## SENATE BILL NO. 2264

- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide for exemptions from hours of service provisions for intrastate
- 2 commercial drivers.

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## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- **SECTION 1. Definition of intrastate driver.** As used in this Act, "intrastate driver" means a driver who will be operating a commercial motor vehicle within this state for a seven-consecutive-day period.
- SECTION 2. Intrastate exemptions from federal hours of service provisions.
  - 1. The following intrastate drivers are not subject to hours of service limitations:
    - a. A driver of an authorized emergency vehicle.
    - A driver who operates a motor vehicle that has a manufacturer's gross vehicle weight rating equal to or less than twenty-six thousand pounds [11793.40 kilograms].
    - c. A driver of a tow truck operating at the request of a law enforcement officer.
    - 2. Except for a driver included in subsection 1, a motor carrier may not permit or require any intrastate driver to drive and an intrastate driver may not drive:
      - a. More than twelve hours following eight consecutive hours off duty.
      - b. For any period after having been on duty more than fifteen hours.
      - c. After having been on duty for seventy hours in any period of seven consecutive days unless operating within an area having a one hundred fifty air mile radius from the driver's home post office or a one hundred fifty air mile radius from the official worksite of the vehicle if:
        - (1) The driver returns to the work reporting location and is released within twelve consecutive hours.

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1 (2) At least eight consecutive hours off duty separate each twelve hours on 2 duty. 3 (3)The driver does not exceed twelve hours maximum driving time 4 following eight consecutive hours off duty. 5 (4) The person that employs the driver maintains and retains for a period of 6 six months accurate time records showing the time the driver reports for 7 duty each day, the total number of hours the driver is on duty each day, 8 and the time the driver is released from duty each day. 9 3. Following twenty-four consecutive hours off, an intrastate driver begins a new 10 seven-consecutive-day period and on-duty time is reset to zero. 11 4. Hours of service limitations do not apply to an intrastate driver when transporting 12 property or passengers during a declared emergency. The employer must declare 13 and document that the emergency is necessary to assure the protection of public 14 health and safety or to provide other essential assistance to the public. An 15 employer shall maintain documentation for one year and shall make it available 16 upon request of a law enforcement officer. Under this subsection, an emergency is 17 the result of any natural activities, including a tornado, windstorm, thunderstorm, 18 snowstorm, ice storm, blizzard, drought, mudslide, flood, high water, earthquake, 19 forest fire, explosion, blackout, or other occurrence, natural or manmade, which 20 interrupts delivery of essential services, such as electricity, medical care, sewer, 21 water, telecommunications transmissions, or essential supplies, such as food and 22 fuels, or otherwise threatens human life or public welfare. 23 5. An intrastate driver, except for a driver salesperson, is released from duty 24 each day, total hours on duty each day, and total time for the preceding seven 25 days recordkeeping requirements if: 26 (1) The driver operates within a one hundred fifty air mile radius of the 27 normal work reporting location, returns to the work reporting location, 28 and is released from work within twelve consecutive hours; 29 (2) The driver has eight consecutive hours off duty separating each twelve

hours on duty;

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1		(3)	The driver does not exceed the twelve hours maximum driving time
2			following eight consecutive hours off duty; and
3		(4)	The motor carrier maintains accurate and true records of the time the
4			driver reports for duty each day.
