## FIRST ENGROSSMENT with Conference Committee Amendments ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2353

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 57-40.6 and a new
- 2 subsection to section 57-40.6-08 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a wireless 911
- 3 service fee, liability of telecommunications providers, and an emergency services
- 4 communication system advisory committee for 911; and to amend and reenact sections
- 5 57-40.6-01, 57-40.6-05, and 57-40.6-06 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to wireless
- 6 911 telephone service definitions.

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## 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 8 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 57-40.6-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is 9 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 57-40.6-01. **Definitions.** In this chapter, unless the context <del>or subject matter</del> otherwise requires:
  - "Emergency services communication system" means a statewide, countywide, or citywide radio system, land lines communication network, or emergency 911 telephone system, which provides rapid public access for coordinated dispatching of services, personnel, equipment, and facilities for law enforcement, fire, medical, or other emergency services.
  - "Telephone access line" means the principal <u>fixed land line</u> access to the telephone company's switched network including an outward dialed trunk or access register.
  - 3. "Wireless telephone service" means public telephone service provided for two-way voice or data communications which is transmitted independent of switched local exchange access telephone service and which may be transmitted, in part, by cable or wire as part of a larger telephone cable system. The term includes cellular telephone service and any resellers of the service, personal

1		communication service, and specialized mobile radio service. The term does not
2		include any service that cannot connect a person to an established public safety
3		answering point under the 911 system by dialing the digits 9-1-1.
4	<u>4.</u>	"911 service carrier" means any provider of wireless telephone service.
5	SEC	<b>TION 2.</b> A new section to chapter 57-40.6 of the North Dakota Century Code is
6	created and enacted as follows:	
7	<u>Eme</u>	rgency system - Wireless 911 service fee. A subscriber shall pay a wireless 911
8	service fee of forty cents per month, per access line, to the 911 service carrier. The 911	
9	service carri	er shall add the wireless 911 service fee to all bills for wireless telephone service to
10	subscribers in this state. The 911 service carrier shall collect the wireless 911 service fee,	
11	retain twelve	and one-half percent of fees collected, and remit the remaining proceeds on a
12	monthly bas	is to the county treasurer of the county in which is located the billing address of the
13	subscriber from whom the fee was collected. In a county in which state radio communications	
14	is the 911 se	ervice provider, the county treasurer shall transfer one-half of fees received under
15	this section t	o state radio communications for deposit in the state radio communications 911
16	provider equ	ipment account. In a county in which state radio communications is not the 911
17	service prov	ider, the county treasurer shall retain all fees received under this section.
18	SEC	<b>TION 3. AMENDMENT.</b> Section 57-40.6-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
19	amended an	d reenacted as follows:
20	57-4	<b>0.6-05. Restriction on use of tax or service fee proceeds.</b> The county may not
21	use the proc	eeds of the tax imposed under section 57-40.6-02 or the 911 service fee imposed
22	under sectio	n 2 of this Act for any purpose other than establishing or operating the emergency
23	services con	nmunication system.
24	SEC	<b>TION 4. AMENDMENT.</b> Section 57-40.6-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is
25	amended an	d reenacted as follows:
26	57-4	<b>0.6-06. Data base.</b> In 911 systems that have been approved by the state
27	emergency e	service services communication system advisory committee, any
28	telecommun	ications company or 911 service carrier providing emergency 911 service shall
29	provide, on a	an annual basis, current customer names, addresses, and telephone numbers to
30	each public	service answering point within each 911 system and shall update the information
31	according to	a schedule prescribed by the state 911 advisory committee's standards and

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guidelines. Information provided under this section must be provided in accordance with the transactional record disclosure requirements of the federal Electronics Communications Privacy Act of 1986, 18 U.S.C. 2703 (C)(1)(B)(iv).

**SECTION 5.** A new subsection to section 57-40.6-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

A local exchange provider, emergency service provider, or 911 service carrier, or employee or agent of these providers or carriers, is not liable to any person for any infringement or invasion of the right of privacy of any person caused or claimed to have been caused, directly or indirectly, by the installation, operation, failure to operate, maintenance, removal, presence, condition, occasion, or use of an emergency service feature, automatic number identification service, or automatic location identification service, and the equipment associated with these services, or by any service furnished by any provider in connection with these services, including the identification of the telephone number, address or name associated with the telephone used by the party accessing 911 service, and automatic number identification service or automatic location identification service, and which arises out of the negligence or other wrongful act of the provider, the customer, the governing body, service users, agencies, or municipalities, or their employees or agents. A provider or its employees and agents are not liable for any damages in a claim for relief for injuries, death, or loss to person or property incurred as a result of any act or omission of the provider, employee, or agent, in connection with developing, adopting, implementing, maintaining, enhancing, or operating an emergency telephone service, except for damages or injury intentionally caused by or resulting from gross negligence of the provider or person.

**SECTION 6.** A new section to chapter 57-40.6 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

<u>Emergency services communication system advisory committee - Standards and guidelines - Report.</u>

 The governor shall appoint a nine-member emergency services communication system advisory committee for 911. The governor shall include on the advisory committee one representative from the North Dakota league of cities, one

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representative from the North Dakota association of counties, one representative
from the North Dakota peace officers association, one representative from the
North Dakota firefighters association, one representative from the North Dakota
wireless telephone service industry, one representative from the North Dakota
emergency medical service association, one representative from the North Dakota
telephone association, one representative of counties with public safety answering
points, and one representative of counties served by state radio 911. Members'
terms are for three years, subject to reappointment, beginning with staggered
terms as determined by the governor. The entity represented is responsible for the
expenses of the member representing that entity. The advisory committee shall
name a chairman and vice chairman from its membership.

- 2. The advisory committee shall study the feasibility of implementing an automatic number identification and automated location identification system. The study must include the estimated cost of the system and a proposed funding plan.
- 3. The committee shall submit a report of its work to the budget section of the legislative council by August 1998.
