- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 43-11-01, 43-11-02, 43-11-08, 43-11-11,
- 2 43-11-12, 43-11-17, 43-11-19, 43-11-20.1, 43-11-21, 43-11-23, 43-11-24, 43-11-26, 43-11-27,
- 3 43-11-28, 43-11-32, 43-11-33, 43-11-34, and 43-11-35 of the North Dakota Century Code,

4 relating to licensure and regulation of cosmetologists and cosmetology salons.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-01 of the 1995 Supplement to the North
7 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

43-11-01. Definitions. In this chapter, unless the context or subject matter thereofotherwise requires:

10 1. "Board" means the state board of cosmetology.

11 2. "Cosmetology" means any one or combination of practices generally and usually 12 heretofore and hereafter performed by and known as the occupation of beauty 13 culturists or cosmeticians or cosmetologists or hairdressers, or of any other person 14 holding him or herself out as practicing cosmetology by whatever designation and 15 within the meaning of this chapter and in and upon whatever place or premises; 16 and in particular cosmetology is defined and includes, but otherwise is not limited 17 thereby, the following or any one or a combination of practices: arranging, 18 dressing, curling, waving, cleansing, cutting, singeing, bleaching, coloring, or 19 similar work, upon the hair of any person by any means or with hands or 20 mechanical or electrical apparatus or appliances, or by the use of cosmetic 21 preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions, creams, or otherwise, massaging, 22 cleansing, stimulating, manipulating, exercising, beautifying or similar work on the 23 scalp, face, neck, arms, hands, bust or upper part of the body, or manicuring the 24 nails of any person.

1	3.	"Cosmetology salon" includes that part of any building wherein the occupation of a		
2		cosmetologist is practiced.		
3	4.	4. "Demonstrator" means any person who possesses the qualifications of a		
4		cosmetologist and who is granted permission to promote a product or technique in		
5		this state for a limited time in accordance with rules adopted by the board.		
6	5.	"Esthetician" means a person who is licensed by the board to engage in the		
7		practice of skin care. An esthetician does not include a professional make-up artist		
8		trained in facial make-up application by a cosmetics company.		
9	6. <u>5.</u>	"Homebound" means any person who is ill, disabled, or otherwise unable to travel		
10		to a salon.		
11	7. <u>6.</u>	"Instructor" means any person of the age of eighteen years or more, who is a		
12		licensed cosmetologist, who teaches cosmetology or any practices taught in a duly		
13		registered school of cosmetology, and who has met the requirements of section		
14		43-11-27 and has applied for and received an instructor's license.		
15	8. <u>7.</u>	"Manager-operator" means any person who has met the requirements of section		
16		43-11-26 and has applied for and received a managing cosmetologist license.		
17	9. <u>8.</u>	"Manicuring" means the cleansing, cutting, shaping, beautifying, or massaging of		
18		the hands, feet, or nails of any person.		
19	10. <u>9.</u>	"Manicurist" means a person who is licensed by the board to engage in the		
20		practice of manicuring.		
21	11. <u>10.</u>	"Operator" means a person, not a student, who is licensed under the provisions of		
22		this chapter to engage in and follow any of the practices of a hairdresser or		
23		cosmetologist.		
24	12. <u>11.</u>	"School of cosmetology" means an establishment operated for the purpose of		
25		teaching cosmetology.		
26	13. <u>12.</u>	"Skin care" means the use of cosmetic preparations, antiseptics, tonics, lotions,		
27		creams, or otherwise, massaging, cleansing, stimulating, manipulating, beautifying,		
28		or similar work on the scalp, face, neck, arms, hands, bust, or upper part of the		
29		body of any person.		
30	14. <u>13.</u>	"Student" means any person who is engaged in the learning or acquiring of any or		
31		all the practices of cosmetology and while so learning, performs or assists in any of		

