## HOUSE BILL NO. 1157

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 16.1-11.1 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to special statewide elections being conducted by mail and
- 3 agents receiving mail ballots on behalf of electors; and to amend and reenact sections
- 4 16.1-11.1-01, 16.1-11.1-02, 16.1-11.1-04, and 16.1-11.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 5 relating to mail ballot elections for general and special elections and mail ballot procedures.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 7 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 16.1-11.1-01 of the 1995 Supplement to the
- 8 North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 9 16.1-11.1-01. Counties may conduct mail ballot elections Polling places -
- 10 **Records.** The board of county commissioners of a county may conduct a primary election,
- 11 general, and special elections by mail ballot. The mail ballot election must include city elections
- 12 administered by the county auditor, and may include any other election administered by the
- 13 county auditor pursuant to an agreement with the governing body of a political subdivision
- 14 within the county. The board shall designate at least one polling place in the county to be open
- on the day of the election for voting in the usual manner. The county auditor shall place a
- 16 notice at all polling places in the county used at the last statewide election which states the
- 17 location of the polling places open for the primary election. The county auditor shall keep a
- 18 record of each mail ballot provided to and returned by qualified electors and provide to the
- 19 election board at each polling place open on the day of the election a list of every person who
- 20 applied for and returned a mail ballot.
- 21 **SECTION 2.** A new section to chapter 16.1-11.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 22 created and enacted as follows:
- 23 Special statewide elections may be conducted by mail. Special statewide elections
- 24 called by the governor according to this title may be conducted pursuant to the mail ballot

| 1  | election procedures established by this chapter. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the        |

| 2  | secretary of state may adopt rules relating to special statewide elections called by the governor       |
| 3  | according to this title, including rules providing for the reduction of poll workers, reduction of poll |
| 4  | hours, reduction of precincts, arrangement of names of candidates on the official ballot,               |
| 5  | publication of the sample ballot, and open voting within cities or counties.                            |
| 6  | SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-11.1-02 of the 1995 Supplement to the                                |
| 7  | North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:  |
| 8  | 16.1-11.1-02. Application for mail ballots. The county auditor shall mail an                            |
| 9  | application form for a mail ballot to each person listed in the pollbooks of the county from the        |
| 10 | last regular statewide election on one date no sooner than the forty-fifth fortieth day before the      |
| 11 | election and no later than the thirtieth day before the election. The county auditor, for two           |
| 12 | consecutive weeks after the date on which the mail ballot applications are mailed, shall publish        |
| 13 | in the official newspaper of the county an application form for a mail ballot and a notice that         |
| 14 | additional mail ballot applications may be obtained from the election official. The application         |
| 15 | form for a mail ballot must be in substantially the following form:                                     |
| 16 | I,, am or will be a duly qualified elector  |
| 17 | (please print name)   |
| 18 | and to my best knowledge and belief and am or will be entitled to vote at the primary                   |
| 19 | election. I hereby apply for an official mail ballot to be voted by me at that election. I              |
| 20 | understand that it is a criminal offense to knowingly vote when not qualified to do so.                 |

| 5  | SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-11.1-04 of the 1995 Supplement to the                            |
| 6  | North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:                                      |
| 7  | 16.1-11.1-04. Voting by electors. Upon receipt of a mail ballot, an elector shall mark              |
| 8  | it, sign the return identification envelope, and comply with the instructions provided with the     |
| 9  | ballot. The elector may return the completed ballot to the county auditor by mail or, before six    |
| 10 | p.m. on the day of the election, to any other place of deposit designated by the auditor. If the    |
| 11 | elector returns the ballot by mail, the elector shall provide the postage, and the ballot must be   |
| 12 | postmarked no later than the day before the election. An elector who is recorded as returning a     |
| 13 | mail ballot may not be allowed to vote in person on the day of the election. An elector who is      |
| 14 | recorded as receiving but not returning a mail ballot may vote in person on the day of the          |
| 15 | election but only after signing a sworn statement that the elector has not voted in the election by |
| 16 | mail.   |
| 17 | SECTION 5. A new section to chapter 16.1-11.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is                   |
| 8  | created and enacted as follows:   |
| 19 | <u>Delivering ballots - Authorization of agents to receive ballots.</u> The county auditor          |
| 20 | shall personally deliver the ballot to each applicant or applicant's agent who returns a properly   |
| 21 | completed application form to the auditor by four p.m. on the day before the election. A person     |
| 22 | acting as an agent may not, at the time, be a candidate for any office to be voted upon by the      |
| 23 | applicant. The agent shall sign the agent's name before receiving the ballot and deposit with       |
| 24 | the auditor authorization in writing from the applicant to receive the ballot or according to       |
| 25 | requirements set forth for signature mark. A person may not receive compensation, including         |
| 26 | money, goods, or services, for acting as an agent for an applicant, nor may a person act as an      |
| 27 | agent for more than four applicants in any one election.  |
| 28 | SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 16.1-11.1-06 of the 1995 Supplement to the                            |
| 29 | North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:                                      |
| 30 | 16.1-11.1-06. Canvass of votes - Special election board. The county auditor shall                   |
| 31 | appoint a special election board for the purpose of counting mail ballots. The board may not        |

- 1 begin counting the ballots until six p.m. cast prior to the day of the election at the same hour the
- 2 <u>polls open</u> on the day of the election. <u>The county auditor shall adopt procedures to ensure that</u>
- 3 election results are not publicly disclosed until after all the polls close in the county on the day
- 4 of the election. A county conducting a mail ballot election constitutes one voting area, and
- 5 ballots need not be sorted according to precinct or ward unless necessary for the administration
- 6 of the election.
