SENATE AMENDMENTS TO ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1008

In lieu of the amendments adopted by the Senate as printed on pages 1325-1326 of the Senate Journal, Engrossed House Bill No. 1008 is amended as follows:

Page 1, line 7, remove "and from special funds derived from other income,"

Page 1, line 10, replace "348,378" with "376,529"

Page 1, remove lines 14 and 15

Page 1, line 16, replace "431,347" with "514,420"

Renumber accordingly

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

DEPARTMENT 617 - BOARD OF ANIMAL HEALTH

SENATE - This amendment makes the following changes:

Due to the defeat of House Bill No. 1198, funding of \$54,922 of special funds which would have been collected by the Board of Animal Health from charging for health books and tags is removed and funding of \$54,922 is provided from the general fund.

The salaries and wages line item is increased by \$10,881 from the general fund to reflect Governor Sinner's salary increase recommendation for state employees.

Funding of \$17,270 from the general fund is added for pay equity increases for the two veterinarians (director and deputy) on staff. This change provides a total of \$46,577 from the general fund, for pay equity increases.

In total, this amendment increases funding for the Board of Animal Health by \$83,073 from the general fund and other funds of \$54,922 are removed.

This amendment does not include funding for the third veterinarian, but \$25,000 from the general fund remains in the bill for contract veterinarian services which was added by the House.

Compared to the 1991-93 legislative general fund appropriation of \$647,044, funding from the general fund for the Board of Animal Health provided under provisions of this amendment of \$514,420 is 80 percent of the 1991-93 funding level.

"SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 57-43.2-14 of the 1991 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

1. Except as otherwise provided in this section, the commissioner may proceed to audit the returns of special fuel dealers and purchase records of special fuel users and, not later than three years after the due date of the return, or three years after the return was filed, whichever period expires later, or three years after purchase by a special fuel user, assess the tax and, if any additional tax is found due, the commissioner shall notify the taxpayer in detail of the reason for the increase.

SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 57-43.2-15 of the 1991 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

57-43.2-15. Refusal or failure to file return or pay tax when due - Deficiencies - Penalties. If any special fuel dealer refuses or fails to file a return required by this chapter or fails to pay the tax due within the time prescribed by section 57-43.2-12, there is imposed a penalty of five dollars or a sum equal to five percent of the tax due, whichever is greater, together with interest at the rate of one percent per month on the tax due, for each calendar month or fraction of a month during which ~~such~~ the refusal or failure continues, excepting the month within which the tax became due. If any special fuel user fails to pay any tax due under this chapter, the commissioner shall impose a penalty of five dollars or a sum equal to five percent of the tax due, whichever is greater, together with interest at the rate of one percent per month on the tax due, for each calendar month or fraction of a month during which the refusal or failure continues, not including the month within which the tax became due. The commissioner, for good cause shown, may waive the penalty or the interest provided by this section."

MESSAGE TO THE HOUSE FROM THE SENATE (CAROL SIEGERT, SECRETARY)

MR. SPEAKER: The Senate has passed and your favorable consideration is requested on: SCR 4074.

MOTION

REP. RYDELL MOVED that the remarks of Major General Alexander P. Macdonald be printed in the Journal, which motion prevailed.

I am here today representing the nearly 50,000 members of the National Guard Association of the United States (NGAUS), an association of the officers of the National Guard. The association periodically recognizes distinguished service to the National Guard. One of these awards is the Charles Dick Medal of Merit named in honor of a president of the association, a Major General in the Ohio National Guard, and a United States Congressman and Senator. General Dick was responsible for the legislation that established the foundation of the modern National Guard.

To be awarded this honor an individual must have distinguished himself over an extended period of time in their support of the National Guard through service in a state or national elected legislative body. The support of the individual must be such that it has a lasting effect on the future of the National Guard.

The individual we are to honor today certainly fulfills the letter and intent of those words. The 5,000 members of the North Dakota National Guard join me in recognizing the distinguished service of Representative and Lieutenant Colonel Bob Martinson. He has been active in the National Guard for over 23 years and in the Legislature for over 20 years. During that time he has worked extremely hard on legislation that has allowed North Dakota to maintain a National Guard recognized as one of the nation's finest. I will mention today just four items out of the many that have had a profound effect on our state and its guard and on which Representative Martinson has had a profound impact.

State funding for armory construction. We have been able to bring over 30 million federal dollars into our state for construction of modern, state-of-the-art, sorely needed armories in Bismarck, Devils Lake, Minot, Fargo, and Grand Forks. In addition, numerous other facilities were upgraded or added to. None of this could have been possible without state support.

Our Veterans' Cemetery, which is now largely complete and holds 86 honored veterans and their loved ones. After years of effort Representative Martinson lead the fight to make the cemetery an ongoing facility.

The development of Camp Grafton South provided an engineer training site second to none. Not only does it provide training areas for our units, we have been able to expand our engineer school at Camp Grafton and this year will bring in over 2,500 soldiers from across the United States to train in North Dakota. The purchase of that land was an investment in the future of our guard and state.

The last item and the most important is the establishment and continued funding of the Tuition Trust Fund that has benefited over 6,000 North Dakota guard members. It has allowed North Dakota to have a guard which is one of the largest relative to our population and which brings into North Dakota each year nearly \$100,000,000 federal dollars and provides 1,000 full-time jobs.

If Representative Martinson would come forward. I join my fellow national guard members in bestowing upon you the Charles Dick Medal of Merit and expressing our profound thanks. The entire National Guard of your state salutes you.
