## SENATE BILL NO. 2394

1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 43-25-03, 43-25-05, 43-25-07, 43-25-08,

2 43-25-09, 43-25-10, 43-25-11, 43-25-12, 43-25-13, and 43-25-18 of the North Dakota Century

3 Code, relating to North Dakota board of massage and massage therapist licensure; and to

4 repeal section 43-25-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to massage.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-25-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8	43-25-03. Massage therapists to be registered licensed. It is unlawful for any <u>A</u>
9	person <del>or persons to engage</del> <u>may not:</u>

10 Engage in the practice or attempt to practice massage for a fee, or for a gratuity or 1. 11 to conduct or teach massage without a certificate of registration license issued 12 pursuant to the provisions of under this chapter-

13 It is unlawful for any person or persons to operate;

- 14 <u>2.</u> Operate or conduct any a massage establishment which does not conform to
- 15 unless it meets the sanitary regulations herein contained, or which may be
- 16 requirements of this chapter and any regulations adopted by the board, or to 17 employ any person as an operator who does not hold a certificate of registration. 18

It is unlawful for any person or persons to practice;

- Employ an unlicensed person to work as a massage therapist; or 19 3.
- 20 4. Practice any branch of massage as defined in subsection 3 of section 43-25-02, 21 whether for payment or free demonstration, without first being a registered 22 licensed massage therapist under the provisions of this chapter, or without 23 operating and maintaining a bona fide massage establishment, and without first
- 24 paying a registration license fee to the board.

1	SEC	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-25-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is									
2	amended and reenacted as follows:										
3	43-2	43-25-05. Board of massage - Terms. The governor shall appoint the North Dakota

5	Dakota mas	Dakota massage therapy association licensed in this state. The members must be appointed									
6	for three years, staggered so that the term of one member expires each year, and each										
7	member shall hold office until that member's successor is appointed and qualified.										
8	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-25-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is										
9	amended and reenacted as follows:										
10	43-25-07. Requisites for application and examination - Subjects - Minimum										
11	passing grade - Fee for reexamination.										
12	<u>1.</u>	Any person who is eighteen years of age or more, a high school graduate, a bona									
13		fide resident of the this state of North Dakota for at least one month immediately									
14		preceding the application to take the examination, and of good moral character and									
15		temperate habits is entitled to apply to the secretary-treasurer of the board. The									
16		person An applicant is entitled to be issued a certificate of registration as a									
17		massage therapist licensure if the person applicant:									
18	<del>1.</del>	<u>a.</u> Presents a diploma or credentials issued by a school of massage approved by									
19		the American massage therapy association or shows that the applicant is an									
20		active member of the American massage therapy association.									
21	<del>2.</del>	b. Passes a reasonable demonstrative, oral, and written examination conducted									
22		by the board in the art of body massage by hand or with any mechanical or									
23		vibratory apparatus for the purpose of body massaging, reducing or									
24		contouring, the use of oil rubs, salt glow, hot and cold packs, tub, shower,									
25		heat lamps, and similar baths.									
26	<del>3.</del>	c. Pays the required fees required, which. These fees must accompany the									
27		application to the secretary-treasurer of the board.									
28	<u>2.</u>	An applicant must achieve a general average score in the examination of									
29		seventy-five percent in all subjects involved and no score of less than fifty percent									
30	in any one subject. Any applicant failing to pass the requirements is entitled to a										
31	reexamination within six months upon payment of an additional fee of fifty dollars										

1 or a lesser amount established by the board, but two reexaminations exhaust the 2 privilege under the original application.

3 Conviction of an offense does not disgualify a person from registration licensure 3. 4 under this chapter unless the board determines that the offense has a direct 5 bearing upon a person's ability to serve the public as a massage therapist or that 6 the person is not sufficiently rehabilitated under section 12.1-33-02.1.

7 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 43-25-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is 8 amended and reenacted as follows:

9 43-25-08. Fee for certificate of registration license. The fee to be paid by an 10 applicant to determine fitness to receive a certificate of registration license is one hundred fifty 11 dollars or a lesser amount established by the board.

12 **SECTION 5. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-25-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is 13 amended and reenacted as follows:

14 43-25-09. Certificate of registration - Recording - Displaying conspicuously 15 License - Display - Renewal - Renewal fee. Each certificate of registration license must be 16 conspicuously displayed at the place of practice and must be recorded in the office of the clerk 17 of the district court in any county where the registered licensed massage therapist practices 18 within thirty days after issuance. On or before January first of each year, each registered 19 licensed massage therapist shall pay to the secretary-treasurer of the board a renewal fee of 20 one hundred dollars or a lesser amount established by the board. Attendance at postgraduate 21 work of at least eighteen continuing education units a year as prescribed by the board is a 22 further requirement for renewal of the certificate license. If the board reasonably believes a 23 massage therapist is in such a physical condition as to jeopardize jeopardizing the health of 24 those who seek relief from the massage therapist, the board may require the applicant to have 25 a physical examination by a competent medical examiner. If the applicant has had or has any 26 communicable disease sufficient to disqualify the applicant to practice massage in the state, the 27 board shall deny a certificate license until the applicant furnishes due proof of being physically 28 and mentally competent and sound. A holder of an expired certificate of registration license 29 may within one year from the date of its expiration have the certificate license renewed upon 30 payment of the required renewal fee and production of a new certificate of physical 31 examination. All certificate holders licenseholders must be designated as certified licensed

1 massage therapists and may not use any title or abbreviation without the designation "massage

2 therapist".

