## SENATE BILL NO. 2113

Introduced by

(At the request of the Board of Psychologist Examiners)

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact six new sections to chapter 43-32 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to powers of the board of psychologist examiners, investigations,
- 3 licensure renewal, disciplinary hearings and civil penalties for unauthorized practice of
- 4 psychology; to amend and reenact sections 43-32-01, 43-32-02, 43-32-03, 43-32-05,

5 43-32-08.1, 43-32-13, 43-32-14, 43-32-16, 43-32-19, 43-32-20, 43-32-21, 43-32-27, 43-32-29,

6 and 43-32-30 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the board of psychologist

7 examiners, licensure and regulation of psychologists, continuing education, and client records;

8 and to repeal sections 43-32-18 and 43-32-28 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to

9 licensing of psychologists without examination and disciplinary hearings.

## 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
   amended and reenacted as follows:
- 13 **43-32-01. Definitions.**

14 1. "Board" means the North Dakota state board of psychologist examiners.

15 2. "Practice of psychology" means the observation, description, evaluation,

16 interpretation, and or modification of human behavior by the application of 17 psychological principles, methods, and procedures for the purpose of preventing or 18 eliminating symptomatic, maladaptive, or undesired behavior and of enhancing 19 interpersonal relationships, work and life adjustment, personal effectiveness, 20 behavioral health, and mental health. The term includes psychological testing and 21 the evaluation or assessment of personal characteristics, such as intelligence, 22 personality, abilities, interests, aptitudes, and neuropsychological functioning; 23 counseling, psychotherapy, and other therapeutic techniques based on

24 psychological principles; diagnosis and treatment of mental and emotional disorder

1		or disability, compulsive disorders, disorders of habit or conduct as well as of the
2		psychological aspects of physical illness, accident, injury, or disability; and
3		psychoeducational evaluation, therapy, remediation, and consultation. The term
4		includes the rendering of psychological services to individuals, families, groups,
5		and the public and is without regard to whether payment is received for services
6		rendered.
7	3.	"Psychologist" means an individual who is licensed under this chapter in the
8		practice of psychology.
9	4.	"Psychology resident" means an individual who has received from an accredited
10		school or college a doctorate, with a program of study substantially psychological
11		in nature, who is involved in supervised psychological employment.
12	<u>5.</u>	"School or college" means any university or other institution of higher learning that
13		is accredited by a regional accrediting association, offering a full-time graduate
14		course of study in psychology.
15	SE	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
16	amended a	ind reenacted as follows:
17	43-	32-02. State board of psychologist examiners - How appointed -
18	Qualificati	ons. The governor shall appoint a state board of psychologist examiners consisting
19	of five mem	nbers, each of whom must have the following qualifications:
20	1.	Be a resident of this state.
21	2.	After the first five appointments, must be $\underline{Be}$ a licensed psychologist under this
22		chapter.
23	3.	Has, at least five years prior to appointment, received a doctorate degree in
24		psychology from a school or college as defined in this chapter.
25	4.	Has been actively engaged in the practice of teaching or research of psychology
26		for a period of at least five years.
27	5.	As to at least one member, is currently engaged primarily in rendering service in
28		psychology and as to at least one member, is engaged primarily in teaching,
29		training, or research in psychology.
30	SE	CTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is
31	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:

1 43-32-03. Tenure of members - Vacancies and oath of office. After the first five 2 appointments, the The term of office of each member of the board must be is three years and 3 until his a successor is appointed and gualified. The terms of the first members of the board 4 expire as follows: one member, June 30, 1968; two members June 30, 1969; and two 5 members June 30, 1970. The governor shall fill all vacancies by appointment but in case of a 6 vacancy before the expiration of a term, the appointment must be for the residue of the term 7 only. A person appointed to the board shall qualify qualifies by taking the oath required of civil 8 officers.

