BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 54-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Sale of property or service to state agencies by members of the legislative assembly. A member of the legislative assembly may not sell, in any one occurrence, property or service having a value in excess of two thousand dollars to a state agency unless the sale is made pursuant to an award or contract let after public notice and competitive bidding. This section does not apply to the publication of legal notices in newspapers as required by law or to service at a state institution of higher education as an instructor if the member meets the minimum education requirements established for instructors at the educational institution.

SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 54-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Honoraria prohibited - Acceptance of additional pay or gifts.

1. A member of the legislative assembly may not receive honoraria unless the honoraria is received for activities related to the member's outside employment and unrelated to the member's legislative position. This subsection does not prohibit a member of the legislative assembly from accepting reimbursement for transportation and actual expenses for out-of-state travel associated with legislative duties if the chairman of the legislative council gives prior approval for the travel.

Except for compensation provided by law, a member of the legislative assembly
may not knowingly accept compensation for performing legislative duties nor may a
member of the legislative assembly or the member's spouse solicit or accept
anything of value from a lobbyist.
