If the office of the Secretary of State is not exempted from North Dakota Century Code Section 54-06-04.1, an additional staff member would have to be employed to handle the bookwork in order to comply with said statute. This is due to the number of departments within the office itself, and the number of people handling the different types of filings and other duties.

For example, all mail is opened by one person. If money accompanies the papers, one of two clerks receipts the money, and if not, the papers are forwarded directly to the proper department. In the corporations department, which handles over 45 different types of corporate filings, any one of four people may handle the papers, along with many other types of transactions. The staff in the corporations department also handles trade names, trademarks, State Athletic Commission, funeral establishments, licenses to solicit charitable contributions, service of process, et al. Almost all papers are handled by two or three persons before completion. Determination of the annual costs of each type of transaction is thus compounded.

The total fees of each department within the office are calculated and the total office expenses are shown on Supplement Page 2. To break down the expenses and fees, additional personnel would be needed.
