- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide for the continuation of an agricultural pesticide and pesticide
- 2 container disposal program; and to provide an expiration date.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 SECTION 1. Pesticide and pesticide container disposal program - Pesticide

5 container management - Compensation.

- 6 1. The definitions contained in section 4-35-05 apply to this section.
- 7 2. In consultation with an advisory board consisting of the state health officer, state 8 engineer, state geologist, director of the North Dakota state university extension 9 service, administrative officer of the state soil conservation committee, two 10 individuals representing agribusiness organizations, two individuals representing 11 farm organizations, and one member of the legislative assembly, all of whom must 12 be selected by the commissioner of agriculture, the commissioner of agriculture 13 shall continue to implement the project authorized by section 1 of chapter 72 of the 14 1995 Session Laws, which is known as project safe send. The purpose of the 15 project is to:
- 16a.Collect and either recycle or dispose of unusable pesticides and empty17pesticide containers. The commissioner shall provide for the establishment18and operation of temporary collection sites for the containers and pesticides.19The commissioner may limit the type and quantity of containers and20pesticides acceptable for collection.
- b. Promote proper pesticide container management. In consultation with the
 director of the North Dakota state university extension service, the
 commissioner shall promote proper methods of pesticide container

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1		management, including information on the variety of pesticide containers
2		available.
3		c. Evaluate recycling options and investigate markets and business
4		opportunities to encourage recycling of containers for resource recovery.
5	3.	Any entity collecting pesticide containers or unusable pesticides shall manage and
6		dispose of the containers and pesticides in compliance with applicable federal and
7		state requirements. When called upon, any state agency shall assist the
8		commissioner in implementing the project.
9	4.	For services rendered in connection with the design and implementation of this
10		project, the member of the legislative assembly who is a member of the advisory
11		board is entitled to compensation and expense reimbursement in the amounts
12		provided for in section 54-35-10 and the other members selected by the
13		commissioner of agriculture are entitled to reimbursement for mileage and travel
14		expenses in the same manner and for the same amounts provided for state
15		employees and officials. Compensation and expense reimbursement must be paid
16		from the environment and rangeland protection fund.
17	SEC	TION 2. Project scope and evaluation - Proposed legislation. The project
18	described ir	section 1 of this Act must occur in areas to be determined by the commissioner of
19	agriculture i	n consultation with the advisory board under subsection 2 of section 1 of this Act.
20	Before Dec	ember 12, 1998, the commissioner of agriculture shall determine whether the project
21	implemente	d and continued under section 1 of this Act should be continued. If the
22	commissior	er determines that the project should be continued or expanded, the commissioner
23	shall introdu	ice appropriate legislation in the fifty-sixth legislative assembly.
24	SEC	TION 3. EXPIRATION DATE. This Act is effective through July 31, 1999, and
25	after that da	te is ineffective.