1		the practices of cosmetology in any school registered or licensed and under the		
2		immediate supervision of an instructor licensed as such under this chapter.		
3	15. <u>14.</u>	"Student instructor" means a cosmetologist who is receiving instruction in teacher's		
4		training in a duly registered school of cosmetology.		
5	16. <u>15.</u>	"Tuition" means the total cost of a person's cosmetology studies, and does not		
6		include books or demonstration kits.		
7	SEC	CTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-02 of the 1995 Supplement to the North		
8	Dakota Cer	ntury Code is amended and reenacted as follows:		
9	43-1	11-02. Exemptions from provisions of chapter. This chapter does not apply to:		
10	1.	Services in case of emergency.		
11	2.	Services provided by persons practicing cosmetology upon members of their		
12		immediate families.		
13	3.	Services by persons authorized under the laws of this state to practice medicine,		
14		surgery, dentistry, podiatry, osteopathy, or chiropractic a person licensed by the		
15		state and working within the standards and ethics of that person's profession, if		
16		that person does not represent to the public that the person is a cosmetologist or		
17		manicurist.		
18	4.	Services by nurses, undertakers, and morticians lawfully engaged in the		
19		performance of the usual and ordinary duties of their vocation; or by a licensed		
20		cosmetologist engaged in manicuring the nails of any person in a licensed		
21		barbershop.		
22	5.	Educational activities conducted in connection with any regularly scheduled		
23		meeting or any educational activities of any bona fide association of licensed		
24		cosmetologists, from which the general public is excluded. For purposes of this		
25		subsection a "bona fide association of cosmetologists" means any organization		
26		whose constitution, bylaws, or membership rules establish within said organization		
27		a class of membership consisting of licensed cosmetologists.		
28	6.	Services provided by retailers or their sales personnel trained in the demonstration		
29		of cosmetics application if the cosmetics are applied only with disposable		
30		applicators that are discarded after each customer demonstration. The board may		

- adopt rules to ensure sanitary conditions for services provided under this
 exemption.
- Services provided in a licensed hospital or a nursing home by a person practicing
 cosmetology on a volunteer basis without compensation or by a nurse's assistant.
 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 6 amended and reenacted as follows:

43-11-08. Meetings of the board. The board shall meet <u>at least</u> twice each year on
the third Tuesday in January and July <u>at times determined by the board</u>. The board may meet
at such other times and places as is necessary to conduct the official business of the board
shall publish annually the time and place of its regularly scheduled meetings. <u>A majority of the</u>
members constitutes a quorum.

SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-11 of the 1995 Supplement to the North
Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

43-11-11. Sanitary rules - Practice outside salon. The board with the approval of the state department of health shall adopt sanitary rules necessary to prevent the creating and spreading of infectious and contagious diseases. A cosmetology salon must be at a fixed location and must be separate from all other businesses and establishments and may not be used for living or sleeping quarters. An operator may practice outside of the establishment under the direction and control of an owner or manager thereof under rules adopted by the board.

21 **SECTION 5. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-11-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is 22 amended and reenacted as follows:

43-11-12. Persons to aid of board. The board may employ or receive services from
any person a secretary, support staff, and other persons knowledgeable in cosmetology for
conducting examinations, inspections, and investigations of persons regulated by this chapter.
Any person employed by the board is entitled to receive fifty dollars for each day employed in
the actual discharge of official duties, and expenses in the amounts payable under sections
44-08-04 and 54-06-09.

SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

19	an amount as may be fixed by the board under section 43-11-28.

27	practical de	monstrations and written or oral test	s in reference to the practices for which a

29	necessary for the proper and efficient performance of a practice. The board may require the			
30	practical portion of the examination be conducted by schools of cosmetology as part of			

1	graduation	requirements. The examination may not be confined to any specific system or	
2	method and must be consistent with the practical and theoretical requirements of cosmetology.		
3	SECTION 11. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-24 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
4	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:	
5	43- 1	1-24. Operator's license - When issued - Failure to pass examination -	
6	Reexamina	tion - Retraining. An operator's license must be issued to any person who has:	
7	1.	Complied with section 43-11-21; and	
8	2.	Passed to the satisfaction of the board, the examination of applicants for a license	
9		to practice under this chapter.	
10	If the applic	ant fails to pass the examination, the examination fee may not be returned. Within	
11	one year after failing to pass an examination, the applicant may be examined again with the		
12	payment of a reexamination fee and kit rental fee as set forth in section 43-11-28. Anyone A		
13	person who fails to pass the reexamination must complete an additional one hundred sixty		
14	hours of training at a school of cosmetology prior to before reapplying for examination.		
15	SEC	CTION 12. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-26 of the 1995 Supplement to the North	
16	Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:		
17	43-11-26. Manager-operator - License - Qualifications. A person may obtain a		
18	manager-op	perator's license upon:

