1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to chapter 43-41 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to a civil penalty for practicing social work without a license; to amend

3 and reenact subdivision e of subsection 2 of section 26.1-36-09, and sections 43-41-01,

4 43-41-04, 43-41-05, 43-41-10, and 43-41-12 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to

5 group health policy and health service contract mental disorder coverage and social work

6 licensures; to repeal sections 43-41-06 and 43-41-12.1 of the North Dakota Century Code; and

7 to provide a penalty.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

9 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subdivision e of subsection 2 of section 26.1-36-09 of the
10 North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

11	e.	(1)	In the case of benefits provided for outpatient treatment, the benefits
12			must be provided for a minimum of thirty hours for services covered
13			under this section in any calendar year if the treatment services are
14			provided within the scope of licensure by a nurse who holds advanced
15			licensure with a scope of practice within mental health or if the
16			diagnosis, evaluation, and treatment services are provided within the
17			scope of licensure by a licensed physician, a licensed psychologist who
18			is eligible for listing on the national register of health service providers
19			in psychology, or a licensed certified independent clinical social worker
20			who:
21			(a) Possesses a master's or doctorate degree in social work from an

1 "Licensed social worker" means an individual who has a baccalaureate degree in 4. 2 social work from a college or university accredited by the council on social work 3 education and who has fulfilled the requirements for licensure. 4 "Private practice of social work" means the independent practice of social work by 4. 5 a qualified individual who is self employed on a full-time or part-time basis and is 6 responsible for that independent practice. Consultation services provided to an 7 organization or an agency are not considered to be the private practice of social 8 work. 9 5. Social work practice consists of the professional application of social work values, 10 principles, and techniques in: helping people obtain tangible services; counseling; 11 psychotherapy with individuals, families, and groups; helping communities or 12 groups to improve social and health services; providing social casework; directly 13 supervising programs providing social work services; social work education; social 14 work research; or any combination of these. The practice of social work requires 15 knowledge of human development and behavior, of social, economic, and cultural 16 institutions, and of the interaction of all of these factors. 17 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-41-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is 18 amended and reenacted as follows: 19 43-41-04. Licenses. 20 Except as otherwise provided in this chapter, no person may engage in social work 1. 21 practice in this state unless that person is a licensed social worker or a licensed 22 certified social worker. 23 2. The board shall issue a license as a licensed social worker to an applicant who: 24 Has a baccalaureate degree in a social work or social welfare program a. 25 approved by the board from a college or university accredited by the council 26 on social work education. 27 b. Has passed an examination approved by the board for this purpose. 28 Has satisfied the board that the applicant agrees to adhere to the code of c. 29 social work ethics adopted by the board. 30 3. The board shall issue a license as a licensed certified social worker to an applicant 31 who:

1		a.	Has a doctorate or master's degree from a school of social work accredited by
2			the council on social work education.
3		b.	Has passed an examination approved by the board for this purpose.
4		C.	Has satisfied the board that the applicant agrees to adhere to the code of
5			social work ethics adopted by the board.
6	<u>4.</u>	<u>The</u>	board shall issue a license as a licensed independent clinical social worker to
7		<u>an a</u>	applicant who:
8		<u>a.</u>	Has a doctorate or master's degree from a school of social work accredited by
9			the council on social work education.
10		<u>b.</u>	Has passed an examination approved by the board for this purpose.
11		<u>C.</u>	Has satisfied the board that the applicant has successfully completed four
12			years of full-time, post-master's clinical social work experience under the
13			supervision of a licensed certified social worker who has two years of
14			experience, a licensed clinical psychologist, or a licensed psychiatrist. This
15			requirement must be waived if the applicant was approved by the board for
16			third-party reimbursement or certified for private practice before August 1,
17			<u>1997.</u>

19			social work ethics adopted by the board.

3	SEC	TION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 43-41-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is
4	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:
5	43-4	1-10. Grounds for disciplinary proceedings. The board may deny, refuse to
6	renew, susp	pend, revoke, or place on probationary status any license issued under this chapter
7	on proof at a	a hearing that the applicant or licensed person:
8	1.	Has been convicted of an offense determined by the board to have a direct bearing
9		upon that individual's ability to practice social work and is not sufficiently
10		rehabilitated as determined by the board in accordance with section 12.1-33-02.1.
11	2.	Is addicted to the habitual use of alcoholic beverages, narcotics, or stimulants to
12		such an extent as to incapacitate that individual from the practice of social work.
13	3.	Has been grossly negligent in the practice of social work.
14	4.	Has violated one or more of the rules and regulations of the board.
15	5.	Has violated the code of social work ethics adopted by the board.
16	6.	In order to pursue the investigation, the board may subpoena and examine
17		witnesses and records, including client records, and copy, photograph, or take
18		samples. The board may require a licensed social worker to give statements under
19		oath and to submit to a physical or mental examination, or both, by a physician or
20		physicians and other qualified evaluation professionals selected by the board if it
21		appears to be in the best interests of the public that an evaluation be secured. A
22		written request from the board constitutes authorization to release information. All
23		Absent a client release on file allowing the release of information, all client records
24		released to the board are confidential and not subject to section 44-04-18 and
25		section 6 of article XI of the Constitution of North Dakota.
26	7.	Unless there is a client release on file allowing the release of information at the
27		public hearing, all data and information, including client and juvenile records ,
28		acquired by the board in its investigation are introduced or client and juvenile
29		testimony of a personal nature taken at a public hearing is confidential and closed
30		to the public. All board meetings where client and juvenile testimony or records are
31		taken or revised reviewed are confidential and closed to the public. If no client or

1		juvenile testimony or records are taken or reviewed, the remainder of the meeting				
2		is an open meeting unless a specific exemption is otherwise applicable.				
3	SEC	CTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 43-41-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
4	amended a	nd reenacted as follows:				
5	43-4	11-12. Renewal of licenses.				
6	1.	All licenses are effective when issued by the board.				
7	2.	All licenses of licensed social workers and licensed certified social workers expire				
8		on December 31, 1985, and on December thirty-first every two years thereafter.				
9	3.	A license may be renewed by payment of the renewal fee set by the board,				
10		provided the applicant's license is not currently revoked or suspended.				
11	4.	If the application for renewal is not received within six months of on or before the				
12		expiration date, the board shall require reexamination.				
13	5.	At the time of renewal the board shall require each applicant to present satisfactory				
14		evidence that the applicant has completed the continuing education requirements				
15		specified by the board.				
16	SEC	CTION 7. A new section to chapter 43-41 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
17	7 created and enacted as follows:					
18	<u>Una</u>	uthorized practice - Civil penalty. In addition to any other penalty, the board may				
19	<u>levy a civil p</u>	penalty of not more than one thousand dollars per offense upon any unlicensed				
20	person who	, after a hearing or informal resolution in accordance with chapter 28-32, is found to				
21	have practiced social work without a license issued by the board. In addition, the board may					
22	assess cost	is and attorney's fees of the investigation and administrative proceeding against the				
23	unlicensed	person found to have been practicing social work without a currently valid license.				
24	<u>An appeal f</u>	rom any fine imposed pursuant to this section may be made pursuant to				
25	chapter 28-	<u>32.</u>				
26	SEC	CTION 8. REPEAL. Sections 43-41-06 and 43-41-12.1 of the North Dakota Century				
27	Code are re	pealed.
