## SENATE BILL NO. 2052

1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 4-09-03.1, 4-10.4-05, 4-10.5-04, 4-10.6-04,

2 subsection 3 of section 4-27-05, sections 4-28-05, 21-10-01, 23-01-02, 23-18.2-04, 24-02-37.1,

3 subsection 2 of section 25-02-01.1, sections 25-04-20, 43-12.1-07, 43-35-07, 49-21-22.1,

4 subdivision a of subsection 4 of section 49-23-03, sections 54-03-10, 54-03-19.1, 54-03-19.2,

5 54-03-20, subsection 4 of section 54-06-25, sections 54-24.3-02, 54-35-10, 54-35.2-04,

6 subsection 6 of section 54-52-03, sections 61-02-12, 61-04.1-07, 61-06-22, 61-24-04, and

7 61-24.5-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to compensation and reimbursement of

8 members of the legislative assembly and various boards, councils, and commissions; and to

9 provide an effective date.

### 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 4-09-03.1 of the 1995 Supplement to the North
 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

13 4-09-03.1. State seed arbitration board - Compensation and expenses. The state 14 seed arbitration board consists of the commissioner of agriculture, the director of the North 15 Dakota state university extension service, the director of the North Dakota agricultural 16 experiment station, the chair of the North Dakota seed trade committee of the North Dakota 17 agriculture association, and a representative of a major North Dakota farm organization 18 appointed by the commissioner of agriculture, or their authorized designees. Each board 19 member is entitled to receive the same as per diem compensation as provided for members of 20 the legislative council under section 54-35-10 sixty-two dollars and fifty cents, and 21 reimbursement of expenses as provided by law for state officers, while attending meetings or 22 performing duties directed by the board, except that no compensation under this section may 23 be paid to any member who receives compensation or salary as a regular state employee or

official. Compensation and expenses for board members who do not receive compensation or
 salary as a regular state employee or official must be paid by the department of agriculture.

3 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 4-10.4-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
4 amended and reenacted as follows:

5 4-10.4-05. Meetings - Quorum - Compensation and expenses of council. A 6 guorum is necessary for the transaction of all business in carrying out the duties of the council. 7 The chairman shall call all meetings of the council except special meetings which the chairman 8 shall call on the petition of two council members within seven days of receiving such a petition. 9 Each voting member of the council is entitled to receive the same sixty-two dollars and fifty 10 cents as compensation per day as provided in section 54-35-10 for members of the legislative 11 council and their necessary mileage and travel expenses as provided in sections 44-08-04 and 12 54-06-09 while attending council meetings or in the performance of such special duties as the 13 council may direct. The compensation provided in this section must may not be paid to any 14 member of the council who receives salary or other compensation as a regular employee of the 15 state.

SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 4-10.5-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

18 4-10.5-04. Meetings - Quorum - Compensation and expenses of council. All 19 meetings of the council must be called by the chairman except special meetings which must be 20 called by the chairman on the petition of three council members within seven days of receiving 21 the petition. Each member of the council, except the commissioner, will is entitled to receive 22 the same sixty-two dollars and fifty cents per day as compensation as provided for members of 23 the legislative council under section 54-35-10, together with expenses as provided in sections 24 44-08-04 and 54-06-09, while attending meetings or performing duties directed by the council, 25 except that no compensation may be paid to any council member who receives compensation 26 or salary as a regular state employee or official.

27 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 4-10.6-04 of the 1995 Supplement to the North
28 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

4-10.6-04. Meetings - Compensation and expenses of council. The chairman shall
 call all meetings of the council. The chairman shall call special meetings on the petition of three
 council members, within seven days of receiving the petition. Each council member is entitled

1 to receive the same as per diem compensation as provided for members of the legislative 2 council under section 54-35-10 sixty-two dollars and fifty cents, and reimbursement of 3 expenses as provided by law for state officers, while attending meetings or performing duties 4 directed by the council, except that no compensation under this section may be paid to any 5 member who receives compensation or salary as a regular state employee or official. 6 SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Subsection 3 of section 4-27-05 of the North Dakota 7 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 8 The appointive and elected members of the commission shall are entitled to 3. 9 receive a salary equal to seventy five percent of the compensation of forty-seven 10 dollars per day as provided in section 54-35-10 for members of the legislative

council while actually engaged in the official duties of the commission, plus their
actual expenses at the same rates as other state officials.

SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 4-28-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

15 4-28-05. Wheat commission - Meeting - Expenses - Legal adviser. Upon call of the 16 governor, the commission shall first meet and organize by electing from the membership a 17 chairman and vice chairman, who shall hold office for one year and until their successors are 18 elected and have qualified. Thereafter the commission shall meet at least once every calendar 19 quarter at such times and places as must be determined by the commission and may meet in 20 special meetings upon such call and notice as may be prescribed by rules adopted by the 21 commission. Members of the commission must be reimbursed for actual expenses necessarily 22 incurred in attending meetings and performing other official duties on the same basis as other 23 state officers and are entitled to receive the same as per diem compensation as provided in 24 section 54-35-10 for members of the legislative council sixty-two dollars and fifty cents for each 25 day actually devoted to official business of the commission. The attorney general shall act as 26 legal adviser to the commission or designate an assistant for that purpose and within the limit of 27 the funds available to the commission it may employ other counsel to advise and represent the 28 commission in its affairs and proceedings.

SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 21-10-01 of the 1995 Supplement to the North
 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

## 1 **21-10-01.** State investment board - Membership - Term - Compensation - Advisory 2 council.

3 1. The North Dakota state investment board consists of the governor, the state 4 treasurer, the commissioner of university and school lands, the director of the 5 workers compensation bureau, the commissioner of insurance, three members of 6 the teachers' fund for retirement board or the board's designees who need not be 7 members of the fund as selected by that board, and three of the elected members 8 of the public employees retirement system board as selected by that board. The 9 teachers' fund for retirement board may appoint an alternate designee with full 10 voting privileges to attend meetings of the state investment board when a selected 11 member is unable to attend. The public employees retirement system board may 12 appoint an alternate designee with full voting privileges from the public employees 13 retirement system board to attend meetings of the state investment board when a 14 selected member is unable to attend. The members of the state investment board, 15 except elected and appointed officials, are entitled to receive the same sixty-two 16 dollars and fifty cents as compensation per day as provided in section 54-35-10 for 17 members of the legislative council and necessary mileage and travel expenses as 18 provided in sections 44-08-04 and 54-06-09 for attending meetings of the state 19 investment board.

The state investment board may establish an advisory council composed of
 individuals who are experienced and knowledgeable in the field of investments.
 The state investment board shall determine the responsibilities of the advisory
 council. Members of the advisory council are entitled to receive the same
 compensation as provided the members of the advisory board of the Bank of North
 Dakota and necessary mileage and travel expenses as provided in sections
 44-08-04 and 54-06-09.

# SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 23-01-02 of the 1995 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

29 23-01-02. Health council - Members, terms of office, vacancies, compensation,
 30 officers, meetings. The health council consists of nine members appointed by the governor in
 31 the following manner: Four persons from the health care field and five persons representing

1 consumer interests. The governor may select members to the council from recommendations 2 submitted by trade, professional, and consumer organizations. On the expiration of the term of 3 any member, the governor, in the manner provided by this section, shall appoint for a term of 4 three years, persons to take the place of members whose terms on the council are about to 5 expire. The officers of the council must be elected annually. Any state agency may serve in an 6 advisory capacity to the health council at the discretion of the council. The council shall meet at 7 least twice each year and at other times as the council or its chairman may direct. The health 8 council shall have as standing committees any committees the council may find necessary. 9 The chairman of the council shall select the members of these committees. The members of 10 the council are entitled to receive the same sixty-two dollars and fifty cents as compensation 11 per day as provided in section 54-35-10 for members of the legislative council and their 12 necessary mileage and travel expenses as provided in sections 54-06-09 and 44-08-04 while 13 attending council meetings or in the performance of any special duties as the council may 14 direct. The per diem and expenses must be audited and paid in the manner in which the 15 expenses of state officers are audited and paid. The compensation provided for in this section 16 may not be paid to any member of the council who received salary or other compensation as a 17 regular employee of the state, or any of its political subdivisions, or any institution or industry 18 operated by the state.

SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 23-18.2-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

21 23-18.2-04. Commissioners of authority - Appointment, compensation, 22 qualifications, tenure. Upon an affirmative vote of the county electors in the election required 23 by section 23-18.2-03, the board of county commissioners shall appoint five persons as 24 commissioners for the authority created in such the county. The commissioners who are first 25 appointed must be designated to serve for terms of one, two, three, four, and five years, 26 respectively, from the date of their appointment, and thereafter, each commissioner must be 27 appointed for a term of five years, except that all vacancies must be filled for the unexpired 28 term. No commissioner of an authority may be an officer or an employee of the county for 29 which the authority is created. A commissioner shall hold office until his a successor has been 30 appointed and has qualified. A commissioner shall is entitled to receive as compensation in the 31 amount provided in subsection 1 of section 54-35-10 sixty-two dollars and fifty cents per day

while actually engaged in official duties of the authority and must be reimbursed for mileage and
 expenses in the amounts provided by sections 44-08-04 and 54-06-09.

3 SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 24-02-37.1 of the 1995 Supplement to the North
4 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

5 24-02-37.1. Special road advisory committee. The special road advisory committee 6 consists of one member of the senate transportation committee and one member of the senate 7 appropriations committee appointed by the chairman of the legislative council and one member 8 of the house of representatives transportation committee and one member of the house of 9 representatives appropriations committee appointed by the chairman of the legislative council 10 and also the director of the game and fish department, the director of the parks and recreation 11 department, the director of the department of economic development and finance, and the 12 commissioner. The committee shall meet at the call of the commissioner, who is chairman of 13 the committee, to review requests for funding from the special road fund and to advise the 14 commissioner regarding funding requested projects. The commissioner shall provide staff 15 services to the committee. All final decisions regarding funding requested projects are in the 16 sole discretion of the commissioner. The members of the commission who are members of the 17 legislative assembly must be compensated by the department, from moneys appropriated from 18 the special road fund, for attendance at committee meetings at the rate provided in section 19 54-35-10 for members of the legislative assembly for attendance at interim committee meetings 20 and are entitled to reimbursement for expenses incurred in attending the meetings in the 21 amounts provided by law for other state officers.

SECTION 11. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 25-02-01.1 of the North Dakota
 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

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2. The department, in consultation with the state hospital, shall create a state hospital governing body and shall by rules describe the powers and duties of the governing body. The department shall compensate and reimburse members not employed by the department in the same manner and amount as members of the legislative council are compensated and reimbursed under section 54-35-10 of sixty-two dollars and fifty cents per day and reimburse members for expenses incurred in attending meetings in the amounts provided by sections 44-08-04 and 54-06-09.

SECTION 12. AMENDMENT. Section 25-04-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

3 **25-04-20.** Westwood park assets management committee. The westwood park 4 assets management committee consists of eleven members appointed by the governor as 5 follows: three members of the senate, two from the majority faction and one from the minority 6 faction, and three members of the house of representatives, two from the majority faction and 7 one from the minority faction; a representative of the department of human services; a 8 representative of the department of economic development and finance; a representative of the 9 attorney general's office; the mayor of Grafton; and the governor or the governor's designee. 10 The officers of the westwood park assets management committee must be elected annually. 11 Any state agency may serve in an advisory capacity to the westwood park assets management 12 committee at the discretion of the committee. The committee shall meet at least twice each 13 year and at other times as the committee or its chairman may direct. The legislative members 14 of the committee are entitled to receive the same compensation per day as provided in section 15 54-35-10 established for members of the legislative council assembly for attendance at interim 16 committee meetings and the necessary mileage and travel expenses provided in sections 17 44-08-04 and 54-06-09 while attending committee meetings or in the performance of such 18 special duties as the committee may direct. The compensation provided for in this section may 19 not be paid to any member of the committee who received salary or other compensation as a 20 regular employee of the state, or any of its political subdivisions, or any institution or industry 21 operated by the state. The westwood park assets management committee shall act when the 22 legislative assembly is not in session to sell, lease, and otherwise manage the property of 23 westwood park, subject to prior budget section approval. The department of human services 24 shall provide staff services for the westwood park assets committee. Any conveyance made by 25 the committee under this section is exempt from sections 54-01-05.2 and 54-01-05.5.

