1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact eleven new sections to chapter 43-10 of the North Dakota

- 2 Century Code, relating to funeral practice exceptions, limitations on licenses, registration of
- 3 intern embalmers, and licenses to operate a crematorium; to amend and reenact sections
- 4 43-10-01, 43-10-02, 43-10-04, 43-10-05, 43-10-10, 43-10-11, 43-10-12, 43-10-13, 43-10-14,
- 5 43-10-15, 43-10-16, 43-10-19, 43-10-20, 43-10-22, 43-10-23, 43-10-24, and 43-10-25 of the
- 6 North Dakota Century Code, relating to the powers of the state board of funeral service,
- 7 licensure and regulation of funeral service practitioners, and disciplinary action of funeral
- 8 service licensees; and to repeal sections 43-10-17 and 43-10-18 of the North Dakota Century
- 9 Code, relating to state board of funeral service disciplinary hearings; and to provide a penalty.

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-10-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 43-10-01. Definition of board Definitions. Whenever the word "board" is As used in
 this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires, it:
- 15 <u>1.</u> <u>"Board"</u> means the state board of funeral service.
- 16 <u>2.</u> <u>"Crematorium" means a furnace or establishment for the cremation of corpses.</u>
- 17 <u>3.</u> "Embalming" means preparing dead human bodies for final disposition or removal
- 18 by the injection of antiseptic or preservative preparations into the skin, the blood
- 19 vessels, or cavities of the body. The external application of antiseptic solution,
- 20 taking charge of the remains of those dead of any communicable disease,
- 21 preparing dead human bodies for shipment or holding oneself out to do any of the
 22 above acts by advertising or any other means.
- <u>4.</u> "Final disposition" means the entombment, burial in a cemetery, or cremation of a
 <u>dead human body.</u>

1	<u>5.</u>	"Funeral establishment" means any place or premises devoted to or used in the	
2		holding, care, or preparation of a dead human body for final disposition or	
3		transportation or for mourning or funeral ceremony purposes.	
4	<u>6.</u>	"Funeral directing" means the care and disposal of the body of a deceased person;	
5		the preserving, disinfecting, and preparing, by embalming or otherwise, the body of	
6		a deceased person for funeral services, transportation to a point of final	
7		disposition, burial, or cremation; or arranging, directing, or supervising a funeral,	
8		memorial service, or gravesite service.	
9	<u>7.</u>	"Intern embalmer" means a person registered with the board to engage in learning	
10		the practice of embalming under the instruction and personal supervision of a duly	
11		licensed funeral practitioner.	
12	<u>8.</u>	"Funeral practitioner" means a person licensed by the board to practice funeral	
13		directing and embalming.	
14	<u>9.</u>	"Practice of funeral service" means to engage in funeral directing or embalming.	
15	<u>10.</u>	"Preparation of the body" means embalming of the body or such items of care as	
16		washing, disinfecting, shaving, positioning of features, restorative procedures, care	
17		of hair, application of cosmetics, dressing, and casketing.	
18	SEC	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-10-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
19	amended and reenacted as follows:		
20	43-10-02. State board of funeral service - Members - Appointment - Qualifications		
21	- Term of c	office - Oath - Vacancies - Removal. The board consists of the state health officer	
22	and three persons appointed by the governor. Each member appointed by the governor shall		
23	serve for a term of four years and until a successor is appointed and qualified. The terms of		
24	office of the appointed members expire on the thirtieth day of June and must be so arranged		
25	that only one expires in any one year. The appointed members of the board must be persons		
26	practicing embalming in this state and must have practiced for a minimum of three years in		
27	North Dakota. Each member shall qualify by taking the oath of office required of civil officers.		
28	The secretary of state may administer the oath and it must be filed in the office of the secretary		
29	of state. A vacancy on the board must be filled by appointment by the governor for the		
30	unexpired t	erm. The governor may remove any member of the board for good cause.

19	<u>2.</u>	Nothing in this chapter may be construed to prevent embalming by commissioned	
20		medical officers in the armed forces of the United States or under the United	
21		States public health service while on active duty in a respective service.	
22	<u>3.</u>	This chapter does not prevent the transportation of a dead human body in	
23		accordance with other applicable state and federal laws.	
24	<u>4.</u>	This chapter does not prohibit ambulance or other emergency transportation of a	
25		dead human body.	
26	<u>5.</u>	This chapter does not prohibit members of the clergy from performing funeral and	
27		gravesite or memorial services.	
28	<u>6.</u>	This chapter does not prohibit individuals licensed in other states as embalmers or	
29		funeral directors from assisting a North Dakota licensed embalmer during disasters	
30		or special emergencies.	

