1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 65-01-02 and five new

- 2 sections to chapter 65-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a workers
- 3 compensation board of directors; to amend and reenact section 65-02-01 of the North Dakota
- 4 Century Code, relating to the director and division directors of the workers compensation
- 5 bureau; to repeal section 65-02-08.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the workers
- 6 compensation state advisory council; and to provide an effective date.

## 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 8 **SECTION 1.** A new subsection to section 65-01-02 of the North Dakota Century Code 9 is created and enacted as follows:
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"Board" means the North Dakota workers compensation board of directors.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 65-02-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

13 65-02-01. Workers compensation bureau - Executive director Director - Division 14 directors. The bureau must be maintained for the administration of this title. The governor 15 board shall appoint the director of the bureau who. The director is subject to the supervision and direction of the governor board and who shall serve serves at the pleasure of the governor 16 17 board. The appointment must be on a nonpartisan, merit basis, in accordance with chapter 18 54-42. The governor shall set the compensation and prescribe the duties of the director. The 19 director may appoint the director of any division of the bureau which is established by the 20 director. The appointment of a division director must be on a nonpartisan, merit basis. 21 **SECTION 3.** A new section to chapter 65-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is 22 created and enacted as follows:

23 Workers compensation board of directors - Appointment.

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1	<u>1.</u>	The initial board of directors shall consist of the members on the state advisory	
2		council on December 15, 1996. The initial board shall appoint the subsequent	
3		board to be effective September 1, 1997.	
4	<u>2.</u>	The appointments must be made so that:	
5		a. Five board members are policyholders, at least one of whom must be a	
6		representative of the safety employment classification, at least two of whom	
7		must be from rate classes of twenty-five thousand dollars or more, at least	
8		one of whom must be from a rate class of ten thousand dollars to twenty-four	
9		thousand nine hundred ninety-nine dollars and ninety-nine cents, and at least	
10		one of whom must be from a rate class of less than ten thousand dollars.	
11		b. One member is an employee representative.	
12		c. One member is a representative from the state medical association.	
13	<u>3.</u>	Board members shall serve four-year terms, except the members appointed by the	
14		state advisory council may serve shorter terms in order to initiate a cycle that	
15		results in at least one member's term expiring on July first each year, as	
16		determined by lot. Board members may not serve more than two consecutive	
17		terms. If any policyholder representative member serves two consecutive terms,	
18		the policyholder representative member appointed to replace that two-term	
19		member must represent a different employment classification.	
20	SEC	CTION 4. A new section to chapter 65-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
21	created and	l enacted as follows:	
22	Cor	npensation of board members. A board member is entitled to receive	
23	compensation in the same amount and manner as provided for legislative council committee		
24	members under section 54-35-10. A board member is entitled to reimbursement for mileage		
25	and expenses as provided for state officers, but the mileage allowance must equal the federal		
26	internal rev	enue service mileage allowance.	
27	SEC	CTION 5. A new section to chapter 65-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
28	created and enacted as follows:		
29	Boa	rd duties. The board shall:	
30	<u>1.</u>	Appoint a director on a nonpartisan, merit basis.	
31	<u>2.</u>	Set the compensation of the director.	

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1	<u>3.</u>	Ensure a proper response to any audit recommendations.	
2	<u>4.</u>	Provide an annual report to the legislative audit and fiscal review committee. The	
3		report must be provided by the chairman of the board and the director.	
4	<u>5.</u>	Prepare the budget estimate of the bureau and submit the estimate to the office of	
5		the budget as required under section 54-44.1-04.	
6	<u>6.</u>	Aid the bureau in formulating policies, discussing problems related to the	
7		administration of the bureau, and in ensuring impartiality and freedom from political	
8		influence in the solution of these problems.	
9	<u>7.</u>	Assist the bureau in formulating policies and discussing problems related to the	
10		administration of the bureau, including adoption of rules, establishment of fees,	
11		determination of employer premium rates, maintenance of the solvency of the	
12		workers' compensation fund, and review of provision of rehabilitation services.	
13	<u>8.</u>	Adopt rules to ensure that a representative cross section of rate classes are always	
14		represented on the board, that a rotational schedule is followed to ensure that no	
15		single rate class is always represented on the board, and adopt procedures to	
16		allow the board to impartially select new board members as terms expire.	
17	<u>9.</u>	Make appropriate recommendations and proposals for consideration by the	
18		bureau.	
19	<u>10.</u>	Adopt rules relating to the election of a board chairman, formation of committees,	
20		replacement of departing members, voting procedures, and other procedural	
21		matters.	
22	SECTION 6. A new section to chapter 65-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
23	created and enacted as follows:		
24	4 Independent audit. Biennially, the director shall request the state auditor to select an		
25	audit firm with extensive expertise in workers' compensation practices and standards to conduct		
26	a performance audit of the divisions of the bureau during that biennium. The audit must		
27	evaluate the divisions of the bureau to determine whether they are providing quality service in		
28	an efficient and cost-effective manner. The audit report must contain recommendations for		
29	improvement. The director and the chairman of the board of directors shall present the audit,		
30	and report on any action taken as a result of the audit, to a special subcommittee of the		
31	legislative council's legislative audit and fiscal review committee. This subcommittee must		

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- include up to three members from the staff of the office of management and budget and the
   state auditor's office.
- 3 SECTION 7. A new section to chapter 65-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
  4 created and enacted as follows:

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5	Proposed budget - Target achievement budgeting.		
6	<u>1.</u>	The bureau budget for August 1, 1997, to July 31, 1998, must follow the budget	
7		practices used in the previous year. The bureau budget for August 1, 1998, to July	
8		31, 1999, may be formulated in the same manner as the previous two years, or it	
9		may be formulated by using target achievement budgeting if the legislative	
10		council's audit and fiscal review committee approves the use of target achievement	
11		budgeting.	
12	<u>2.</u>	Target achievement budgeting includes the board meeting with bureau personnel	
13		to prepare a proposed budget and develop a program to establish relationships,	
14		ratios, and goals based on various categories within the budget. The target	
15		achievement budget must include principles of continuous improvement	
16		goalsetting.	
17	<u>3.</u>	Continuous improvement goalsetting is a procedure for implementing a	
18		team-oriented continuous improvement program throughout all operations of the	
19		bureau. The program must include a number of challenging, measurable goals to	
20		ensure the bureau maintains focus on improving those areas most important to its	
21		primary purpose, objectives, and mission.	
22	SECTION 8. REPEAL. Section 65-02-08.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
23	repealed.		
24	SE	CTION 9. EFFECTIVE DATE. Section 8 of this Act becomes effective September 1,	
25	1997.
