day.
House Bill No. 1515 increases the maximum reimbursement legislators may receive for lodging during legislative sessions from $\$ 650$ to $\$ 900$ per month effective January 1, 2005.