26 **SECTION 13. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-12.1-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is 27 amended and reenacted as follows:

43-12.1-07. Compensation of board members. In addition to the expenses incurred
while engaged in the performance of the duties of office, each board member shall receive a
per diem fee not to exceed the compensation allowed members of the legislative assembly
<u>ninety dollars</u> for each day of service under section 54-03-20.

SECTION 14. AMENDMENT. Section 43-35-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

43-35-07. Compensation and reimbursement of expenses. Each appointive
member of the board shall is entitled to receive the same sixty-two dollars and fifty cents
compensation per day and must be reimbursed for his expenses in the same amounts as
provided for in section 54-35-10 for members of the legislative council sections 44-08-04 and
54-06-09 while attending board meetings or otherwise engaged in the official business of the
board.

9 SECTION 15. AMENDMENT. Section 49-21-22.1 of the 1995 Supplement to the North
10 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

11 49-21-22.1. (Effective until December 31, 1998) Regulatory reform review 12 commission - Appointments - Compensation - Report to legislative council. The 13 regulatory reform review commission shall review the operation and effect of North Dakota 14 telecommunications law on an ongoing basis during the interims between the 1995 and 1999 15 legislative sessions and shall submit a report regarding its operation and effect to the legislative 16 council in 1996 and 1998. The regulatory reform review commission may review the effect of 17 taxation laws on North Dakota telecommunications law during the interims between the 1995 18 and 1999 legislative sessions and may include any findings and recommendations with respect 19 to its review of the effect of taxation laws on North Dakota telecommunications law in the report 20 to the legislative council in 1996 and 1998. The regulatory reform review commission consists 21 of one member of the public service commission who has responsibility for telecommunications 22 regulation, two members of the senate, appointed by the president of the senate, and two 23 members of the house of representatives, appointed by the speaker. The chairman of the 24 legislative council shall designate the chairman and vice chairman of the regulatory reform 25 review commission from the legislative members of the commission. The public service 26 commission shall provide technical assistance and the legislative council shall provide staff 27 services to the regulatory reform review commission. The legislative members of the regulatory 28 reform review commission are entitled to the same compensation as provided for members of 29 committees of the legislative council under section 54-35-10. The legislative council shall pay 30 the compensation for the legislative members of the regulatory reform review commission. The 31 public service commission shall pay the expenses of the member of the public service

commission serving on the regulatory reform review commission and of the public service
 commission staff providing technical assistance while carrying out their duties.

3 SECTION 16. AMENDMENT. Subdivision a of subsection 4 of section 49-23-03 of the
4 1995 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

5 The nonprofit corporation must be incorporated by seventeen initial a. 6 incorporators, with one member representing the house of representatives 7 and one member representing the senate appointed by the legislative council, 8 one member representing telecommunications companies offering local 9 exchange service to fewer than fifty thousand subscribers, one member 10 representing telecommunications companies offering local exchange service 11 to fifty thousand or more subscribers, one member representing rural water 12 systems, one member representing rural electric cooperatives, one member 13 representing investor-owned electric utilities, one member representing 14 investor-owned natural gas utilities, one member representing cable television 15 systems, one member representing cities with a population of fewer than five 16 thousand, one member representing cities with a population of at least five 17 thousand, one member representing counties, one member representing 18 underground interstate carriers of gas, one member representing interstate 19 carriers of petroleum, one member representing interstate carriers of 20 telecommunications services, one member representing contractors who 21 perform excavation services, and one member representing the production 22 sector of the American petroleum institute. The initial incorporators must 23 represent and be designated by operators, excavators, and other persons 24 eligible to participate in the center. The legislative members are entitled to the 25 same compensation and expenses as provided for members of committees of 26 the legislative council under section 54-35-10. The legislative council shall 27 pay the compensation for the legislative members.

