1 A BILL for an Act to make an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state game and

2 fish department.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the 5 funds as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the game and fish 6 fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from 7 federal funds and other income, to the state game and fish department for the purpose of 8 defraying the expenses of the various divisions of the department, for the biennium beginning 9 July 1, 1997, and ending June 30, 1999, as follows: 10 Salaries and wages \$11,292,661 11 **Operating expenses** 7,302,181 12 Equipment 638,150 13 Capital improvements 898,122 14 Grants 2,548,400 15 200,000 Noxious weed control 16 Land habitat and deer depredation 1,200,000 17 Wildlife habitat 650,000 18 400,000 Small and big game restoration trust 19 Grants, gifts, and donations 100,000 20 Nongame wildlife 120,000 21 Lonetree reservoir 966,654 22 Total special funds appropriation \$26,316,168

23 SECTION 2. HABITAT RESTORATION. The amount of \$650,000, or such lesser
 24 amount as may be available, for the line item entitled wildlife habitat in section 1 of this Act, is

from the habitat restoration stamp program fund, to lease privately owned lands for wildlife
 habitat to reestablish wildlife population for the biennium beginning July 1, 1997, and ending
 June 30, 1999. These funds may be spent only for the purposes and using guidelines
 contained in section 20.1-03-12.1.
 SECTION 3. LAND HABITAT AND DEER DEPREDATION. The amount of

\$1,000,000, or such lesser amount as may be available, for the line item entitled land habitat
and deer depredation in section 1 of this Act, is from the private land habitat improvement fund
to improve wildlife habitat on private land and alleviate depredation as provided in section
20.1-02-05 for the biennium beginning July 1, 1997, and ending June 30, 1999.

10 SECTION 4. NONGAME WILDLIFE. The amount of \$45,000, or such lesser amount 11 as may be available, for the line item entitled nongame wildlife in section 1 of this Act, is from 12 the nongame wildlife fund for the purpose of preservation, inventory, perpetuation, and 13 conservation of nongame wildlife, natural areas, and nature preserves in this state for the 14 biennium beginning July 1, 1997, and ending June 30, 1999.

SECTION 5. SMALL AND BIG GAME RESTORATION FUND. The amount of
\$400,000, or such lesser amount as may be available, for the line item entitled small and big
game restoration trust in section 1 of this Act, is from the small and big game restoration trust
fund to improve wildlife habitat on private land for the biennium beginning July 1, 1997, and
ending June 30, 1999.
