4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 7 of section 38-12-01 of the North Dakota
6 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

7 7. "Subsurface minerals" means and includes all naturally occurring elements, and 8 their compounds, volcanic ash, precious metals, carbonates, and natural mineral 9 salts of boron, bromine, calcium, fluorine, helium, iodine, lithium, magnesium, 10 nitrogen, phosphorus, potassium, sodium, thorium, uranium, and sulfur, and their 11 compounds, but does not include sand and gravel and rocks crushed for sand and 12 gravel. 13 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 10 of section 38-15-02 of the 1995 14 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows: 15 10. "Subsurface minerals" means all naturally occurring elements and their 16 compounds, volcanic ash, precious metals, carbonates, and natural mineral salts 17 of boron, bromine, calcium, fluorine, helium, iodine, lithium, magnesium, nitrogen, 18 phosphorus, potassium, sodium, thorium, uranium, and sulfur, and their compounds, occurring more than five hundred feet [152.4 meters] below the 19 20 surface of the land, but does not include sand and gravel and rocks crushed for 21 sand and gravel.
