- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 15-39.1 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the composition and administrative authority of the teachers' fund for
- 3 retirement board; to amend and reenact section 15-39.1-07 and subsection 1 of section
- 4 54-07-01.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to vacancies on and appointments to
- 5 the teachers' fund for retirement board; and to repeal section 15-39.1-05 of the North Dakota
- 6 Century Code, relating to management of the teachers' fund for retirement.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. Two new sections to chapter 15-39.1 of the North Dakota Century Code are created and enacted as follows:

Board composition - Terms - Voting.

- The authority to set policy for the fund rests in a board of trustees composed as follows:
 - a. The governor shall appoint from a list of three nominees submitted to the governor by the North Dakota education association two board members who are actively employed in full-time positions not classified as school administrators. A board member appointed under this subdivision who terminates employment may not continue to serve as a member of the board.
 - b. The governor shall appoint from a list of three nominees submitted to the governor by the North Dakota council of school administrators one board member who is actively employed as a full-time school administrator. A board member appointed under this subdivision who terminates employment may not continue to serve as a member of the board.

4		<u>d.</u>	The state treasurer and the superintendent of public instruction.		
5	<u>2.</u>	All current appointees of the board shall serve the remainder of their term as			
6		men	nbers of the board until their terms expire and their successors are appointed.		
7		<u>The</u>	first newly appointed board member under subdivision a of subsection 1 must		
8		be a	ppointed to serve an initial term of four years. The first newly appointed board		
9		men	nber under subdivision c of subsection 1 must be elected to serve an initial		
10		term	of five years. Newly appointed board members shall serve a term of five		
11		year	s. Each newly appointed term begins on July first.		
12	<u>3.</u>	Eacl	h board member is entitled to one vote, and four members constitute a		
13		quor	rum. Four votes are required for resolution or action by the board.		
14	Boa	pard authority - Continuing appropriation. The board:			
15	<u>1.</u>	<u>Has</u>	the powers and privileges of a corporation, including the right to sue and be		
16		sued	d in its own name. The venue of all actions to which the board is a party must

18	<u>2.</u>	Shall establish investment policy for the trust fund under section 21-10-02.1. The			
19		inve	stment policy must include:		
20		<u>a.</u>	Acceptable rates of return, liquidity, and levels of risk; and		
21		<u>b.</u>	Long-range asset allocation targets.		
22	<u>3.</u>	Sha	Il arrange for actuarial and medical consultants. The board shall cause a		
23		qualified, competent actuary to be retained on a consulting basis. The actuary			
24		shall:			
25		<u>a.</u>	Make a valuation of the liabilities and reserves of the fund and a		
26			determination of the contributions required by the fund to discharge its		
27			liabilities and pay administrative costs;		
28		<u>b.</u>	Recommend to the board rates of employer and employee contributions		
29			required, based upon the entry age normal cost or other accepted actuarial		
30			method, to maintain the fund on an actuarial reserve basis;		

1		<u>C.</u>	Once every five years make a general investigation of the actuarial			
2			experience under the fund including mortality, retirement, employment			
3			turnover, and other items required by the board;			
4		<u>d.</u>	Recommend actuarial tables for use in valuations and in calculating actuarial			
5			equivalent values based on the investigation provided for in subdivision c; and			
6		<u>e.</u>	Perform other duties assigned by the board.			
7	<u>4.</u>	<u>May</u>	y pay benefits and consultant fees as necessary which are hereby appropriated

9	<u>5.</u>	Shall submit to the legislative council's employee benefits programs committee an				
10		nec	essary or desirable changes in statutes relating to the administration of the			
11		<u>func</u>	<u>d.</u>			
12	<u>6.</u>	<u>Sha</u>	all determine appropriate levels of service to be provided to members, including			
13		<u>ben</u>	efits counseling and preretirement programs.

15		<u>adn</u>	ninistrative board of the retirement and investment office, the levels of services,			
16		goa	lls, and objectives expected to be provided through the retirement and

18	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15-39.1-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is					
19	9 amended and reenacted as follows:					
20	15-39.1-07. Vacancies - Rulemaking power. Vacancies which may that occur among					
21	the appointed elected members of the board must be filled by the governor election as					
22	determined by the board and the appointee newly elected member shall complete the term for					
23	which the original member was selected elected. The board may adopt such rules as may be					
24	necessary to fulfill the responsibilities of the board.					
25	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 54-07-01.2 of the 1995