9 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
10 amended and reenacted as follows:

11 43-32-05. Compensation of members - Expenses of board and members thereof. 12 Each member of the board shall serve serves without compensation, but he shall is entitled to 13 receive such mileage and travel expenses while engaged in the performance of the board 14 duties of his office as is provided in section 54-06-09. The secretary of the board shall is 15 entitled to receive such salary or other compensation, and such allowance for clerical and other 16 expenses of the board, as the board shall determine determines. 17 SECTION 5. A new section to chapter 43-32 of the North Dakota Century Code is 18 created and enacted as follows:

Authority to appoint or employ. The board may appoint or employ persons to assist
the board in carrying out its duties under this chapter.

21 **SECTION 6. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-08.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 22 amended and reenacted as follows:

43-32-08.1. Continuing education requirements. The board shall adopt rules
 establishing requirements for the continuing education of psychologists. <u>The board may refuse</u>

25 to renew, suspend, revoke, or place on probationary status any license issued under this

26 chapter on proof that the licensee has failed to meet applicable continuing education

27 requirements. Applicants for accreditation of continuing education courses, classes, or

28 activities may be charged a reasonable fee determined by the board.

SECTION 7. A new section to chapter 43-32 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 created and enacted as follows:

31 <u>Complaints - Investigations.</u>

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1	<u>1.</u>	A person aggrieved by the actions of a psychologist licensed under this chapter
2		may file a written complaint with the board citing the specific allegations of
3		misconduct by the psychologist. The board shall notify the psychologist of the
4		complaint and request a written response from the psychologist.
5	<u>2.</u>	The board may investigate a complaint on its own motion, without requiring the
6		identity of the complainant to be made a matter of public record, if the board
7		concludes that good cause exists for preserving the confidentiality of the
8		complainant.
9	<u>3.</u>	A psychologist who is the subject of an investigation by the board shall cooperate
10		fully with the investigation. Cooperation includes responding fully and promptly to
11		any reasonable question raised by or on behalf of the board relating to the subject
12		of the investigation, and providing copies of patient records when reasonably
13		requested by the board and accompanied by the appropriate release.
14	<u>4.</u>	In order to pursue the investigation, the board has the power to subpoena and
15		examine witnesses and records, including patient records, and to copy,
16		photograph, or take samples. It may require the licensed psychologist to give
17		statements under oath, to submit to a physical or psychological examination, or
18		both, by a physician or physicians or other qualified evaluation professionals
19		selected by the board if it appears to be in the best interest of the public that this
20		evaluation be secured. The patient records that are released to the board are not
21		public records.
22	<u>5.</u>	Unless there is a patient release on file allowing the release of information at the
23		public hearing, patient records acquired by the board in its investigation are
24		confidential and closed to the public. All board meetings wherein patient testimony
25		or records are taken or reviewed are confidential and closed to the public. If no
26		patient testimony or records are taken or reviewed, the remainder of the meeting is
27		an open meeting unless a specific exemption is otherwise applicable.
28	SE	CTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is
29	amended a	ind reenacted as follows:
30	43-:	32-13. Annual license and fee. On or before January first of each year, every
31	licensed ps	ychologist in the state shall pay to the secretary of the board an annual license fee

to be determined by regulation <u>rule</u> of the board not to exceed one hundred dollars. The
secretary of the board, upon payment of the annual license fee by a person licensed under this
chapter, shall issue a certificate of annual license. No <u>A</u> person may <u>not</u> hold himself <u>oneself</u>
out as a licensed psychologist until the annual license fee has been paid. The violation of this
section is cause for revocation of his <u>a</u> license <u>issued</u> by the board. The board shall annually
mail a renewal notice to all licensed psychologists <u>at the address currently on file with the</u>
<u>board</u>.

8 **SECTION 9. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is 9 amended and reenacted as follows:

10 43-32-14. Payment of delinguent license fees - Reinstatement. Any person who 11 has been a licensed psychologist in this state under the provisions of this chapter, and who has 12 had his the license revoked because of his the failure to pay the annual license fee, must be 13 reinstated and his the license renewed by his paying if within one year from the date of 14 revocation the person pays to the secretary of the board the amount of the annual license fees 15 in which he is then in default and a late fee to be determined by rule of the board. 16 **SECTION 10.** A new section to chapter 43-32 of the North Dakota Century Code is 17 created and enacted as follows:

18 Continuing education requirements - Renewal. Absent a showing of good cause, 19 the board may not renew a license issued under this chapter absent proof that the continuing 20 education requirements established by rule of the board have been met. A person whose 21 license is not renewed because of failure to meet the continuing education requirements must 22 be reinstated and the license renewed if, within one year from the date of nonrenewal, the 23 person demonstrates to the secretary of the board, the continuing education requirements have 24 been satisfied and pays the renewal fee and a late fee to be determined by rule of the board. 25 SECTION 11. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-16 of the North Dakota Century Code is 26 amended and reenacted as follows:

   licensing which must show:
- 30 a. The name, age, and residence of each applicant.