SECTION 17. AMENDMENT. Section 54-03-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

30 54-03-10. Compensation of speaker, majority and minority leaders, assistant
 31 majority and minority leaders, committee chairmen, and employees. The speaker of the

1 house, the house majority leader, the senate majority leader, the house minority leader, and the 2 senate minority leader shall are each entitled to receive as compensation, in addition to any 3 other compensation or expense reimbursement provided by law, the an additional sum of ten 4 dollars per day for each calendar day during any regular, special, or organizational session, as 5 determined by the legislative compensation commission. Chairmen of the substantive standing 6 committees, the house assistant majority leader, the senate assistant majority leader, the house 7 assistant minority leader, and the senate assistant minority leader shall are entitled to receive 8 additional compensation of five dollars, as determined by the legislative compensation 9 commission, for each calendar day during any regular, special, or organizational session. The 10 additional compensation provided by this section must be paid in the manner provided in 11 section 54-03-20. The legislative assembly, by concurrent resolution, shall fix the 12 compensation of the other officers and employees elected or appointed. 13 SECTION 18. AMENDMENT. Section 54-03-19.1 of the 1995 Supplement to the North 14 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 15 54-03-19.1. Legislative compensation commission - Appointment of members. 16 The legislative compensation commission shall develop recommendations for a 1. 17 long-term policy on legislative compensation, expense allowance, and insurance 18 benefits, and recommend appropriate levels of compensation, expense allowance, 19 and insurance benefits to be paid to or on behalf of members of the legislative 20 assembly. 21 2. The governor shall appoint five members to the commission. No more than three 22 appointees may represent the same political party. No member of the commission 23 may hold state office or serve in state government in any capacity at the time of 24 appointment or during service on the commission. The members must be 25 appointed for a term of four years, and the governor shall appoint one of the 26 members chairman of the commission. 27 **SECTION 19. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-03-19.2 of the 1995 Supplement to the North 28 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 29 54-03-19.2. Meetings - Powers and duties - Expenses. The commission shall meet 30 at the call of the chairman as often as may be necessary, but at least once during each 31 biennium. The commission shall determine levels of legislative compensation, expense

1 allowance, and insurance benefits to be paid for service upon interim committees and during 2 legislative sessions, which permit citizens to hold legislative office without undue financial 3 sacrifice or disadvantage. In formulating recommendations levels of compensation, expense 4 allowances, and insurance benefits, the commission may consult with the leadership of the 5 legislative assembly, and review compensation, expense allowance, and insurance benefits for 6 legislative service in other states and in other areas of state and federal service and private 7 industry. The By December 1, 1998, and December first of each subsequent even-numbered 8 year, the commission shall report its findings and recommendations regarding legislative 9 compensation policy to the legislative assembly. The commission may file with the legislative 10 council a bill incorporating its recommendations. The levels determined regarding legislative 11 compensation, expense allowance, and insurance benefits will become effective on December 12 first of each even-numbered year and remain effective unless disapproved by a concurrent 13 resolution adopted by a sixty percent vote of the members-elect of each house within thirty days 14 after the convening of the subsequent legislative assembly. If the legislative assembly 15 disapproves of the recommendations of the commission, the levels of legislative compensation, 16 expense allowances, and insurance benefits revert to the levels in effect before December first 17 of the preceding year. Members of the legislative compensation commission must be 18 compensated for time spent in attendance at meetings of the commission and for other travel 19 as approved by the chairman of the legislative council at the rate of sixty-two dollars and fifty 20 cents per day and must be reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses incurred in the 21 same manner as other state officials. The expense allowance must be paid from appropriations 22 then in effect for the legislative assembly. The commission may solicit the assistance of the 23 staff of the legislative council to provide information, aid, and assistance in carrying out its 24 duties.