- 1 No person may be licensed as an instructor of cosmetology unless the person 1. 2 furnishes the board the examination fee set forth in section 43-11-28 and evidence 3 of having attained the age of eighteen years and having a general education 4 equivalent to the completion of four years in high school. An applicant: 5 Shall have at least nine hundred sixty hours instructor's training in a. 6 cosmetology in a school of cosmetology. In no event may more than two 7 thousand sixty hours instructor's training be required for admission to 8 examination. Under this subdivision the practical portion of the examination 9 may be waived if the written examination is supplemented with video tapes of 10 the applicant's teaching procedures; 11 b. Shall have at least one year's experience as an active practicing 12 cosmetologist, supplemented by not less than four hundred eighty hours 13 instructor's training in cosmetology in a school of cosmetology. In no event 14 may more than six hundred hours instructor's training be requisite for 15 admission for examination under this subdivision; or 16 Shall possess a current North Dakota license as a cosmetologist and shall C. 17 have been actively engaged in the practice of cosmetology for at least three 18 years prior to application for an instructor's license supplemented by not less 19 than one hundred sixty hours instructor's training in cosmetology in a school 20 of cosmetology. In no event may more than six hundred hours instructor's 21 training be requisite for admission for examination under this subdivision. No 22 instructor or student instructor may be permitted to practice cosmetology on a 23 patron other than that part of practical work which pertains directly to the 24 teaching of practical operations to students. 25 2. Student instructors in cosmetology must be registered upon enrollment in a school 26 of cosmetology and upon certification by the school to the board of the name, age, 27 and qualifications of the student instructor which must be recorded in a register 28 kept for that purpose. A student instructor shall, at the time of enrollment, possess 29 a general education equivalent to the completion of four years in high school and 30 hold a license as a cosmetologist. Upon completion of the course prescribed for
 - student instructors, the student instructor shall make application on a form

1		provided by the board and pay a fee as provided in section 43-11-28. The board			
2		shall thereupon cause the applicant to be examined for an instructor's license. The			
3		examination must be given by a special examining committee comprised of the			
4		board, assisted by one person designated by the board possessing the minimum			
5		qualifications entitling the person to instruct in an institution of higher learning and			
6		who shall examine the applicant in teaching procedures only. Upon successfully			
7		passing the examination the board shall issue an instructor's license to the			
8		applicant.

Fees are not prorated or returnable. The board may charge a ten dollar penalty for
 license renewal applications received after December thirty-first. The board may
 reduce a renewal fee from the maximum amount only if it the board applies an
 equal percentage of reduction to all renewal fees. The board shall sponsor an
 educational program for licenseholders to carry out the purposes of protecting the
 public health and safety and maintaining capable and skilled operators,
 manager-operators, and instructors. The board is directed to shall use such

portion of the renewal fees as the board may determine for the purpose of
 providing the educational program.

3 SECTION 15. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-32 of the North Dakota Century Code is
4 amended and reenacted as follows:

5 43-11-32. Hearing may be held by any member Hearings. Any investigation, 6 inquiry, or hearing, which the board may hold or undertake under the provisions of this chapter, 7 may be held or undertaken by, or before, any member or members of the board, and the finding 8 or order of such member or members must be deemed to be the finding or order of the board 9 when approved and confirmed by it. All hearings must be conducted pursuant to chapter 10 28-32. For purposes of the hearing, the licensee or applicant is deemed to be the sole party in 11 interest under section 28-32-08 and the provisions of section 28-32-05 apply only to the 12 licensee. 13 **SECTION 16. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-11-33 of the North Dakota Century Code is 14 amended and reenacted as follows: 15 43-11-33. Hearings - Board may subpoena witnesses - Fees - How paid. The 16 board may require the attendance of witnesses and the production of books, records, and 17 papers at any hearing or with reference to any matter which it has authority to investigate, and 18 for that purpose may require the secretary to issue a subpoena for any witness or a subpoena 19 duces tecum to compel the production of any books, records, or papers. The subpoena must 20 be directed to the sheriff of the county where the witness resides or is found, and must be 21 served and returned in the same manner as a subpoena in a criminal case. The fees and 22 mileage of the sheriff and witnesses must be the same as may be allowed in the court in

23 criminal cases. Fees and mileage must be paid in the same manner as expenses of the board.

SECTION 17. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-34 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

43-11-34. Appeal from actions of the board. An appeal may be taken from an action
of the board under this chapter in refusing to grant, or in suspending or revoking a license, to
the district court of the county of residence of the person who has been refused a license or
whose license has been suspended or revoked. <u>The appeal must be taken in accordance with</u>
the provisions of chapter 28-32.

- SECTION 18. AMENDMENT. Section 43-11-35 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 43-11-35. Penalty. Any person who, without a license, willfully practices any of the
 occupations, maintains a school, or acts in any capacity, wherein a license is required by this
- 5 chapter, is guilty of a class B misdemeanor.
