1	A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the current standards for the
2	accreditation of elementary and secondary schools in this state, the method by which
3	accreditation standards are adopted, the fiscal impact of accreditation standards, and the
4	feasibility and desirability of waiving standards if student performance levels exceed a
5	designated score.
6	WHEREAS, the current standards for the accreditation of elementary and secondary
7	schools in this state were issued by the Superintendent of Public Instruction in 1991; and
8	WHEREAS, in order to comply with certain provisions of the current standards for the
9	accreditation of elementary and secondary schools in this state, school boards are often faced
10	with having to expend funds that could be put to greater benefit for other purposes; and
11	WHEREAS, the expenditure requirements directly or indirectly imposed by certain
12	provisions of the current state standards for the accreditation of elementary and secondary
13	schools prevent school boards from setting priorities and accomplishing the goals deemed
14	important to their school districts; and
15	WHEREAS, the current state standards for the accreditation of elementary and
16	secondary schools do not include any mechanisms for measuring the effect of the standards on
17	academic achievement or performance; and
18	WHEREAS, the current state standards for the accreditation of elementary and
19	secondary schools have not been revised since 1991;
20	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES
21	OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:
22	That the Legislative Council study the current standards for the accreditation of
23	elementary and secondary schools in this state, the method by which accreditation standards
24	are adopted, the fiscal impact of accreditation standards, and the feasibility and desirability of
25	waiving standards if student performance levels exceed a designated score; and

- 2 recommendations, together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to
- 3 the Fifty-sixth Legislative Assembly.