1	<u>7.</u>	This chapter does not prohibit individuals employed by a funeral establishment	
2		from performing nonprofessional tasks or activities that do not require	
3		independent, professional judgment under the supervision of an individual licensed	
4		to practice funeral service.

Section 43-10-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is 4 amended and reenacted as follows: 5 43-10-13. License - When granted - Fee - Signed by majority of board -6 **Nontransferable - Where displayed.** The board shall grant a license to practice funeral 7 service or preparing dead human bodies for burial or shipment, if the applicant: 8 1. Has the required qualifications; 9 2. Has passed the required examination; and 10 3. Has paid to the treasurer of the board a sum of not more than one hundred dollars, 11 as established by the board. 12 The license must be signed by a majority of the board, be attested by the board's seal, and 13 specify by name the person to whom it is issued. A license is nonassignable and 14 nontransferable and must be displayed by the licensee in a conspicuous place in the licensee's office or place of business. 15 16 **SECTION 10. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-10-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is 17 amended and reenacted as follows: 18 43-10-14. License by reciprocity. A licenseholder in good standing in another state 19 maintaining a system and standard of examination equivalent to this state may be issued a 20 license after passing a written examination on questions concerning laws and rules of this 21 state, upon payment of a fee established by the board, and proof of good moral character. 22 **SECTION 11.** A new section to chapter 43-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is 23 created and enacted as follows: 24 Limitations or qualifications placed on licensee. The board, if the facts support 25 such action, may place reasonable limitations or qualifications on the right to practice funeral 26 service or to operate a funeral establishment or crematory. 27 SECTION 12. AMENDMENT. Section 43-10-15 of the North Dakota Century Code is 28 amended and reenacted as follows:

43-10-15. License - Term - Renewal - Fee for renewal. A license to practice funeral
 service or preparing dead human bodies for burial is valid for one year and may be renewed by
 the board upon the payment to the treasurer of the annual renewal fee before December

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Legislative Assembly 1 thirty-first of each year. The amount of the fee may not exceed one hundred dollars. The 2 board may refuse to renew a license for cause. 3 SECTION 13. A new section to chapter 43-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is 4 created and enacted as follows: 5 Late renewal. A license that has been expired may be renewed at any time within three years after its expiration on filing an application for renewal on a form prescribed by the 6 7 board and payment of the renewal fee in effect on the last regular renewal date. If the license 8 is not renewed within thirty days after its expiration, the licensee shall pay a late fee determined 9 by the board not to exceed one hundred fifty dollars. Renewal under this section is effected on 10 the date on which the application is filed, on the date which the renewal fee is paid, or on the 11 date on which the late fee, if any, is paid, whichever last occurs. A license that is not renewed 12 within three years after its expiration may not be renewed thereafter. 13 **SECTION 14.** A new section to chapter 43-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is 14 created and enacted as follows: Issuance of duplicate licenses. Upon receipt of satisfactory evidence that a license 15 16 or certificate has been lost, mutilated, or destroyed, the board may issue a duplicate license or 17 certificate upon such terms and conditions as the board prescribes, and upon payment of a fee 18 of ten dollars. 19 SECTION 15. A new section to chapter 43-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is 20 created and enacted as follows: 21 **Change of name.** Any licensee desiring to change the name appearing on the 22 licensee's license may do so by applying to the board and paying a fee of ten dollars. 23 **SECTION 16.** A new section to chapter 43-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is 24 created and enacted as follows: 25 Intern embalmer - Application - Qualifications. The board shall issue a certificate of 26 registration as an intern embalmer to each applicant who files an application upon a form and in 27 a manner the board prescribes, accompanied by a fee not to exceed fifty dollars, and who 28 furnished sufficient evidence to the board that the applicant: 29 Is at least 18 years of age; 1. <u>2.</u> 30 Is of good moral character;

