POINT OF PERSONAL PRIVILEGE

SEN. DAVID: Madam President: I rise on a point of personal privilege and request that my remarks be printed in the Journal.

Madam President and members of the Senate: Just because both Senator Meyers' from District 36 and 53 and myself are on this resolution it doesn't mean that we are the only ones interested in the accomplishments of North Dakotans. Brad Gjermundson that you just heard a few moments ago having honored us in the state by being recognized worldwide, three times in the special feat, is indicative, I think, of our people of North Dakota.

Rodeo is the most attended sport in the United States and it's the only sport that comes from our own western American heritage. North Dakota has added much to this popular sport through the contribution of rodeo greats for years past including world's champion Alvin Nelson in 1957. Mr. Nelson went on to win the all-around finals of 1961. and he won the finals in saddle bronc in '62 at Oklahoma City. Alvin Nelson hails from Grassy Butte. We also want to think about the Teschers from Sentinel Butte. Jim Tescher came within just eighteen points of winning the world's championship and he has judged at the National Finals Rodeo in Oklahoma City several times. Then we look at Duane Howard from Minnewaukan, saddle bronc and bull riding. While never winning the championship in either of these events, he was a contender and a runner-up in winning the all-around one year at the finals and he's been a judge at the finals. This last year he was a judge at the National finals in Oklahoma City. Then, of course, we have Brenda Bonogofsky. We were so honored to have her here before this last session. Brenda is another example of North Dakota's tenacity. She is the first and only North Dakotan to be crowned Miss Rodeo America. Wayne Herman, of Dickinson, right now is leading in the Professional Rodeo Cowboys' Association bareback division. We think of these people and the Dean Armstrongs and, of course, the Pete Fredricks, and the Joe Chases. They have all qualified to participate in the National Finals Rodeo at Oklahoma City. They have brought much recognition to our Peace Garden State.

These are dedicated men and women, a product of our lifestyle in North Dakota and of our environment. They are a breed of their own in the world of sports, through their own dedication, their own sacrifices, and their own expenses and, of course, their own hard work, they paved their own way. They are driven only by their individual dedication to bring honor and recognition to all of us in North Dakota. They are a product that we can be proud of, we can be proud to know, we can be proud to be associated with. Thank you, Madam President.

Coursework must have been completed within six months of the filing of the application for licensure and must have consisted entirely of classroom hours.

Continuing education required.

- Beginning January 1, 1987, any person licensed as 1. an agent, broker, surplus lines broker, consultant, or limited insurance representative, shall provide the commissioner evidence, as required by the commissioner, that the person attended or participated in continuing education of not less than fifteen hours per year of approved coursework, of which seven and one-half hours per year must be classroom hours. Credit for courses attended in any one year over fifteen hours of coursework may be credited to the year next following the year in which they were earned. Reports of continuing education must be made at the end of each four-year period following licensure, except as provided in subsection 2.
- On or before January 1, 1986, the commissioner shall by rule divide the persons subject to this section into four equal segments for the purpose of reporting, as follows:
 - a. One-fourth of the persons shall file their report showing fifteen hours or more of approved coursework for the first year under this section within thirty days of January 31, 1987.

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section within thirty days of January 1, 1988.

- c. One-fourth of the persons shall file a report showing forty-five hours or more of approved coursework for the first three years under this section within thirty days of January 31, 1989.
- d. One-fourth of the persons shall file a report showing sixty hours or more of approved coursework for the first four years under this section within thirty days of January 31, 1990.
- 3. All persons licensed after January 1, 1987, shall report within thirty days of the first day of January of the year following the fourth anniversary of the person's licensure.
