HOUSE BILL NO. 1177 (Representatives Nichols, Skarphol, DeKrey) (Senators Kinnoin, O'Connell, Solberg)

AN ACT to create and enact a new section to chapter 24-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to no-mow agreements by the department of transportation.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

**SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 24-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

**No-mow transfer to interstate highways.** The department, in consultation with the game and fish department, shall negotiate with the United States fish and wildlife service and any other appropriate federal agency for the purposes of substituting the no-mow acres contained in the rights of way of United States highway 2 and United States highway 83 to the rights of way of interstate highway 29, or both.