8. 2. Any registrant licensee who does not renew his or her registration a massage
 therapist license for two consecutive years because of sickness or other reason, or
 because of absence from the state of North Dakota, must take the examination as
 prescribed for an applicant to become a registered operator and to comply with all
 the provisions hereof, of this chapter applicable to any applicant to become a
 registrant licensee.

Charges may be preferred by any person, or the board may on its own motion
 direct the executive officer of said the board to prefer said any charges. Any
 accusation may be filed with the secretary-treasurer of the board charging any
 registered licensed massage therapist with any of the offenses herein enumerated
 in this section. Such accusation shall be in writing, An accusation must be signed
 by the accuser and verified under oath.

SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 43-25-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

## 43-25-11. Provisions for hearing - Notice.

16 Whenever such accusations as provided in under section 43-25-10 are filed, the 1. 17 board shall set a day for hearing and the secretary-treasurer of the board shall 18 transmit to the accused a true copy of any and all charges filed with him relating to 19 such the accusations, and shall notify in writing the accused that on the day fixed 20 for the hearing, which shall may not be less than ten days from the date of such 21 notice, he the accused may appear or show cause if any, why his or her certificate 22 and the accused's license to practice massage in the this state of North Dakota 23 should not be revoked, suspended, or annulled. For the purpose of such this type 24 of hearing, the board may require by subpoena the attendance of witnesses, to 25 administer oaths and hear testimony and receive evidence, either oral or 26 documentary, for and against the accused, and said the accused shall have has 27 the right at said the hearing to cross-examine the witnesses, to produce witnesses 28 in his defense witnesses, and to appear personally or by counsel. The notice 29 provided for in this section shall must be substantially in the following form:

months from the date of conviction, the board may in the exercise of its reasonable discretion
by a majority vote, issue a new certificate license to the person affected, restoring or conferring
all rights and privileges of and pertaining to the practice of massage, but the fee must be the
same as upon issuance of the original certificate license.

5 SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 43-25-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is
6 amended and reenacted as follows:

7 **43-25-13.** Records to be kept by the secretary-treasurer of the board. The 8 secretary-treasurer of the board shall keep a record book of the names of all persons to whom 9 certificates licenses have been granted under this chapter, the certificate license number of 10 each, the date of granting each certificate license and renewal, and other matters of record. 11 Any official entry or a certificate of the absence of information, certified under the hand of the 12 secretary-treasurer and the seal of the board, must be admitted as evidence in any of the courts 13 of the this state of North Dakota. The original books, records, and papers of the board must be 14 kept at the office of the secretary-treasurer. The secretary-treasurer shall furnish to any person 15 a copy of any such record, certified by the secretary-treasurer, upon payment of a fee of ten dollars plus twenty-five cents per page copied, the fee to belong to the secretary-treasurer. The 16 17 secretary-treasurer shall prepare and submit to the governor and to the North Dakota American 18 massage therapy association North Dakota chapter a biennial report detailing income and 19 expenses and a list of massage therapists certified licensed.

SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 43-25-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

22 **43-25-18.** Reciprocity. Any person who has been duly licensed in another state to 23 practice massage which in a state that has and maintains a standard of practice, which is 24 substantially the same as that maintained in this state, and who has been lawfully and 25 continuously engaged in such this practice for two years or more immediately before filing his 26 or her of an application to practice in this state, and who shall submit submits to the board a 27 duly attested certificate from the examining board of the state in which he or she is registered, 28 certifying to the fact of his or her registration and being a person of good moral character and of 29 professional attainments, may upon paying a fee of thirty-five dollars be granted a certificate 30 license to practice in this state without being required to take an examination; provided, 31 however, that no certificate license may be issued to any applicant unless the state or territory

- 1 from which the certificate is granted extends a like privilege to engage in the practice of
- 2 massage as defined in this chapter within its borders to persons registered licensed under the
- 3 provisions of this chapter, to practice in this state removing to such upon practicing in that other
- 4 state. The board has the power to may enter into reciprocal relations with other states whose
- 5 requirements are substantially the same as those herein provided in this chapter.
- 6 SECTION 11. REPEAL. Section 43-25-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 7 repealed.
