

**SENATE BILL NO. 2289**

1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 15-40.1-06 of the North Dakota  
2 Century Code, relating to the educational support per student.

3 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 2 of section 15-40.1-06 of the 1995  
5 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

- 6 2. a. The educational support per student during the first year of the ~~1995-97~~  
7 1997-99 biennium must be ~~one two thousand seven hundred fifty seven~~  
8 fifty-two dollars and for the second year of the 1997-99 biennium the  
9 educational support per student must be ~~one two thousand eight two hundred~~  
10 sixty-two forty-two dollars and is the basis for calculating grants-in-aid on a  
11 per student basis as provided in sections 15-40.1-07 and 15-40.1-08.
- 12 b. The educational support per student during the first year of the 1999-2001  
13 biennium must be two thousand four hundred forty-four dollars and for the  
14 second year of the 1999-2001 biennium the educational support per student  
15 must be two thousand six hundred forty-six dollars and is the basis for  
16 calculating grants-in-aid on a per student basis as provided in sections  
17 15-40.1-07 and 15-40.1-08.
- 18 c. The educational support per student during the first year of the 2001-03  
19 biennium must be two thousand eight hundred sixty-one dollars and for the  
20 second year of the 2001-03 biennium the educational support per student  
21 must be three thousand seventy-six dollars and is the basis for calculating  
22 grants-in-aid on a per student basis as provided in sections 15-40.1-07 and  
23 15-40.1-08.

1           d. School districts operating high schools not meeting the minimum curriculum  
2           as provided in section 15-41-24 or the teacher qualifications in section  
3           15-41-25 must be supported in the amount of two hundred twenty dollars,  
4           which is the basis for calculating grants-in-aid on a per student basis as  
5           provided in section 15-40.1-07.

6           ~~e.~~ e. School districts operating high schools that are not accredited pursuant to the  
7           accreditation standards adopted by the superintendent of public instruction on  
8           July 1, 1991, or that become unaccredited in any succeeding school year  
9           must be supported for the 1991-92 school year or for the first year that they  
10          become unaccredited in the amount of the educational support per student  
11          established in subdivision a, which is the basis for calculating grants-in-aid on  
12          a per student basis as provided in section 15-40.1-07, but those school  
13          districts are not entitled to the amounts resulting from applying the factors in  
14          that section. The amount of aid a school district is entitled to under this  
15          subsection for each high school that is not accredited must be reduced by two  
16          hundred dollars times the number of students in the school for the second  
17          school year that the high school is unaccredited, and an additional two  
18          hundred dollars per student in the unaccredited school for each additional  
19          year the school remains unaccredited. Any high school that becomes  
20          accredited is entitled to the per student payments provided for in section  
21          15-40.1-07 for the entire school year in which the school becomes accredited.

22          ~~e.~~ f. School districts operating elementary schools that are not accredited pursuant  
23          to the accreditation standards adopted by the superintendent of public  
24          instruction on July 1, 1992, or that become unaccredited in any succeeding  
25          school year must be supported for the 1992-93 school year or for the first year  
26          that they become unaccredited in the amount of the educational support per  
27          student established in subdivision a, which is the basis for calculating  
28          grants-in-aid on a per student basis as provided in section 15-40.1-08, except  
29          that the amount of aid that a school district is entitled to under this subsection  
30          for each elementary school that is unaccredited must be reduced by two  
31          hundred dollars times the number of students in the school each year that the

- 1 elementary school is unaccredited. Any elementary school that becomes
- 2 accredited is entitled to the per student payments provided for in section
- 3 15-40.1-08 for the entire school year in which the school becomes accredited.
