A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 61-16.1-42 and 61-21-31 of the North Dakota
 Century Code, relating to construction of drains across roads and railroads.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 61-16.1-42 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

6 61-16.1-42. Drains along and across public roads and railroads. Drains may be 7 laid along, within the limits of, or across any public road or highway, but not to the injury of such 8 the road. In instances where If it is necessary to run a drain across a highway, the department 9 of transportation, the board of county commissioners, or the board of township supervisors, as 10 the case may be, when notified by the water resource board to do so, shall make necessary 11 openings through the road or highway at its own expense, and shall build and keep in repair all 12 required culverts or bridges as provided under section 61-16.1-43. In instances where If drains 13 are laid along or within the rights of way of roads or highways, the drains shall must be 14 maintained and kept open by and at the expense of the water resource district concerned. A 15 drain may be laid along any railroad when necessary, but not to the injury of the railroad, and 16 when or railroad company. When it is necessary to run a new or modify an existing drain 17 across the railroad, the railroad company, when notified by the water resource board to do so, 18 shall make the necessary opening through such the railroad, and shall build the required bridges and culverts, and shall keep them in repair. The cost of construction or modification of 19 20 any required bridges or culverts must be borne by the district or board ordering the work and 21 may be apportioned and assessed as provided in this chapter to and upon lands or premises 22 benefited by the project in proportion to and in accordance with benefits accruing to the lands or 23 premises. If drains are laid along, across, or within the right of way of any railroad, the drain

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1 <u>must be maintained, repaired, and kept open by and at the expense of the board concerned,</u>

2 and the board may apportion and assess the costs as provided in this chapter.

3 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 61-21-31 of the North Dakota Century Code is
4 amended and reenacted as follows:

5 61-21-31. Drains along and across public roads and railroads. Drains may be laid 6 along, within the limits of, or across any public road or highway, but not to the injury of such the 7 road. In instances where If it shall be is necessary to run a drain across such the highway, the 8 department of transportation, the board of county commissioners, or the board of township 9 supervisors, as the case may be, when notified by the board to do so, shall make necessary 10 openings through such the road or highway at its own expense, and shall build and keep in 11 repair all suitable culverts or bridges at its own expense, as provided under the applicable 12 provisions of section 61-21-32. In instances where If drains are laid along or within the limits of 13 roads or highways, such the drains shall must be maintained and kept open by the board at the 14 expense of the drainage district concerned. A drain may be laid along any railroad when 15 necessary, but not to the injury of such road, and when the railroad or railroad company. When 16 it shall be is necessary to run a new or modify an existing drain across a railroad, the railroad 17 company, when notified by the board to do so, shall make the necessary opening through said 18 the road and shall build suitable bridges and culverts and keep them in repair. The cost of 19 construction or modification of any required bridges or culverts must be borne by the district or 20 board ordering the work and may be apportioned and assessed as provided in this chapter to 21 and upon lands or premises benefited by the project in proportion to and in accordance with 22 benefits accruing to the lands or premises. If drains are laid along, across, or within the rights 23 of way of any railroad, the drain must be maintained, repaired, and kept open by and at the 24 expense of the board concerned, and the board may apportion and assess the costs as 25 provided in this chapter.

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