9		Pos	stdoctoral supervised psychological employment.
10		<u>1.</u>	Supervision may only be performed by a licensed psychologist with a competency
11			in supervision in professional psychology in the area of practice being supervised.
12		<u>2.</u>	Supervision of an applicant for licensure as a licensed psychologist must include at
13			least two hours of regularly scheduled direct supervision a week for full-time
14			employment, one hour of which must be with the supervisor on a one-to-one basis.
15			The remaining hour may be with other mental health professionals designated by
16			the supervisor. The board may approve an exception to the weekly supervision
17			requirement for a week when the supervisor was ill or otherwise unable to provide
18			supervision. The board may prorate the two hours per week of supervision for
19			persons preparing for licensure on a part-time basis.
20		<u>3.</u>	The board may adopt rules regarding supervision requirements and reporting.
21		SEC	CTION 15. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is

23		43-3	32-21. Consideration of application and notice to applicant. Upon investigation
24	of the a	appli	cation and other evidence submitted, the board shall, not less than thirty days prior
25	to the examination, notify each applicant that the application and evidence submitted for		
26	licensii	ng is	satisfactory and accepted, or unsatisfactory and rejected. If rejected, said the
27	notice	must	t state the reasons for such rejection and explain the right to a hearing under chapter

29		SEC	CTION 16. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-27 of the North Dakota Century Code is

5	psychologis	st, upon proof that the applicant or licensed psychologist:
6	1.	Has been convicted of an offense determined by the board to have a direct bearing
7		upon a person's ability to serve the public as a psychologist, or where the board
8		determines, following conviction of any offense, that a person is not sufficiently
9		rehabilitated under section 12.1-33-02.1.
10	2.	Is using any narcotic or any alcoholic beverage to an extent or in a manner
11		dangerous to himself the psychologist, any other person, or the public, or to an
12		extent that such the use impairs his the psychologist's ability to perform the work of
13		a professional psychologist with safety to the public.
14	3.	Has impersonated another person holding a psychology license or allowed another
15		person to use his the psychologist's license.
16	4.	Has used fraud or deception in applying for a license or in taking an examination
17		provided for in this chapter.
18	5.	Has allowed his the psychologist's name or license issued under this chapter to be
19		used in connection with any person or persons who perform psychological services
20		outside of the area of their training, experience, or competence.
21	6.	Is legally adjudicated insane or mentally incompetent, the record of such the
22		adjudication being conclusive evidence thereof.
23	7.	Has engaged in any form of unethical conduct as defined in "Ethical Standards for
24		Principles of Psychologists and Code of Conduct" as adopted and published by the
25		American psychological association, 1953 1992, and as or revised editions if
26		adopted by the board by rule.
27	8.	Has become grossly negligent in the practice of his the profession.
28	9.	Has willfully or negligently violated any of the provisions of this chapter.
29	<u>10.</u>	Has engaged in an act in violation of rules adopted by the board.
30	The susper	nsion by the board of the license of a psychologist must be for a period not
31	exceeding (	<del>one year.</del> A person <del>who has been refused a license, or</del> whose license has been