25 SECTION 20. AMENDMENT. Section 54-03-20 of the 1995 Supplement to the North
26 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

54-03-20. Compensation and expense reimbursement of members of the
legislative assembly. Each member of the legislative assembly of the state of North Dakota is
entitled to receive as compensation for services in the sum of ninety dollars determined by the
legislative compensation commission for each calendar day during any organizational, special,
or regular legislative session. Each member of the legislative assembly is entitled to receive

1 reimbursement for lodging, which may not exceed a the maximum of six hundred dollars 2 amount determined by the legislative compensation commission per calendar month for lodging 3 in state, at the rates and in the manner provided in section 44-08-04 for each calendar day 4 during the period of any organizational, special, or regular session. Members of the legislative 5 assembly who receive reimbursement for lodging are also entitled to reimbursement for travel 6 for not to exceed one round trip taken during any calendar week, or portion of a week, the 7 legislative assembly is in session, between their residences and the place of meeting of the 8 legislative assembly, at the rate provided for state employees with the additional limitation that 9 reimbursement for travel by common carrier may not exceed thirty-five cents per mile based 10 upon air mileage. A member of the legislative assembly who does not receive reimbursement 11 for lodging and whose place of residence in the legislative district that the member represents is 12 not within the city of Bismarck is entitled to reimbursement at the rate provided for state 13 employees for necessary travel for not to exceed one round trip taken per day between the 14 residence and the place of meeting of the legislative assembly when it is in session and may 15 receive reimbursement for lodging at the place of meeting of the legislative assembly as 16 provided in section 44-08-04 for each calendar day for which round trip travel reimbursement is 17 not claimed, provided that the total reimbursement may not exceed six hundred dollars per 18 month the maximum amount determined by the legislative compensation commission. The 19 amount to which each legislator is entitled must be paid following the organizational session in 20 December and following each month during a regular or special session.

A day, or portion of a day, spent in traveling to or returning from an organizational, special, or regular session must be included as a calendar day during a legislative session for the purposes of this section.

In addition, each member is entitled to receive during the term for which the member was elected, as compensation for the execution of public duties during the biennium, the <u>a</u> <u>monthly</u> sum <del>of one hundred eighty dollars a month</del> <u>determined by the legislative compensation</u> <u>commission</u>, which is payable every six months. If a member dies or resigns from office during the member's term, the member may be paid only the allowances provided for in this section for the period for which the member was actually a member.

Attendance at any organizational, special, or regular session of the legislative assembly
by any member is a conclusive presumption of entitlement as set out in this section and

1 compensation and expense allowances must be excluded from gross income for income tax 2 purposes to the extent permitted for federal income tax purposes under section 127 of the 3 Economic Recovery Tax Act of 1981 [Pub. L. 97-34; 95 Stat. 202; 26 U.S.C. 162(i)]. 4 SECTION 21. AMENDMENT. Subsection 4 of section 54-06-25 of the 1995 5 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 6 4. The members of the legislative assembly who are commission members are 7 entitled to receive compensation from the legislative council for each day in 8 attendance at commission meetings in the same manner as provided in section 9 54-35-10 for members of the legislative council and reimbursement from the 10 legislative council for travel and other necessary expenses incurred in performing 11 commission duties in the amounts provided for state employees under section 12 54-06-09. The state employee members of the commission are entitled to receive 13 reimbursement for necessary expenses incurred in attending commission meetings 14 at the rates provided for state employees under section 54-06-09 and may not be 15 assessed any annual leave or loss of salary for attendance at meetings of the 16 commission. The employing agency of state employee members shall pay their 17 expenses.

The members 22 must include a state legislator; a representative of the superintendent of public instruction; a 23 representative of the state library; a representative of a school library media center; a 24 representative of a college or university library; a representative of a public library; and a 25 representative of a special library. The term of office for each member of the committee is three 26 years and no person may serve more than two 3-year terms. The superintendent of public 27 instruction shall stagger the terms so that initially, three members are appointed for three years, 28 three members are appointed for two years, and one member is appointed for one year. Each 29 member of the committee is entitled to receive the same sixty-two dollars and fifty cents per day 30 compensation as provided for members of the legislative council under section 54-35-10, 31 together with expenses as provided in sections 44-08-04 and 54-06-09, while attending

1 meetings or performing duties directed by the committee, except that no compensation may be

2 paid to any committee member who receives compensation or salary as a regular state

3 employee or official.

