- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 50-06 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to fetal alcohol syndrome; to amend and reenact section 15-11-35 and
- 3 subsection 2 of section 50-06-05.3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to fetal alcohol
- 4 syndrome; and to provide an appropriation.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15-11-35 of the 1995 Supplement to the North
  Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
  - 15-11-35. Fetal alcohol syndrome center established. There is established in the department of neuroscience at the university of North Dakota school of medicine a fetal alcohol syndrome center. The center shall act as the lead agency in the state for the purpose of coordinating fetal alcohol syndrome and fetal alcohol effect related activities. The state board of higher education shall appoint a person from the department of neuroscience as director of the fetal alcohol syndrome program and that person shall prepare an annual report on the status of fetal alcohol syndrome in North Dakota. The center shall develop prevention activities in groups that are at high risk for fetal alcohol syndrome. The center may enlist the aid of other agencies, persons, or organizations in its activities. The responsibilities of the program include:
    - To develop <u>Developing</u> incidence and prevalence data on fetal alcohol syndrome in this state.
    - 2. To conduct Conducting research on prevention and management of fetal alcohol syndrome and maternal alcohol ingestion during pregnancy.
    - 3. To develop Developing a center for the evaluation of children with fetal alcohol syndrome from this state in cooperation with the child evaluation and treatment program at the medical center rehabilitation hospital at the university of North Dakota and to operate operating followup clinics as funding allows.

- 4. To provide Providing consultation and training across the state on fetal alcohol
   syndrome.
  - 5. To conduct Conducting other activities as may be directed by a state fetal alcohol syndrome task force.
  - 6. Meeting at least twice each year with the fetal alcohol syndrome task force and representatives of each regional human service center.

The center shall coordinate a study of the prevalence of fetal alcohol syndrome in school-age children in this state. The study must review the prevalence of fetal alcohol syndrome in both rural and urban North Dakota communities, including North Dakota Indian reservations.

**SECTION 2. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 2 of section 50-06-05.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

Regional human service centers shall provide human services to all eligible individuals and families to help them achieve or maintain social, emotional, and economic self-sufficiency; prevent, reduce, or eliminate dependency; prevent or remedy the neglect, abuse, or exploitation of children and of adults unable to protect their own interests; aid in the preservation, rehabilitation, and reuniting of families; prevent or reduce inappropriate institutional care by providing for care while institutionalized or providing for community-based or other forms of less restrictive care; secure referral or admission for institutional care; provide outpatient diagnostic and treatment services; provide an assessment of fetal alcohol syndrome-related services including current and needed services, the best model of service delivery, the anticipated cost of services, and the anticipated cost of departmental or contracted case management services; provide information concerning quardianship to people interested in becoming or who are quardians: and provide rehabilitation services for patients suffering from mental or emotional disorders, mental retardation, fetal alcohol syndrome, and other psychiatric conditions, particularly for those patients who have received prior treatment in an inpatient facility. Regional human service centers shall deliver services in the manner prescribed by the department.

**SECTION 3.** A new section to chapter 50-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

9	<u>5.</u>	Conduct, in coordination with the department, an annual evaluation of	coordination with the department, an annual evaluation of the services	
10		provided to those persons diagnosed with fetal alcohol syndrome, including a		
11		determination of the services each person and family is receiving and any		
12		additional needed services, a discussion of the best service model, and the		
13		anticipated costs of providing those services;		
14	<u>6.</u>	Coordinate efforts with local health care providers and the fetal alcohol syndrome		
15		center to provide diagnostic services for children who are identified b	y the fetal	
16		alcohol screening efforts in the region; and		
17	<u>7.</u>	Meet at least twice each year with the fetal alcohol syndrome center to coordinate		
18		activities.		
19	SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the			
20	funds as may be necessary, are hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the children's			
21	services coordinating committee operating fund in the state treasury, not otherwise			
22	appropriated, to the university of North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences for the			
23	purpose of defraying the expenses of the fetal alcohol syndrome center, for the biennium			
24	beginning July 1, 1997, and ending June 30, 1999, as follows:
