- 1 A BILL for an Act relating to security measures in certain retail establishments; to provide a
- 2 penalty; and to provide for an effective date.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

4 SECTION 1. Convenience store security requirements - Exceptions - Penalty.

- Each retail establishment that is primarily engaged in the retail sale of groceries, or
 of groceries and gasoline, and which is open for business at any time between the
 hours of midnight and 5:00 a.m. must:
 - a. Be equipped with a bullet-resistant glass enclosure or security camera system that is recording and retrieving an image of a quality that would be useful in assisting law enforcement officials in the identification and apprehension of a criminal offender;
 - Be equipped with a drop safe or cash management device for restricted access to cash receipts;
 - c. Be equipped with lighting for parking areas and entrances at an intensity to provide clear visibility under normal conditions;
 - d. Post a conspicuous notice at the entrance which states that the cash register contains limited funds;
 - e. Install height markers at the entrance of the convenience business which accurately display height measures;
 - f. Locate every window sign and display in a manner that does not obstruct the view from outside the building to the cash register and sales transaction area;
 - g. Establish a cash management policy that limits the cash on hand at all times after midnight and before 5:00 a.m.; and

- h. Provide training to each employee who works between the hours of midnight and 5:00 a.m. regarding security measures that may be taken in an emergency situation, including a robbery or theft, to maintain the safety of the employee and any customer present during the emergency situation.
 - 2. This section does not include a business that is solely or primarily a restaurant; a business that always has at least two employees on the premises after midnight and before 5:00 a.m.; a business in which the owner or a member of the owner's family works between midnight and 5:00 a.m.; or a business that is owned by a person who owns a business at no other location.
 - 3. Any person who violates this section is guilty of an infraction.
- **SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Act becomes effective on August 1, 1999.