4 SECTION 23. AMENDMENT. Section 54-35-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is
5 amended and reenacted as follows:

6 54-35-10. Compensation of members and leadership.

- The members of the council and the members of any committee of the council
   must are entitled to be compensated for the time spent in attendance at sessions
   of the council and of its committees at the rate of sixty two dollars and fifty cents
   per day determined by the legislative compensation commission and must also be
   paid for expenses incurred in attending said meetings and in the performance of
   their official duties in the amounts provided by law for other state officers.
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  2. In addition to the compensation provided in subsection 1, the chairman of the
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19 person chairs.

20 **SECTION 24. AMENDMENT.** Section 54-35.2-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is 21 amended and reenacted as follows:

- 23 A member of the advisory commission on intergovernmental relations who is a 1. 24 member of the legislative assembly is entitled to receive, from funds available to 25 the commission, compensation per day for each day spent in attendance at 26 commission meetings in the same amount as provided in section 54-35-10 for 27 members of the legislative council and reimbursement for travel and other 28 necessary expenses incurred in the performance of official duties in the amounts 29 provided by law for other state officers. Members of the advisory commission on intergovernmental relations who are appointed by an organization representing 30

1		political subdivisions may be reimbursed for attendance at commission meetings
2		by the organization by which they were appointed.
3	2.	The commission may apply for, contract for, receive, and expend for its purposes
4		any appropriation or grant from any public or private source.

All other members of the board shall must be reimbursed 5 for necessary travel and other expenses incurred in the performance of the business of the 6 board in the amounts provided in sections 44-08-04 and 54-06-09. 7 SECTION 28. AMENDMENT. Section 61-06-22 of the North Dakota Century Code is 8 amended and reenacted as follows: 9 61-06-22. Directors and officers - Salary, mileage, and expenses. The 10 compensation for each director per day while performing duties as a member of the board shall 11 must be fixed by the board of directors, but shall may be no more than the compensation 12 sixty-two dollars and fifty cents per day as provided for in section 54-35-10 for members of the 13 legislative council. The allowance for meals and lodging expenses shall must be at the same 14 rate and under the same conditions as provided for state officials and employees. The 15 allowance for travel expenses shall must be at the same rate as provided by section 11-10-15 16 and shall must be evidenced by a subvoucher or receipt, in a manner determined by the board 17 of directors. The salary of the secretary, assessor, and treasurer shall must be determined by 18 the board of directors. 19 SECTION 29. AMENDMENT. Section 61-24-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 20

61-24-04. Compensation of directors. Each member of the board of directors of the
district shall is entitled to receive from the district the same sixty-two dollars and fifty cents
compensation per day and shall must be reimbursed for the member's expenses in the same
amounts as provided for in section 54-35-10 for members of the legislative council sections
44-08-04 and 54-06-09 while attending meetings of the board or otherwise engaged in the
official business of the district.

SECTION 30. AMENDMENT. Section 61-24.5-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

61-24.5-04. Board of directors - Officers - Meetings - Compensation. The authority
 must be governed by a board of directors who must be chosen in accordance with the
 provisions of this chapter. At the first election after the initial board of directors has been

1 appointed, two directors must be elected from each county within the authority, and three 2 directors must be elected in the city of Dickinson. The two directors from Stark County may not 3 be residents of the city of Dickinson. The board shall elect from the directors a chairman, vice 4 chairman, and secretary. A majority of the directors constitutes a quorum for the purpose of 5 conducting the business of the board. The board shall meet at the time and place designated 6 by the secretary. Board members shall are entitled to receive compensation in the amount not 7 to exceed the amount provided for by subsection 1 of section 54-35-10 sixty-two dollars and 8 fifty cents per day, and must be reimbursed for their mileage and expenses in the amount 9 provided for by sections 44-08-04 and 54-06-09.
