This is in followup to our brief discussion regarding the fiscal note accompanying HB 1057.

The estimate was predicated on the assumption that counsel would be appointed by the court on behalf of all allegedly incapacitated individuals for whom guardianship may be sought in the 83-85 biennium.

NORTHEAST 1407 24th Avenue South Grand Forks, ND 58201 Telephone: 746-9411 You have brought to my attention Section 30.1-28-03(2), NDCC, which requires the court to appoint an "appropriate official" or attorney to represent allegedly incapacitated persons in proceedings for guardianship in instances where the individual does not have counsel of his own choice.

NORTHWEST 316 Second Avenue West Box 1568 Williston, ND 58801 Telephone: 572-8126 Assuming it will be the practice of the courts to appoint "appropriate officials" as opposed to attorneys in these proceedings, there should be minimal fiscal impact.

SOUTH CENTRAL Jamestown, ND 58401 Telephone: 252-2641 The remaining areas of potential impact relate to: the state law requirement that the court cause the allegedly incapacitated individual to be examined by a court appointed physician; and, the individual's right to present evidence which, although unlikely in a majority of the proceedings, could entail the calling of expert witnesses, the costs of which could be assessed against the department if the individual is indigent.

With respect to defraying the costs of court appointed physicians called upon to examine allegedly incapacitated persons, it is assumed that the Medicaid program, in most instances, would pay the costs, Additionally, the courts may be pursuaded to appoint and accept the reports of staff physicians at Grafton-San Haven or physician consultants on contract with the human service centers.

As to defraying the costs of expert witnesses, it is anticipated that in most instances these experts will be public employees acting in their official capacity for which there will be no charge.

In summary, there will be no appreciable fiscal impact upon the general fund should HB 1057 become law, assuming:

- 1) The courts will appoint appropriate officials rather than attorneys;
- 2) The courts will appoint physicians in the employ of or under contract with the state;
- 3) The expert witnesses which may be called on behalf of allegedly incapacitated persons will be public employees.