1 SECTION 20. AMENDMENT. Section 43-10-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is 2 amended and reenacted as follows: 3 43-10-19. Hearing - Revocation Appeals. A licensed funeral service practitioner 4 against whom charges have been made under section 43-10-16 may appear before the board 5 at the time and place of the hearing and refute the charges made against that person. A board 6 member may administer oaths to witnesses. If after considering the facts and circumstances, 7 the board has sufficient reason to believe that the licensee is guilty of the charges made 8 against the licensee, it may revoke, suspend, or refuse to issue a license. Hearings regarding 9 disciplinary action or denial of a license must be held under chapter 28-32. An appeal from the 10 board's final decision may be taken in accordance with the provisions of section 28-32-15. 11 SECTION 21. A new section to chapter 43-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is 12 created and enacted as follows: 13 **Restoration of license after revocation.** One year from the date of revocation, the 14 former licensee may make application for initial licensure. In order to receive a new license, the 15 applicant must satisfy the current requirements for licensure. SECTION 22. AMENDMENT. Section 43-10-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is 16 17 amended and reenacted as follows: 18 **43-10-20.** Penalty. A person practicing or representing oneself as practicing funeral 19 service, or preparing the dead for burial or shipment in violation of this chapter, is guilty of a 20 class B misdemeanor. In addition to the criminal penalty provided, the civil remedy of injunction 21 is available to restrain and enjoin violations of any provision of this chapter without proof of 22 actual damages sustained by any person and without the board being required to file an 23 undertaking. 24 SECTION 23. AMENDMENT. Section 43-10-22 of the North Dakota Century Code is 25 amended and reenacted as follows: 26 43-10-22. Licensure of funeral establishments. A person may not operate or 27 manage a funeral establishment without a funeral establishment license issued by the board for 28 each place of business. A Except for on tribal land, a funeral establishment may not be located 29 on tax-exempt property. A person desiring to operate a funeral establishment shall submit an 30 application for an annual license for each funeral establishment to the secretary or executive 31 secretary of the board accompanied by a license fee for each establishment of not more than

1 one hundred dollars, as established by the board. A person operating or managing a funeral 2 establishment shall annually, on or before December first, submit an application for renewal of 3 a license with a renewal fee of not more than one hundred dollars, as established by the board. 4 A license is valid until the following January first, unless sooner revoked. An application must 5 show that the funeral establishment has complied with all rules adopted by the board in regard 6 to safety and sanitation and will be under the supervision of a North Dakota an individual 7 licensed embalmer and to practice funeral director service. An applicant who has met these 8 standards must be issued a license. In case of the death of an owner of a funeral 9 establishment who leaves an established business as part or all of an estate, the board may 10 issue a special renewable temporary license to the personal representative of the deceased 11 person for the duration of the administration of the estate, but which may not exceed two years. 12 The fee for the temporary license is the same as required for regular licenses. 13 SECTION 24. A new section to chapter 43-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is 14 created and enacted as follows: 15 **Display of license.** The funeral establishment license issued by the board to a funeral

establishment must be conspicuously displayed at the funeral establishment for which the
license was issued.

18 SECTION 25. AMENDMENT. Section 43-10-23 of the 1995 Supplement to the North
19 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

20 43-10-23. Inspections - Hearings - Revocations - Appeal. The funeral 21 establishment or that part of a funeral establishment in which is conducted or intended to be 22 conducted any funeral service business, must be open at all times for inspection by the board 23 or the state department of health. The board or agents employed by it and the state 24 department of health may make such inspections as are necessary of facilities and equipment 25 of funeral establishments to ensure compliance with safety and sanitary rules adopted by the 26 board or any other rules or federal regulations pertaining to funeral service whenever either 27 deems the inspection advisable. If, upon inspection, it is found that such rules are not complied 28 with, the board shall notify the holder of the funeral establishment license and hold hearings in 29 the manner provided in sections 43 10 17, 43 10 18, and 43 10 19 a hearing. The board may 30 subpoena witnesses, administer oaths, and take testimony. All proceedings under this section must be conducted in accordance with chapter 28-32. The board may, after a hearing, revoke, 31

suspend, or refuse to issue or renew a license upon good cause. A person aggrieved by the
 action of the board may appeal to the district court of the county in which the person resides or
 the district court of Burleigh County in accordance with chapter 28-32.

SECTION 26. AMENDMENT. Section 43-10-24 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

43-10-24. Penalty. Any person <u>willfully</u> violating any of the provisions of sections
43-10-21 through 43-10-23, except rules and regulations promulgated under section 43-10-22,
is guilty of a class B misdemeanor. Any person who <u>willfully</u> violates a rule or regulation
promulgated under section 43-10-22 is guilty of an infraction.

SECTION 27. AMENDMENT. Section 43-10-25 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

12 **43-10-25.** Licensure of crematoriums. After July 1, 1989, a A person may not 13 operate a crematorium without a license issued by the board. A person desiring to operate a 14 crematorium shall submit an application for an annual license to the board. The license fee may not exceed one hundred dollars and must be the same as a funeral establishment license. 15 16 SECTION 28. A new section to chapter 43-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is 17 created and enacted as follows: 18 Grounds for disciplinary action. The board may revoke, suspend, place on 19 probation, or refuse to issue a license to operate a crematorium upon proof at a hearing that 20 the applicant or licensee:

21 <u>1. Is unfit to operate a crematorium.</u>

22 <u>2.</u> <u>Has violated this chapter or rules adopted by the board.</u>

23 SECTION 29. REPEAL. Sections 43-10-17 and 43-10-18 of the North Dakota Century
24 Code are repealed.
