ENGROSSED SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 4026

1 A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the feasibility and desirability

2 of establishing a statewide domestic violence task force to address domestic violence

3 prevention issues and adopt a statewide domestic violence prevention strategy.

4 **WHEREAS**, the problem of domestic violence continues to escalate in this state; and

5 **WHEREAS**, domestic violence is a pervasive problem that often devastates its victims

6 physically, emotionally, spiritually, and financially; and

7 WHEREAS, the North Dakota Supreme Court has urged a unified effort be made at all

8 levels, including local and state, public and private, executive, legislative, and judicial, to

9 implement the state strategy to attack and resolve the domestic violence problem in the state;

10 and

WHEREAS, there currently exists a Governor's task force that deals exclusively with the
expenditure of federal Violence Against Women Act funds but does not address prevention
strategies;

14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA,

15 THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

16 That the Legislative Council study the feasibility and desirability of establishing a 17 statewide domestic violence task force to address domestic violence prevention issues and 18 adopt a statewide domestic violence prevention strategy; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in conducting the study, the Legislative Council
investigate the availability of federal funds to assist in funding the study and seek the
involvement of the North Dakota Supreme Court, the Governor, the Attorney General, and the
North Dakota Council on Abused Women's Services; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislative Council report its findings and
 recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to
 the Fifty-sixth Legislative Assembly.