1 revoked, under the provisions of this section, may reapply for licensing after two years have 2 elapsed from the date of such denial or revocation. 3 **SECTION 17.** A new section to chapter 43-32 of the North Dakota Century Code is 4 created and enacted as follows: 5 Hearing. All hearings must be conducted pursuant to chapter 28-32. For purposes of 6 the hearing, the licensee or applicant is deemed to be the sole party in interest under section 7 28-32-08 and the provisions of section 28-32-05 apply only to the licensee or applicant. 8 **SECTION 18. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-32-29 of the North Dakota Century Code is 9 amended and reenacted as follows: 10 43-32-29. Appeal from decision of board. An appeal from the final decision of the 11 board in any matter covered by this chapter may be taken to the Burleigh County district court 12 of or the aggrieved party's county in which the decision was made of residence in accordance 13 with the provisions of chapter 28-32. 14 SECTION 19. AMENDMENT. Section 43-32-30 of the North Dakota Century Code is 15 amended and reenacted as follows: 16 **43-32-30.** Persons exempt from the provisions of this chapter. The provisions of 17 this chapter do not apply to the following: 18 Any person in the employ of any federal, state, county or municipal agency, or 1. 19 other political subdivision, or any nonprofit corporation or educational institution 20 presently chartered by this state, insofar as the activities and services of the 21 person are a part of the duties of the person's office or position with such agency, 22 nonprofit corporation or institution. This exemption is not available or effective after 23 July 1, 1970. However, the exemption period may be extended by the board in 24 individual cases where hardship or other good cause is shown by the agency, 25 nonprofit corporation or institution covered, or where the person affected has 26 received from a school or college a master's degree in psychology and the 27 person's activities and services with such agency, nonprofit corporation or 28 institution are performed under the supervision of a licensed psychologist. 29 2. A student, or intern, or resident in psychology pursuing a course of study in 30 psychology at a school or college if such the activities and services constitute a 31 part of the person's supervised course of study if, provided the person does not

1		use the title "psychologist" and the student <del>,</del> <u>or</u> intern <del>, or resident</del> status is clearly
2		stated.
3	<u>2.</u>	A psychology resident performing services under supervision under section
4		<u>43-32-20.1.</u>
5	3.	A nonresident, duly licensed or certified in the state of the person's residence who
6		does not practice psychology in this state for a period of more than thirty days in
7		any calendar year.
8	4.	A lecturer from any school or college who uses an academic or research title when
9		lecturing to institutions or organizations. However, the lecturer may not engage in
10		the practice of psychology unless the lecturer is licensed to practice psychology in
11		this state.
12	5.	Any person who is employed by a public school and whose activities and services
13		are restricted to the practice of psychology in the district or service unit of
14		employment. This exemption applies only when the person has received a
15		master's degree in school psychology from an accredited graduate training
16		program. Standards must be established by mutual consent of the board and the
17		superintendent of public instruction.
18	6.	A person who is certified, licensed, or registered in this state in another health care
19		profession, whose scope of practice is consistent with the accepted standards of
20		that person's profession, and who does not represent to be rendering
21		psychological services.
22	<u>7.</u>	The practice of psychology by an applicant licensed to practice psychology in
23		another jurisdiction, pending disposition of the applicant's application, provided the
24		applicant notifies the board on a form provided by the board of the applicant's
25		intent to practice pending disposition of the application and the applicant adheres
26		to the requirements of this chapter and the rules adopted by the board.
27	<u>8.</u>	A person employed by an agency, nonprofit corporation, or institution who is
28		currently exempt from licensure continues to be exempt as long as the person
29		continues employment in the same position with the agency, nonprofit corporation,
30		or institution that applied for and received the exemption.

- SECTION 20. A new section to chapter 43-32 of the North Dakota Century Code is
   created and enacted as follows:
- 3 Unauthorized practice Civil penalty. In addition to any other penalty, the board may
- 4 levy a civil penalty of no more than one thousand dollars per offense upon any unlicensed
- 5 person who, after a hearing or informal resolution in accordance with chapter 28-32, is found to
- 6 have practiced psychology without a license issued by the board. In addition, the board may
- 7 assess costs and attorney's fees of the investigation and administrative proceeding against the
- 8 <u>unlicensed person found to have been practicing psychology without a currently valid license.</u>
- 9 An appeal from any fine imposed pursuant to this section may be made pursuant to the
- 10 provisions of chapter 28-32.
- 11 SECTION 21. REPEAL. Sections 43-32-18 and 43-32-28 of the North Dakota Century
- 12 Code are repealed.
